A PROCLAMATION

RITARY AND LINE INFORMATION OF CENTAIN AFROMS INTO THE UNITED KINGDON

WHERE 15 by section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, immunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly

And where sat is expedient that the importation into the United Krigdom of contain other goods should be prohibited

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Prive Council in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do her many pollum, direct and ordain as follows—

As from and ofter the date hereof, subject as heremafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following articles is hereby prohibited, viz —

Cheese

A PROCLAMATION

Prohibiting the Exportation from the Unitld Kincdom to Switzerland of Certain Articles

$GEORGE \ { m R} \ { m I}$

WHEREAS it is provided by Section one of the Exportation of Aims Act, 1900, that We may by Proclamation prohibit the exportation of all or any of the following articles, namely aims, ammunition, military or naval scores, and any article which 7/9 shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of aims, ammunition, or military or naval stores, to any country or place there arms, ammunition, military or naval stores, being used against Our subjects or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval oper the in co-operation with Our forces

And whereas it is provided by Section one of the Customs (Exportation Restrictor). Act, 1914, that Section one of the Exportation of Aims Act, 1900, shall have the whilst a state of war in which We are engaged exists as it, in addition to the article therein mentioned, there were included all other articles of every description

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the tenth day of May, 1917, certain articles were prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom to, among other destinations, all destinations in Switzerland

And whereas Our said Proclamation has been varied or added to by various Orders of Council, and may hereafter be varied or added to by other Orders of Council, or We may hereafter think fit to revoke Our said Proclamation and to issue another Proclamation in lieu thereof

And whereas We judge it expedient that, in addition to such articles as may for the time being be prohibited to be exported to destinations in Switzerland under Our Proclamation aforesaid or under any like Proclamation which We may hereafter issue in lieu of Our said Proclamation, the articles hereinafter specified should also be provinced to be exported to all destinations in Switzerland

Now therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council in pursuance of the said Acts and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf do hereby declare, and it is hereby declared as follows —

- 1 As from and after the date of this Proclamation, the articles specified in the Schedule hereto shall be prohibited to be exported to any destination in Switzerland
- Our Proclamation made the thinteenth day of March, 1917, as amended by the Orders of Council, dated the 10th August and 27th November, 1917, relating to the exportation of certain articles to Switzerland during the present War, is hereby revoked

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act. 1876, it is provided that the importation of aims, amnunition, grinpowder or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of cocaine or of opium should be prohibited except as heremafter provided

Now, therefore, We by and with the advice of Our Piny Council in musuance of the said Act and of all other powers enalling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim due t and ordain as follows -

As from and after this date, subject as here nafter provided, all cocaine and all opum shall be prohibited to be imported into the United Kingdom

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that nothing in this Proclamation shall apply to cocaine or opium imported under the licence of one of Our Principal Secretaries of State and in accordance with the provisions of such licence

The word "cocaine includes ecgonine, and any substance, whether preparation, admixture, extract or otherwise, containing 0.1 per cent (one part in a thousand) or more of cocaine or ecgonine, or of any salts or derivative thereof

The "word" opium means raw opium, powdered or granulated opium, or opium prepared for smoking, and includes any solid or semi-solid mixture containing opium

The Cocaine and Opium (Prohibition of Import) No 2 Proclamation, 1916, is hereby revoked

This Proclamation may be cited as The Cocaine and Opium (Prohibition of Import)

 - (2) The certificate hereinbefore mentioned shall certify the total number of animals of each specified description that may be embarked on such ship or vessel for the intended voyage and that a sufficent quantity of fit and wholesome food and water has been placed on board to provide and supply such animals during the period of the voyage

- (3) Such certificate shall also specify the port or ports of destination to which such ship or vessel is bound, the description of animals embarked, and also the number and description of animals to be disembarked at each port of destination, if more than one, and no animal, except from unavoidable cause, shall be carried beyond such port of destination
- (4) The Government Veterinary Officer, District Commissioner or the Port Officer as the case may be shall, in certifying the total number of animals of each specified description that may be embarked on the ship or vessel for the intended voyage, only certify for such number of animals as can be properly fed or watered on such ship or vessel and properly accommodated thereon without overcrowding in any part so as to cause injury or unnecessary suffering to any animal
