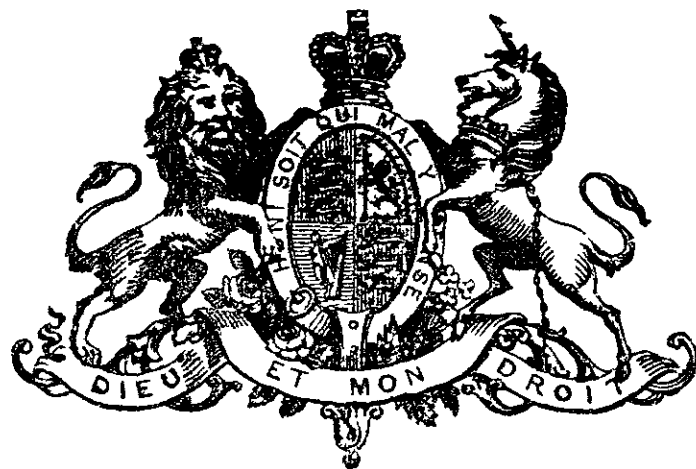

PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION No 28]

By THE KING

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM
GEORGE R I

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz —

Antimony ore, antimony, crude and regulus, and antimony sulphide
Carpets and rugs of all descriptions not otherwise prohibited

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No 22) Proclamation, 1918

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Sixteenth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 118]

THE FOREST ORDINANCE, 1911.

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Forest Ordinance, 1911, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to issue the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as 'The Forest (Honey) Rules, 1918'

2 No person shall in any Forest Area hang on any tree or elsewhere any honey barrel or other receptacle for the purpose of collecting honey or beeswax, and no person shall enter any Forest Area for the purpose of collecting honey or beeswax without the permission in writing of a Forest Officer

3 Any person contravening any of the provisions of these Rules shall, on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs 150/- or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 2 months or to both and any honey barrel or other receptacle placed in any Forest Area in contravention of these Rules may be destroyed by any Forest Officer

- 1 These Rules may be cited as the Diseases of Animals (Revocation) Rules, 1918
- 2 The following Rules are hereby revoked —
 - (a) The Diseases of Animals (Dipping) Rules, 1916
 - (b) The Diseases of Animals (Dipping) Amendment Rules, 1916, and
 - (c) Rule 7 (5) of the Diseases of Animals (Permit Issuer's) Rules, 1917

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 120]

THE COMPULSORY SERVICE ORDINANCE, 1915.

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1915, section 16 His Excellency the Acting Governor-in-Council has been pleased to issue the following Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as "The Compulsory Service (Asiatic) Rules, 1918"
- 2 The Chairman of any District Committee may by notice direct any male Asiatic, not being a subject of a Foreign Power, between the ages of 18 and 45 residing in the district to present himself before the Committee at such time and place as the Chairman may specify in such notice to show cause why his name should not be submitted to the War Council as being a fit person to serve in a Corps the formation of which has been sanctioned by the Governor under the provisions of the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1915. In default of appearance on the date specified in the said notice the name of the person set out in such notice shall be submitted to the War Council as aforesaid
- 3 The District Committee shall before submitting the name of any Asiatic to the War Council under these Rules direct that such Asiatic shall be examined by a Medical Officer with a view to ascertaining his fitness or otherwise for military service
- 4 An employer may either in person or in writing apply for the exemption of any of his employees. Such application shall be made to the District Committee of the district in which such employer resides
- 5 In considering claims for exemption the District Committee shall take into consideration —
 - (a) the circumstances of each applicant,
 - (b) the interests of the employer (if any), and
 - (c) the nature and value of the work performed by the applicant or his employer (if any) in the production of commodities of economic value
- 6 The proceedings of the District Committee shall be held in public
- 7 The Chairman of the District Committee shall forward to the War Council —
 - (a) full particulars of every person whose name is submitted under the provisions of these Rules, and
 - (b) full particulars of any medical or other reason adduced by or on behalf of any person claiming exemption from military service together with any recommendation the District Committee may wish to make on such claim
- 8 The War Council may grant a certificate of exemption to any person exempted from military service on medical grounds or on any other ground set out in Rule 5 stating therein the reasons therefor provided that any such certificate may at any time be withdrawn by the War Council for any reason to be stated by such Council
- 9 In the event of the War Council refusing to grant a certificate of exemption under Rule 8 on the particulars furnished by the Chairman of the District Committee the applicant for exemption from military service or his employer if the application for such exemption is made by the employer shall have the right to appeal in person to the War Council for further consideration of the application for exemption and the War Council shall hear such appeal. Any proceedings under this Rule shall be held in public
- 10 A quorum of the War Council for the purposes of these Rules shall be any number not less than 5 members
- 11 For the purposes of these Rules the term "employer" shall include any person acting as an agent for or as a manager on behalf of an employer
- 12 These Rules shall not apply to any person serving in His Majesty's Forces
- 13 No male Asiatic not being a subject of a Foreign Power, between the ages of 18 and 45, who holds a certificate of competency under the Motor Traffic Ordinance, 1915, shall leave the Protectorate without permission in writing from the President of the War Council

