THE following list of articles, the export of which from British India is prohibited, is published for general information

Firms or individuals desiring to import any of the prohibited articles other than lice, wheat or wheat flour should apply to the Priority Authority, which will consider their applications and make recommendations as it thinks fit. It must, however, be understood that a permit to export from India does not necessarily imply that shipping space will be available or that priority will be given

Arrangements have been made with the Protectorate Agents in Bombay for shipments of rice wheat and wheat flour up to the normal requirements of the country, the allocation of shipping space for this purpose being left to their discretion
