SIR,

AT the request of my War Council I have the honour to transmit to you the following Resolution

passed by that body on the 2nd instant:—

"Resolved that this War Council would request His Excellency the Acting Governor to convey to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies an appreciation of his great help during the past period of four years in arranging so satisfactorily for the import into the United Kingdom of sundry crops which required permits and also for arranging for the export to this country of certain machinery, agricultural implements, foodstuffs and other necessities during the time of shortage of necessary material required for munitions and otherwise at home."

2. This resolution has been submitted by the President with an explanation to the effect that the Council realising to the full how extraordinarily well this Protectorate has fared during the war, and how much of its great prosperity has been due to your untiring efforts, is most anxious that some appreciation of them should be communicated to you.

3. I have the very greatest pleasure in complying with their request.