DRAFT RULES REGARDING NATIVE PASSES.

RULES

The following draft Native Pass Rules are published for general information and comment

DRAFT PASS LAW RULES

1 These Rules shall apply to the township of Nairobi and may be cited as "Nairobi Township Native Pass and Service Rules of 1918" They shall come into force on a date to be fixed by notice published in the Official Gazette Title, etc

2 In these Rules the term "Native" means any native of Africa not of European or Asiatic origin, and includes any Somali or Swahili, and shall include male and female provided that whenever any question shall arise as to whether any person is a native, the onus shall be on such person to prove that he is not a native The term "Pass Officer" means an officer appointed by the Municipality to issue native passes and the term "Pass Office" means the office used by a Pass Officer as his office Definitions

The term "Employer" means any person employing a native for hire, wages or other remuneration and in the case of a firm or company shall mean the responsible manager or the person responsible for the control or management thereof

The term "Service" shall be interpreted as governed by the last foregoing definition

3 Subject to Rule 4, any native who may be in the township on the date when these Rules come into force shall be registered under these Rules and become possessed of a pass in one of the forms prescribed in the schedules to these Rules, by a date to be prescribed by the Town Clerk by notice published in the Official Gazette and from and after such date, no native, except as aforesaid, shall remain in the township unless he shall be registered and possessed of a Pass as aforesaid provided that nothing contained in this Rule shall be held to apply to a native entering the township after 6 a.m., and leaving it before 6 p.m., on the same day All natives to have passes

4 The following natives shall be exempt from the operations of Rule 3 hereof viz Exemptions

(i) Members of the East Africa Police Force stationed in Nairobi and such of their followers as shall be registered by the Police Department and possessed of passes issued by the Police Department

(ii) Permanent employees of Government Departments or the Municipal Committee being in possession of certificates of employment issued by the Heads of their Departments

(iii) Plot holders under the Crown

(iv) Native labourers employed by the month or shorter period by any Government Department or the Municipal Committee and being in temporary and not in regular employment, and housed to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health

(v) Any native labourer employed by the month or shorter period by a private contractor upon a specific contract and registered under the Masters and Servants Ordinance, 1910, and housed by such contractor to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health

(vi) Any juvenile being or appearing to be under the age of 14 years who is under the control of his or her parent or parents or of a responsible guardian

5 If any person (other than an officer of Government or the Municipality acting as such, or a person engaging labour exempted under Rule 4 (v) hereof) shall engage any native, or introduce any native into the township with the object of giving or finding him employment, such person shall within a period of 24 hours of engaging or introducing such native or if such period expires on a Saturday after 12 o'clock noon, or a Sunday or a public holiday, then as soon thereafter as the Pass Office shall be open take or send him to the Pass Office and shall furnish the Pass Officer with such full and correct information as may be necessary for completion of a Certificate of Service in the form set out in Schedule I to these Rules The Pass Officer shall then, with the consent of the native, cause the Certificate of Service to be completed and delivered to the employer who shall pay to him a fee of Re 1/- therefor which the employer may recover from the wages of such native Such Certificate of Service shall be the property of the native employed, but the employer shall keep it in his possession until the termination of the period of service as defined by the Masters and Servants Ordinance, 1910 At the termination of the period of service the employer shall truly and correctly fill in the requisite particulars on the certificate and deliver the certificate to the native employed Employers to get certificates of service for employees

