#### THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906.

#### PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS an outbreak of Rinderpest has occurred in the Kenva Native Reserve Now, Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, I, William John Monson, Governor's Deputy of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare the areas set out in the Schedule annexed hereto to be infected areas for the purposes of the aforesaid Ordinance

#### SCHEDULE

- (a) The area enclosed between the Sagana and Thiba Rivers to the South of the Nyerr-Embu cart road
- (b) The Nyen-Embu cart road

#### By THE KING

#### A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM GEORGE R I

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Oui Privy Council, in puisuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz —

Abrasive wheels
Binder or reaper twine
Brass rod and brass wire
Cycles, other than motor cycles
Electric meters

Electrical motors over one-half horse-power

Electric hand lamps and torches

Magnetos

Measuring tapes and rules of all descriptions, including verniers

Micrometers

Pens, penholders, pencils and all other stationery of which the importation is not already prohibited

Vegetables in brine

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No 20) Proclamation, 1917

Given at Our Court at Buchingham Palace, this Sixteenth day of November, in the year of our Loid One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign

#### NOTICE

IN order to avoid any misunderstanding as to the steps taken by Government for the assurance of an increased supply of local wheat, the following resumé of Government action in this matter is published for general information

By Government Notice No 423 of December 21st, 1917, the sale and purchase of wheat for milling purposes was prohibited and the price of seed wheat was confined to a maximum

of Rs 5 per load of 60 lbs

By Government Notice No 17 of January 16th, 1918, the maximum price of seed wheat was withdrawn. The embargo on the sale of local wheat for milling will be removed when the proportion of the present crop required for seed has been ascertained and secured to that purpose. Mr Powell has been seconded to this task and as soon as the country's seed requirements have been assured the remaining wheat will be released for milling.

Government has not guaranteed a minimum price for locally grown wheat, but Government Notice No 436 of December 28th, 1917, provides that the importation of wheat and wheat flour will be prohibited except on licence for 3 years from December 1st, 1918, that licences will only be granted to meet a deficiency and that maximum prices will be fixed at rates which will ensure the growers and millers a legitimate profit and the public a reasonable price
