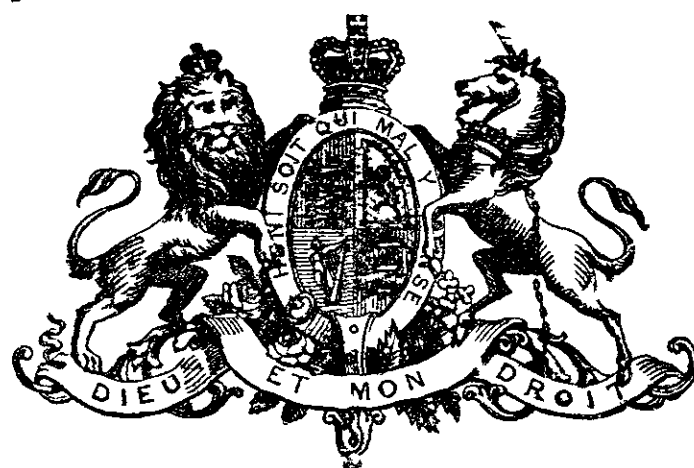

NOTICE

THE SECRETARIAT,

Nairobi, May 23rd, 1918

THE following list of articles, the export of which from British India is prohibited, is published for general information

Firms or individuals desiring to import any of the prohibited articles other than rice, wheat or wheat flour should apply to the Priority Authority, which will consider their applications and make recommendations as it thinks fit. It must, however, be understood that a permit to export from India does not necessarily imply that shipping space will be available or that priority will be given.

Arrangements have been made with the Protectorate Agents in Bombay for shipments of rice wheat and wheat flour up to the normal requirements of the country, the allocation of shipping space for this purpose being left to their discretion.

List of articles the export of which from British India is prohibited as under.

Note I—These prohibitions do not apply to —

- (i) the export of any article by the Crown,
- (ii) the export of any article shipped for use or consumption on the voyage, except where the Governor General in Council by general or special order otherwise directs,
- (iii) the export of any article (other than wool) shipped to any Indian port,
- (iv) the export of any article for use or consumption in any Native State in India, and
- (v) the export of any article shipped under a license granted by the Chief Customs officer at the place of export

Note II—The export of the goods mentioned below is prohibited as follows —

- (i) Goods marked (A) *to all destinations*
- (ii) „ „ (B) *to all destinations except the United Kingdom*
- (iii) „ „ (C) *to all destinations except the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates*
- (iv) „ „ (D) *to all destinations in foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas other than France, Italy, Spain and Portugal, and to all Russian Baltic Ports*