6 A native for whom a Certificate of Service has been issued shall obtain from the Pass Officer monthly during his period of service a pass in the form prescribed in Schedule II to these Rules for which his employer shall pay to the Pass Officer a fee of 50 cents A native not working for an employer or working as a daily labourer shall obtain from the Pass Officer monthly a pass in the form prescribed in Schedule III to these Rules for which he shall pay to the Pass Officer a fee of 50 cents All Natives to have monthly passes

A monthly pass issued under this Rule shall be valid until the last day of the calendar month in which it is issued only

Passes to look for work

7 Any native entering the township from outside shall within a period of 24 hours of such entry or if such period expires on a Saturday after 12 o'clock noon or a Sunday or a public holiday, then as soon thereafter as the Pass Office shall be open (unless he shall have again departed) report himself at the Pass Office and shall, unless he shall be in, or have found, employment, procure from the Pass Officer a pass to look for work in the form prescribed in Schedule IV hereto. The Pass Officer may refuse to issue a pass or cancel a pass issued under this Rule at his discretion. Such pass will be issued free of charge and shall be valid for 6 days from the date of issue provided that the Pass Officer may if he sees reason to do so extend the period for a further period of 6 days. If such native shall fail to obtain work before his pass has expired he shall forthwith present his pass to the Pass Officer for endorsement.

Natives without passes not to be employed

8 A person shall not take into his employment any native who is not in possession of such valid pass as may be requisite under these Rules.

Visitors passes

9 A native coming into the township as a visitor or in the employment of a visitor shall within a period of 24 hours of his arrival or if such period expires on a Saturday after 12 o'clock noon, or on a Sunday or on a public holiday, then as soon thereafter as the Pass Office shall be open obtain from the Pass Officer a pass in the form prescribed in Schedule V hereto which shall be issued free of charge. Such pass shall be valid for a period to be specified therein not exceeding 14 days. If such native is in employment his employer shall supply him with a letter to the Pass Officer with a view to his obtaining a pass.

Night Permits

10 Subject to Rule 11 hereof no native shall be elsewhere than in his place of residence as shown on his monthly pass between the hours of 9 p.m., and 5 a.m., (unless actually in attendance on his employer or a member of his employer's household, without a permit issued by a Pass Officer, in the form prescribed in Schedule VI to these Rules or a permit dated and signed by his employer. A permit under this Rule shall be valid only for the period specified thereon and in no case for a longer period than 8 hours.

No native exempted from registration under clauses (iv) or (v) of Rule 4 hereof shall unless in the course of his employment be anywhere except on the place where he is housed between the hours of 6 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Night School Permits

11 A native desiring to attend a night school shall obtain from the Pass Officer a permit in the form prescribed in Schedule VII hereto entitling him to be at large for the purpose of going to and returning from such night school until the hour of 10 p.m. Such permit will be issued free of charge and will be valid till the last day of the calendar month in which it is issued. The Pass Officer before issuing a permit under this Rule shall satisfy himself that the applicant has the intention of attending a night school and shall subsequently satisfy himself that he is doing so.

Production of passes

12 Natives shall carry such passes and permits as are requisite under these Rules at all times on their persons and shall produce them on demand to any Pass Officer, or any Police Officer or other authorized official and any native not having such passes or permits as are requisite or whose pass or permit is expired or invalid or of no force and effect under these Rules, or who refuses or neglects to produce any requisite pass or permit when called upon to do so may be arrested by such Police Officer or other authorized official without a warrant, and such native shall be guilty of an offence.

Forged certificates or passes

13 Any person falsifying or fabricating or tampering with a Certificate of Service or wilfully making any false statement thereon or any native attempting to use for his own benefit a Certificate of Service or a pass or permit which is not his property or which he knows to be fabricated or falsified, shall be guilty of an offence.

Discharged natives to report themselves

14 A native on being discharged from service shall report himself to a Pass Officer and either obtain a pass to seek work or have his Certificate of Service endorsed with a view to leaving the township and such native shall in the latter case leave the township within 24 hours.

Employers to notify deaths and desertions

15 In case of the desertion or death of a native in service, the employer shall within 6 days notify the Pass Officer and forward to him the Certificate of Service.

Duplicates of lost documents

16 In case of a loss of a Certificate of Service, pass or permit a Pass Officer on being satisfied of the *bona fides* of the case shall issue a duplicate of such certificate or pass or permit marked "duplicate" across the face thereof. A fee of Rs 2/- shall be paid for a duplicate certificate and 50 cents for a duplicate pass (except in the case of free passes) provided that where the Pass Officer is satisfied that such loss was due to a cause over which the applicant had no control, he may remit the whole or part of the fee. Duplicate permits shall be issued free of charge. The Pass Officer shall enter all such issues of duplicates in his records.

No passes etc., to be issued by natives
Young unattached female natives

17 A native shall not issue a document purporting to be a certificate, pass or permit under these Rules. Any such document issued by a native shall be of no effect.

18 No female native being or appearing to be under the age of 17 years shall remain in the township unless she is a married woman living with her husband, or is under the control of her father or responsible male guardian or is in the service of a reputable employer.

The Pass Officer shall have discretion to decide whether any person is a reputable employer under this Rule.

Powers of Police Penalties

19 Offences against these Rules shall be cognisable by the Police.

20 Any person failing to comply with any of the provisions of these Rules shall be liable on conviction to imprisonment of either kind for a period not exceeding 2 months or a fine not exceeding Rs 200/-, or both. A native convicted of a breach of these Rules may be ordered to leave the township for such a period as the Court may prescribe.

THE BRITISH PROTECTORATES (DEFENCE) ORDER-
IN-COUNCIL, 1916.

REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on him by the British Protectorates (Defence) Order-in-Council, 1916, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations —

1 These Regulations may be cited as “The Defence Regulations (No 1) 1918 ”

2 (1) For the purpose of ascertaining whether goods of any description are held on account of or for the future account of, or for the benefit or future benefit, direct or indirect, of any person resident or carrying on business in any country which at the time is at war with His Majesty, or any person of enemy nationality, or are held otherwise to the prejudice of British interests, the Governor may by order—

(a) require all persons who are owners of, or who are in possession of, or have control over, any goods to furnish to any officer authorised by the Governor in that behalf any information in their possession which such officer may require—

(i) as to the nature, quantity, use, origin, and destination of the goods, and the purposes for which they are held,

(ii) where the goods are not in the possession of the owner, as to the actual ownership of the goods and conditions under which the goods are held,

(iii) in order to establish whether the amount of the goods held is in excess of the normal requirements of the trade of the owner thereof and the reasons for the excess, if any,

(b) authorise any officer to enter any premises on which he has reason to suspect that goods of any such description are kept or stored and carry out such inspection of and examination of the premises and goods thereon as the officer may consider necessary for obtaining such information as aforesaid,

(c) authorise any officer to require the production of and to inspect all books or documents relating to goods of any such description

(2) Any order requiring such information as aforesaid shall be published in the Official Gazette and in such other manner as the Governor thinks best adapted for informing the persons affected and ensuring publicity

(3) Where the Governor as the result of such inquiries as aforesaid is of opinion that any goods are held on account of, or for the future account of, or for the benefit or future benefit, direct or indirect, of any persons resident or carrying on business in any country which at the time is at war with His Majesty or any person of enemy nationality, or that the continued withholding of the goods from the market is to the prejudice of the public interest, the Governor may, by order sent by registered post to or delivered at the last known place of address in the Protectorate of the owner of the goods, require him to dispose of the goods in such manner and within such time as may be specified in the order

