Officers and soldiers of Overseas Forces

Native troops in East and West Africa

Members of Overseas Nursing Services

Civilians attached to British Forces in an official capacity

Native Labour Corps

Members of officially recognized Voluntary And Detachments

3 Chevions of two colours—ned and blue—have been approved. The first chevron, if earned on or before 31st December, 1914, will be ned, if earned on or after 1st January, 1915,

it will be blue, and all additional chevions after the first will be blue

4 Officers, nurses, and men of Protectorate forces no longer employed, and civilians attached to the East African Force in an official capacity, will submit applications to the Staff Officer Volunteers, Namobi All others now or hereatter employed will make application through their Officers Commanding to the Officer keeping their records, i.e., 3rd Echelon, General Headquarters, or Staff Officer Volunteers

5 The date for the award of the first chevion will be the date the individual left his own country for service overseas or, it belonging to overseas forces the date on which he left his own country or, when employed in local operations, crossed the frontier or took part in active operations. British East Africa and Uganda are for the above purpose deemed to be within the sphere of active operations from 5th August, 1914, to 5th March, 1916

b An additional chevion will be issued for every 12 months completed service overseas (not necessarily consecutive service)

## THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE, 1915.

#### NOTICE

## Sale of Leases in respect of European Residential Plots, Mombasa.

NOTICE is hereby given that Leases in respect of the 21 European Residential Plots specified in the Schedule hereto will be sold by auction at Mombasa in the Jubilee Hall on Monday the 2nd September, 1918, commencing at 10 a m

In order that the demand for Residential Plots in Mombasa may be met to the fullest extent possible at present it has been considered advisable to impose a restriction limiting any person to the purchase of one plot only

Plans of the sites may be seen at the Public Map Office, attached to the Survey Department, Nanobi, and at the Land Office, Mombasa

Maps may be had on application to either of the above Offices on payment of Re 1,'post free.

The right to withdraw any plots from this auction is reserved to Government

#### CONDITIONS

- 1 Europeans (or then certified Agents) only shall be allowed to bid and purchase, and no person shall be allowed to purchase more than one plot
  - 2 Each plot shall be auctioned separately
- 3 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding
- 4 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted
- 5 Each purchaser shall pay to the Auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 25% of his purchase money. In detault of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st day of December, 1918, the survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty payable in respect of the lease shall be paid to the Land Assistant at the Land Office, Mombasa within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of the sale have been complied with, be entitled to a lease of the plot, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Land Officer can present to the purchaser the lease of the plot duly executed

- 7 The lease shall be for 99 years and shall commence from the first day of October 1918, and the rent shall be payable from that date
- 8 Subject to the proviso contained therein, if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent tees and duty mentioned in Condition No 6 is not paid to the Land Assistant at the Land Office, Mombasa, within seven days of the date from the sale, the Land Officer may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the plot
- 9 Each purchaser shall erect on his plot within one year of the commencement of his lease a dwelling-house of approved design suitable to the locality to be built of stone, brick, concrete, asbestos or wood
- 10 Each purchaser shall, within one vear of the commencement of the lease, completely enclose his plot with a tence of suitable design and in conformity with the Township regulations
- 11 No building may approach within a less distance than 10 feet of the boundary of the plot, and at least one half of the plot must remain unbuilt upon
- 12 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint and no building shall be of a less value than that specified in the Schedule hereto and for the purpose of determining the value of the building to be erected the following buildings only shall be taken into account
  - (a) The Dwelling House
  - (b) The Kitchen
  - (c) Quarters for domestic servants
  - (d) Earth Closets

All out-buildings, Offices, etc., shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Lind Officer or such other person as he may appoint and shall be kept so screened during the term of the lease

- 13 The Lessee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of dramage, which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and, before any building may be occupied, the Lessee shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of dramage has been properly constructed
- 14 At no time during the term of the lease shall more than one dwelling house with the necessary out-buildings and offices be elected on any plot
- No building shall at any time during the term of the lease be used for any other purpose than a private dwelling house or occupied by a person or persons other than an European, or used as a place of residence for Asiatics or natives who are not domestic servants in the employ of the Lessee
- 16 Each Lessee shall suitably connect his piemises with any Town Diamage System when, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, such diamage scheme is so fai completed as to enable the Lessee reasonably so to connect
  - 17 At no time shall any plot be subdivided
- The Government of such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the Lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned
- 19 Every purchaser shall bear the cost of Deeds, Stamp Duty, Registration and Survey fees, and all other expenses, if any, connected with the purchase of the plot
  - 20 In so far as applicable the above conditions shall be embodied in each lease
