THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS ORDINANCE, 1912.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS it is fitting that two days shall be set aside for Public rejoicing on the conclusion of Peace.

NOW THEREFORE in exercise of the powers conferred on me by the Public Holidays Ordinance, 1912, I, Edward Northey, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable

Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that Saturday the 19th day of July, 1919, and Monday the 21st day of July, 1919, shall be observed as Public Holidays throughout the Protectorate.

Given under my hand at Nairobi this 4th day of July, 1919.