(4) If the owner of the goods cannot be ascertained or is not resident within the Protectorate the order may be addressed to and may confer powers of sale on, the person in whose possession or under whose control the goods may happen to be

(5) For the purpose of these Regulations the expression "owner" in relation to any goods includes any person who, as factor or otherwise, has power to sell the goods

(6) If any person—

(a) refuses or neglects to furnish any information or to answer any question put to him, in pursuance of any order made under this Regulation, or knowingly furnishes any false information or makes any false answer to any such question, or

(b) refuses or neglects to produce any books or documents relating to the goods in question which may be in his possession or under his control, or

(c) fails to comply with any order made by the Governor as to the disposal of goods ordered to be disposed of under this Regulation, or

(d) except as authorised by the Governor discloses or makes use of any information given to him under this Regulation,

he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations and shall be liable to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 6 months or to a fine not exceeding Rs 1,500/- or to both

3 Offences against these Regulations may be tried by any Magistrate holding a Subordinate Court of the First Class

REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the British Protectorates (Defence) Order-in-Council, 1916, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations --

1 These Regulations may be cited as "The Defence Regulations (No 3), 1918 "

2 On and after the 20th day of April, 1918, every person other than

(a) a native of Africa not of European or Asiatic origin,

(b) a member of His Majesty's Forces, or

(c) an official of the Government of the Protectorate,

of the age of 15 years or over disembarking at any place within the Protectorate or otherwise entering the Protectorate shall proceed without delay to the nearest Government Station and shall within 24 hours of his arrival thereat report at the office of the Military Censor or if no such office is established in such station at the office of the principal administrative officer therein for the purpose of obtaining a card of identity

3 The applicant for a card of identity shall furnish to the officer issuing the same such particulars as to the place of intended residence, the period of such residence, parentage, employment, nationality, references, previous history and otherwise as the officer may require

4 The card of identity issued shall contain any conditions which the officer issuing the same may prescribe as to visa, residence, movement or otherwise Any such condition shall strictly be adhered to by the person to whom such card is issued

5 Any Military officer and any Police officer or officer of the Civil Administration may at any time demand the production of the card of identity issued to any person and the same shall forthwith be produced for inspection

6 Any person to whom a card of identity has been issued shall on leaving the Protectorate surrender such card to the Military Censor at the place of embarkation or departure from the Protectorate and no person to whom a card of identity has been issued shall leave the Protectorate save at a place at which a Military Censor has been established

7 Any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable on conviction by a Magistrate holding a Subordinate Court of the first class to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 6 months or to a fine not exceeding Rs 1,500 or to both such imprisonment and fine and on conviction by the High Court to imprisonment of either kind not exceeding seven years or in the case of an offence where intention of assisting the enemy is proved death or rigorous imprisonment for a term not exceeding 14 years

8 Any person committing a breach of these Regulations may in lieu of or in addition to any other punishment be deported

ORDER-IN-COUNCIL, 1916.****REGULATIONS**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the British Protectorates (Defence) Order-in-Council, 1916, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations —

1 These Regulations may be cited as “The Defence Regulations (No 4) 1918 ”

2 “Motor spirit” for the purposes of these Regulations shall mean any inflammable hydrocarbon (including any mixture of hydrocarbons and any liquid containing hydrocarbon), which is capable of being used for providing reasonably efficient motive power for a motor car

3 No person shall sell motor spirit to any person unless the person to whom the motor spirit is to be supplied shall produce a licence signed by the District Commissioner of the district in which he ordinarily resides permitting motor spirit to the amount specified in the licence to be sold or supplied to the holder of the licence

4 The person supplying the motor spirit under a licence issued in accordance with the provisions of the preceding Regulation shall retain the licence under which such motor spirit is supplied and shall enter in a book kept for the purpose particulars of every such sale including the name and address of the purchaser and the amount of motor spirit supplied. The licences so retained and the book in which the aforesaid entries are made shall be open to inspection by any European Police Officer between the hours of 9 a m and 5 p m , at the place of business of the person supplying motor spirit

