PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the Powers conferred upon the Governor by the Native Hut and Poll Tax Amendment Ordinance, 1915, section 2, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that on and after the 1st day of April, 1918, the sum payable in respect of Hut and Poll Tax, as the case may be, leviable under the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910, sections 3 and 5 respectively, in the areas of the Province of Naivasha occupied by the Elgeyo, Kamasia, Marakwet, Suk and Turkana tribes shall be increased to Rs 5/-

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 8]

ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 18th day of October, 1917 By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamition made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Aims Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition Act, 1914), the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited

And Whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect —

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same —

- (1) That the following headings should be deleted —
- (A) Aluminium, alloys of aluminium and manufactures of aluminium,
 - (c) Arsenical oie,

Chemicals, &c, the following -

- (c) Arsenic, compounds of aisenic and mixture, containing arsenic,

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved
