TRADING WITH TURKEY AND
BULGARIA.

GENERAL LICENCE.

Whereas by Proclamation dated the 5th day of November, 1914, it was declared that the Proclamations and Orders in Council then in force issued with reference to the state of war with the Emperor of Germany and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, should be extended to the war with Turkey, subject to the exception in such Proclamations mentioned:

And whereas the Proclamations so extended to the war with Turkey included the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2, dated the 9th day of September, 1914, and the Proclamation relating to Trading with the Enemy dated the 8th day of October, 1914:

And whereas by Proclamations dated the 7th day of January, 1915, and the 14th day of September, 1915, the provisions of the aforesaid Proclamations were extended as therein more specifically set forth:

And whereas by Proclamation dated the 16th day of October, 1915, it was declared that the Proclamations and Orders in Council then in force issued with reference to the state of war with the Emperor of Germany, the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, and the Sultan of Turkey, should be extended to the war with Bulgaria, subject to the exception in such Proclamation mentioned:—

And whereas it was declared by the said Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No. 2 as follows:—

“Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by Our licence, or by the licence given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State, or the Board of Trade, whether such licences be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons.”

And whereas it is desirable to grant the licence hereinafter appearing.”

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons and bodies of persons resident carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to trade and have commercial and financial transactions with persons or bodies of persons resident or carrying on business in Bulgaria, Turkey in Europe, Anatolia, Armenia, Kurdistan, Mesopotamia and such parts of Syria as are not already covered by the Board's General licence of the 6th January, 1919:

Provided always that any licence which may be necessary in respect of any transaction under any prohibition of export or prohibition of import for the time being in force in the United Kingdom or in respect of any remittance of money out of the United Kingdom covered by Regulation 41D of the Defence of the Realm Regulations is first obtained.

Provided also that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay to or for the benefit of any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in the said territories any sum of money which, by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914, and 1915, or either of them, is required to be paid to the Custodian appointed under the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1914, but such sums of money must be paid to the said Custodian.

Provided further that this licence shall not permit any person or body of persons to pay or deliver to any person or body of persons resident or carrying on business in the said territories any sum of money or property of which, by the terms of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Acts, 1914 and 1915, or either of them, notice has been or ought to have been given, prior to the date hereof, to the said Custodian.

RESIDENTIAL PLOTS, KISUMU.

NOTICE is hereby given that leases in respect of the 36 Business Plots and 36 Residential Plots specified in the schedule hereto will be sold by auction at Kisumu in the Office of the District Commissioner on Tuesday the 15th July, 1919, commencing at 10 a.m.

Plans of the sites may be seen at the Public Map Office, attached to the Survey Department, Nairobi, and at the Office of the District Commissioner, Kisumu, or may be had on application to either of the above Offices on payment of Re. 1/00 post free.

The right to withdraw any plots from the auction is reserved to Government.

GENERAL CONDITIONS.

1. Each plot shall be auctioned separately.
2. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding.

3. The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.

4. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 25% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

5. The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st day of December, 1919, the survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty payable in respect of the lease shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi, within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of sale have been complied with, be entitled to a lease of the plot, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Land Officer can present to the purchaser the lease of the plot duly executed.

6. The lease shall be for 99 years and shall commence from the 1st day of June, 1919, and the rent shall be payable from that date.

7. Subject to the proviso contained therein, if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent, fees and duty mentioned in Condition No. 5 is not paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi, within seven days from the date of the sale, the Land Officer may order the deposit made by the purchaser to be forfeited and the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the plot.

8. Each purchaser shall, within one year of the commencement of the lease, completely enclose his plot with a fence of suitable design and in conformity with the Township Regulations.

9. No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint.

10. The lessee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage, which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and, before any building may be occupied, the lessee shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed.

11. Each lessee shall suitably connect his premises with any Town Drainage System when, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the lessee reasonably so to connect.

12. At no time shall any plot be sub-divided.

13. The Government or such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires, and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

14. Every purchaser shall bear the cost of Deeds, Stamp Duty, Registration and Survey Fees, and all other expenses, if any connected with the purchase of the plot.

1. Indian and Goans (or their certified agents) only shall be allowed to bid and purchase.

3. At no time during the term of the lease shall any building erected on the plot be used for residential purposes.

4. The lessee shall not at any time during the term of the lease assign or sublet any portion of a plot.

5. At no time during the term of the lease shall any plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any of the trades specified in the schedule hereto.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR RESIDENTIAL PLOTS.

1. Indians (or their certified agents) only shall be allowed to bid and purchase.
2. Each purchaser shall erect on his plot within two years of the commencement of his lease a dwelling house, of approved design to be built of stone, brick, concrete, asbestos, wood, or wood and corrugated iron.
3. At no time during the term of the lease shall more than one dwelling house, with the necessary offices and outbuildings be erected on any plot.
4. No building shall at any time during the term of the lease be used for any other purpose than a private dwelling house or occupied by any person or persons other than an Indian, or used as a place of residence for natives who are not domestic servants in the employ of the lessee.
5. The lessee shall not at any time during the term of the lease assign or sublet any portion of a plot.
6. The lessee shall not at any time during the term of the lease erect any building or buildings so as to cover more than one-half of the area of the plot.
7. The lessee shall not at any time during the term of the lease erect any building nearer than 5 feet to the boundary of the plot.
