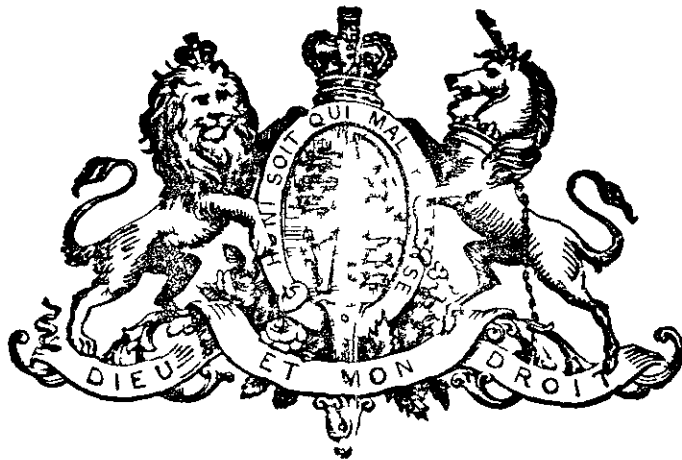

GENERAL NOTICE No 2

THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS
ORDINANCE, 1909

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Acting Governor, have made the following Bye-laws —

1 These Bye-laws may be cited as Nairobi Township (Dogs) Bye-laws, 1919, and shall be read together with Nairobi Township Rules, 1917 (hereinafter called 'The Principal Bye-laws').

2 Bye-laws 346 of the Principal Bye-laws are hereby repealed and the following Bye-laws are substituted therefor:

346 No person shall keep a dog (unless under 5 months of age) within the township unless the same shall have been registered at the Municipal Offices for the then current calendar year. Provided that a valid certificate of registration duly granted in any other township of the Protectorate shall authorize the holder thereof to keep the dog for which such certificate was granted in the township of Nairobi during the year of its currency.

347 On registering any dog the Town Clerk shall supply the person applying for registration with a metal ticket bearing the registration number of such dog. Any person owning or keeping within the township a dog which is found within the township not registered for the then current year or not carrying its registration ticket attached to its collar shall be guilty of an offence.

348 The Town Clerk may cause any dog found within the township without a collar and a registration ticket of the then current year attached thereto or any dog which he has reason to believe to be ownerless, savage or dangerous to be seized and may destroy or otherwise deal with the same as he may think fit provided that a dog which is neither diseased, savage nor dangerous shall be kept at least 7 days and its owner notified if possible.

349 A fee of Rs 5/- shall be payable to the Town Clerk for every registration under these Bye-laws.

(b) O emolumento devido, conforme a tabela respectiva, pelo acto requisitado,

(c) Uma multa de 1,450

1.º Da applicação do disposto na alinea (a) se fará menção no livro dos registos das inscrições, onde ficarão coladas estampilhas de valor correspondente a diferença paga a mais.

2.º A multa a que se refere a alinea (c) é também devida por cada um dos demais actos de protecção consular que o inscrito nas condições do presente artigo vier a solicitar no espaço de um anno.

3.º As disposições deste artigo são applicaveis aos que posteriormente voltarem a descurar o renovamento regular da sua inscrição, salvo quanto à taxa a que se refere a alinea (a) que só se cantará a partir da ultima renovação.

4.º As presentes disposições substituem, para todos os efeitos, as estabelecidas no artigo 28 do regulamento consular de 24 de Dezembro de 1903, no No. 82 da tabela dos emolumentos consulares de 17 de Março de 1904, e na alinea (c) no No. 1 do art. 1.º do decreto lei de 27 de Maio de 1911.

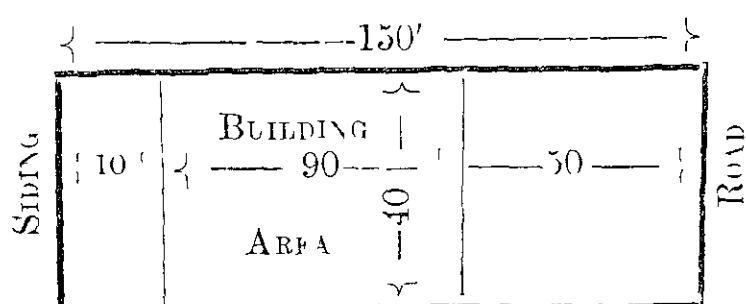