5 No District Commissioner shall issue a licence under these Regulations save —

(1) for the purposes of stationary industrial machinery

(2) for motor vehicles used by medical practitioners for the purposes of their profession

(3) for business purposes not comprised within the foregoing

Provided that the business of letting out motor cars for hire shall not be regarded as a business purpose for the purposes of these Regulations unless the purpose for which the motor car is hired is in the opinion of the District Commissioner a business purpose

6 Any person having in his possession any motor spirit in respect of which a licence has not been issued under these Regulations shall forthwith send a return stating the amount of such motor spirit and the place where it is stored and the purposes for which and the manner in which it is used or kept by him to the District Commissioner of the district in which such motor spirit is so possessed. A District Commissioner may direct any European Police Officer to search any premises on which he suspects such motor spirit to be stored and which has not been made the subject of a return under these Regulations

7 No person shall sell motor spirit by retail above the following maximum prices —

At Mombasa per case Rs 17/50, lots of ten cases or over Rs 17/00 per case

At Nairobi Rs 22/40 per case

At Nakuru Rs 23/90 per case

At Kisumu Rs 24/40 per case

All ex-godown

At any other place at a price not exceeding such maximum price as the District Commissioner of the district in which such place is situated may fix having regard to cost of transport to such place

8 Any person committing a breach of any of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction by a Subordinate Court of the First or Second Class be liable to a fine not exceeding Rs 1,500/- or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 6 months or to both such fine and imprisonment

Chauhan THE EARL OF SELBORNE, K G , G C M G

MEMORANDUM

There are in the naval and military forces now on active service many officers and men from the Colonies and Protectorates who have —

- (a) Graduated at an Overseas university
- (b) Had their studies at an Overseas university interrupted by the call to serve
- (c) Passed examinations of university entrance standard, but have not attended a university
- (d) Had practically no education since leaving school at an early age, but have developed considerable character and power of thought, and would benefit greatly by a course of study at a university
- (e) Attended technical schools or been engaged in occupations demanding a high standard of technical knowledge

A number of these men come to England from the fleets at sea, and armies in the field, suffering from wounds or sickness, and after a time spent in hospital those who are unfit for further active service generally return to their own countries. It is believed that many would be glad to avail themselves, before returning to their homes, of the facilities for special education afforded by British universities and schools of technology. It has been ascertained that the universities and technical schools will welcome such men and provide one year courses of study specially designed for all needs.

It is estimated that a scholarship of the annual value of from £150 to £250 a year—varying according to the university, college or school selected—would amply cover all expenses of a scholar, including tuition and other fees, and cost of living.

A scheme is at present under consideration for providing a considerable number of such scholarships. Meanwhile funds have been made available to enable selected men, who are now unfit for further service, to attend the universities and technical schools.

Each scholarship will be awarded on the recommendation of the Governor of the Colony or Protectorate to which the candidate belongs, upon the University, College, or School to which the candidate is proposed agreeing to accept him. The scholarships will be paid in quarterly instalments, the first on beginning residence at a residential university, college, or school, or on the date appointed for the commencement of attendance at a non residential

university, college, or school, and thereafter terminally, provided that the university, college, or school to which any scholar may belong be satisfied with his work and conduct. Should a scholar fail to give satisfaction to his university, college, or school, his scholarship may be withdrawn.

The naval or military status of a scholar will be determined by the conditions prescribed by the authorities of the Colony or Protectorate to which he belongs, *e g*, he may be

- (1) A retired officer or discharged man
- (2) An officer or man still serving, and
 - (a) on leave and in receipt of pay, or
 - (b) on leave without pay

It is to be clearly understood that normal university and college conditions shall prevail in regard to all scholars, irrespective of naval or military rank or status, *i e*, the scholar shall

- (a) Be subject to the ordinary rules of university and college discipline
- (b) Follow a course of study approved by the university, college or school of which he is a member

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect —

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same —
