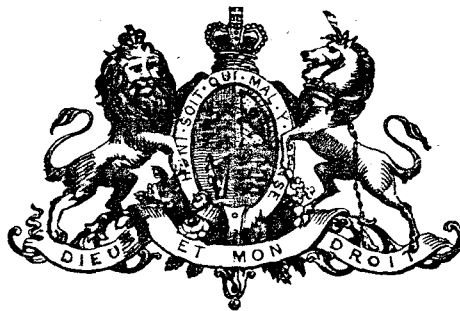

### LICENCES FOR IMPORTATION OF COFFEE INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

THE Board of Trade has agreed to license to the extent of 200 tons the importation of coffee, which was on February 23rd ready for curing and has been cured on the plantation, in addition to that which was in transit on that date. This represents 50% of the estimated amount of this class of coffee.

Growers are requested to inform the Secretariat the amount of coffee of this class awaiting export and the name of the London firm to whom the import licence should be granted. Those growers who have already notified their stocks to the Secretary of the Coffee Planters' Union need not furnish a further return.

### MOMBASA WATER SUPPLY.

#### SCALE OF CHARGES.

HIS EXCELLENCY the Acting Governor has been pleased to direct that the following charges shall be made for water delivered from the Mombasa Water Supply:—

#### GENERAL CHARGE.

- (1) To the General public at private standpipes or other water installations in houses or compounds,  
Rs. 1-50 per 1,000 gallons,  
the supply in each case to be measured by meter.

#### HIRE OF METER.

- (2) For the hire of a meter on any service pipe of less than 1½ inch in diameter, a monthly charge of fifty cents. The rent for meters of larger size shall be a matter for special quotation by the Water Authority in each particular case.

#### MINIMUM CHARGE.

- (3) For supply to any standpipe or installation there shall be made a minimum monthly charge of Rs. 2-50 in addition to the sum payable for rent of meter.

#### REDUCED RATE FOR LARGE SUPPLIER.

- (4) Where the average daily delivery through one meter to one consumer exceeds 30,000 gallons throughout the month, the charge made for such month shall be at the rate of Rs. 1-25 per 1,000 gallons.

## SCALE OF CHARGES.—(Contd).

## RATE AT THE PUBLIC KIOSKS.

- (5) The charge for water supplied at the public kiosks shall be one cent for a single delivery into any vessel or container of a capacity not exceeding four gallons.

## CHARGE TO PUBLIC BODIES.

- (6) The charge to the Uganda Railway and other Government Departments for public purposes, and to any Local Authority in the Island for municipal purposes, shall be at the rate of Rs. 1-25 per 1,000 gallons.

## SHIPPING.

- (7) The charge to shipping, including dhows, at Kilindini or Mombasa shall be at the rate of Rs. 4-00 per 1,000 gallons. The supply to shipping shall be effected only at the standpipes established for the purpose at Kilindini and Mombasa. The re-sale of water derived from other points on the town system is prohibited.

## DRINKING FOUNTAINS.

- (8) The removal of water in vessels or containers from the free public drinking fountains is prohibited.

**NOTICE OF AUCTION OF OFFENSIVE FACTORY SITES.**

SUBJECT to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, the Crown Leases of a number of the above sites will be offered for sale under the following conditions:—

The number of plots which will be put up to auction will be regulated by the applications received under Condition No. 1 of the Conditions of Sale, and the number of plots when ascertained together with the place and date of the sale will be the subject of a subsequent notice.

**AUCTION SALE OF OFFENSIVE FACTORY SITES, NAIROBI.****CONDITIONS OF SALE.**

1. Any person who wishes to purchase one or more of these plots shall give notice in writing of his intention to the Land Officer not later than December 15th, 1917. Such notice must state the number of plots the applicant is desirous of purchasing and the purpose to which it is intended to put such plots. The Land Officer will then issue a certificate stating the number of plots the applicant is entitled to purchase, and no person who is unable to produce such certificate at the auction shall be entitled to bid.

2. Only one plot at a time will be auctioned.

3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bid. The amount of the advance shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.

4. A purchaser of a plot shall be entitled to acquire such additional plots as will make up the number stated on his certificate each at the same price as that paid for the plot purchased, provided that such additional plots shall adjoin the plot purchased and each other. The purchaser shall declare to the auctioneer his intention of taking up such additional plots immediately on the fall of the hammer.

5. No person shall be allowed to purchase a greater number of plots than that shewn on his certificate.

6. Each purchaser must pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer 25% of the purchase price of the plot or plots. In default of payment of such deposit the lease of the plot or plots may be re-offered for sale immediately and any subsequent bid made by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

7. The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st December, next following, the prescribed survey fee and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty payable in respect of the lease shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and if the conditions of the sale have been complied with, be entitled to a lease of the plot or plots, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Land Officer can present to the purchaser the lease of the plot or plots duly executed.

8. The lease shall commence on the 1st day of the month next following that in which the sale is held and rent shall be payable from that date.

9. Subject to the proviso contained therein if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent, fees and duty mentioned in Condition 7 is not paid to the Land Officer within seven days from the date of the sale, the Land Officer may order that the deposit made by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the plot or plots.

10. Each purchaser shall erect upon his plot or plots, within two years of the commencement of the lease, buildings suitable to the purpose for which the same has been purchased, such buildings to be erected according to plans and specifications which must be approved in writing by the Land Officer or such other official as he may appoint for the purpose.

11. Each purchaser shall be responsible for the cost of construction of the sidings and road or roads adjoining his plot or plots, such cost to be leviable on the completion of such sidings and roads.

12. Each purchaser shall drain his plot or plots to the satisfaction of Government and shall connect such drainage with any main drainage system of the Township of Nairobi as may hereafter be constructed.

13. Each purchaser shall keep his plot or plots in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of Government.

14. No plot or plots shall without the consent of the Land Officer first obtained, be used at any time during the term of the lease for any purpose other than that for which they have been purchased.

15. No plot or plots shall at any time during the term of the lease be used as a place of residence by any person or persons whatsoever.

16. Purchasers of more than one plot in accordance with No. 4 of these conditions are hereby notified that plots so purchased will be treated in the lease as one plot which must not be subdivided without the consent of the Governor, but the rent payable in respect thereof will be the total rent of the number of plots purchased.
