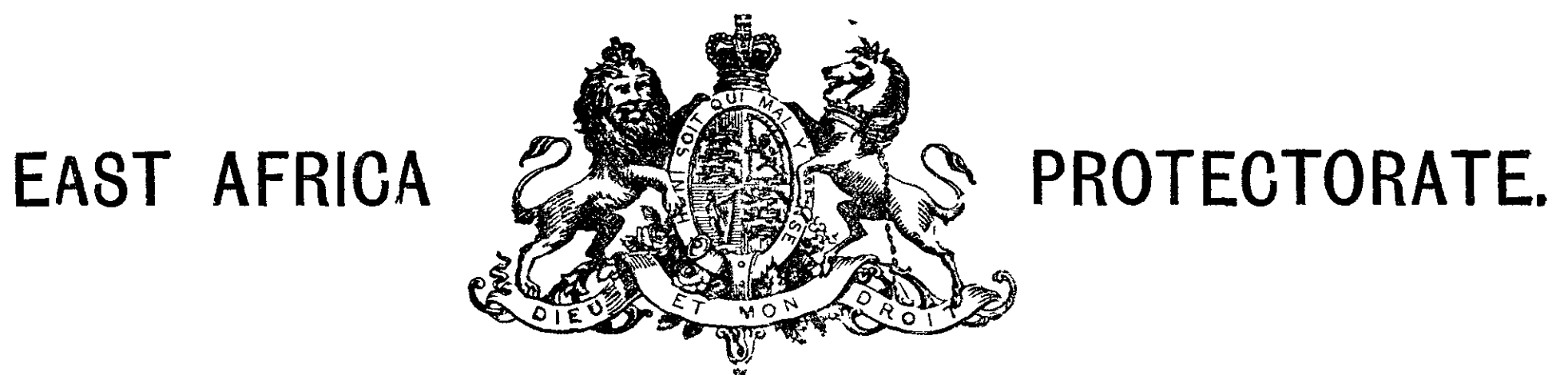

EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

AN ORDINANCE

No 9 of 1918

An Ordinance to provide for Licences for Cattle Trading.

[April 2nd, 1918]

Date of assent and
commencement

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “The Stock Traders Short title
Licence Ordinance, 1918 ”

2 For the purposes of this Ordinance

Interpretation

The term “stock” shall include cattle, sheep, goats, donkeys and swine

The term “cattle” shall include bulls, cows, oxen, heifers and calves

The term “dairyman” shall include any person who keeps cows for the purpose of obtaining milk for sale

3 No person shall either as a principal employee or agent sell stock either for cash or by barter without a licence Provided that it shall not be necessary for a farmer or dairyman to be in possession of a licence to sell or barter stock in the course of his business as a farmer or dairyman as the case may be And provided that it shall not be necessary for a native living in a Reserve or area set apart for the tribe to which he belongs to be in possession of a licence to sell or barter stock in such Reserve or area And further provided that it shall not be necessary for a native living in a Reserve or area set apart for the tribe to which he belongs to be in possession of a licence to sell or barter outside the limits of such Reserve or area stock bred in such Reserve or area

Provision for stock dealers
licences

4 Licences issued under this Ordinance may be obtained at the office of a Resident Magistrate or District Commissioner and shall be in such form as the Governor by rule may prescribe There shall be payable for such licence Rs 300/- Every licence issued under this Ordinance shall remain in force for 12 months from the date of its issue

5 Any person contravening the provisions of this Ordinance shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding Rs 1,500/- or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 6 months or to both

PROCLAMATION No 24]

THE NATIVE HUT AND POLL TAX ORDINANCE, 1910.

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910, section 4, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that the tax prescribed by section 5 of the aforesaid Ordinance shall be levied on the Border Tribes of the South Kavirondo District on and after the date hereof And in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Native Hut and Poll Tax Amendment Ordinance, 1915, I hereby further declare that on and after the date hereof the taxes prescribed by sections 3 and 5 of the said Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910, shall be increased to Rs 5 per annum, in each case, within that area of the South Kavirondo District occupied by the said Border Tribes

- 3 The persons named in the Schedule hereto are authorised to manufacture branding irons and branding instruments for sale at the respective prices enumerated in the said Schedule

This is to give notice to all British, Allied, or Neutral Persons having any such claims against cargoes which have been or may be condemned or ordered to be detained by a Prize Court in the United Kingdom, India, Egypt, or in any of the Colonies not possessing responsible Government and Protectorates, that any such claims should be sent with all necessary particulars to the Secretary of the Committee Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, London, S W, within three months of the date of the order for condemnation or detention

REGULATIONS UNDER PROCLAMATION OF 8TH SEPTEMBER, 1916

THE carriage of goods across the land frontier of the Occupied Territory and British East Africa, by means of the Voi Military Railway, is allowed on the following conditions —

INWARD TRAFFIC

1 Goods intended for carriage across the frontier may be consigned between any station on the Uganda Railway and the Customs stations of Moschi or Tanga on the Tanga Railway

2 Goods consigned to His Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, the Civil Government of the Occupied Territory or the Officials of the Civil Administration may be booked direct to, and off-loaded at any intermediate station on the Tanga Railway. In all other cases, goods consigned to intermediate stations shall be off-loaded at either Moschi or Tanga, and prior to re-booking, shall be cleared through the Customs by the consignees or their authorised agents

3 The carriage of merchandise by passengers is prohibited

4 Two copies of the relative waybills for bookings to Tanga or Moschi shall be forwarded by the Railway authorities at Voi to the Assistant Comptroller of Customs, Tanga and the Customs Clerk at Moschi respectively. One copy of the relative waybill for bookings to intermediate stations—provided for in para 2—shall be forwarded to the Assistant Comptroller of Customs, Tanga

RELEASE OF GOODS

5 No packages off-loaded at Moschi or Tanga shall be delivered to consignees by the Railway authorities until released by the Customs

6 At Tanga all goods shall be off-loaded at the Pier Godown for clearance, with the exception of Railway Parcels of perishable goods, which may be released by the Customs at the Railway Station

OUTWARD TRAFFIC

7 Goods may be consigned from any station on the Tanga Railway to any station on the Uganda Railway on the following conditions —

- (a) No bookings shall be accepted by the Railway authorities unless the consignor produces an Export Entry, duly passed by the Customs at Tanga or Moschi. Each entry shall be endorsed by the Station Master, or other responsible Railway Official, shewing the quantity and description of the goods and the date of acceptance, and shall be returned by him to the Customs station of origin
- (b) The consignor shall be liable for the payment of the import duties, leviable under the East Africa Protectorate Customs Ordinance, on all goods consigned to any station on the Uganda Railway, other than Mombasa, and further to a charge of 25 cents per package to cover administration expenses. Such duties shall be paid to the Customs at Tanga or Moschi before the Export Entry can be passed
- (c) Two copies of each waybill for bookings from Moschi shall be furnished by the Railway authorities to the Customs Clerk at Moschi, and one copy of each waybill for bookings from any intermediate station or from Tanga on the Tanga Railway shall be furnished to the Assistant Comptroller of Customs, Tanga

These Regulations shall come into operation on 15th April, 1918
