THE CUSTOMS AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1915.

PROCLAMATION

THE BRITISH PROTECTORATES (DFFENCE) ORDER-IN-COUNCIL, 1916.

REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the British Protectorates (Defence) Order-in-Council, 1916, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, make the following Regulations —

These Regulations may be cited as "The Defence Regulations (No 19), 1918," and shall be read together with "The Defence Regulations (No 3), 1918," dated the 17th day of April, 1918 (Government Notice No. 123), hereinafter called the Principal Regulations

Regulation 2 (b) of the Principal Regulations is hereby smended by the deletion of the word "or," and by the addition of the words "and his wife if of British birth, or " after the words "His Majesty's Foices"

Regulation 2 (c) of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition of the words "and his wife if of British birth"

ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of July, 1918

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council No 59

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be turther varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majest 5 Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly




