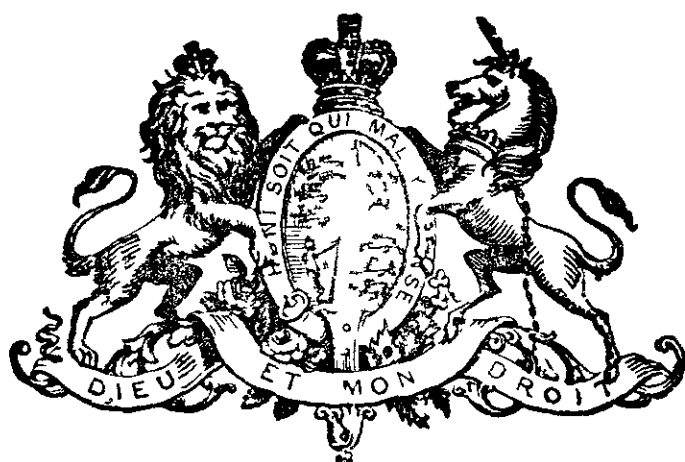

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Native Registration Ordinance, 1915, Section 22 (2), I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby declare that all these Districts more particularly described in Schedule II, annexed to the Native Registration Rules, 1919, (published on page 306 of the 'Official Gazette' for the year 1919) other than the District of Mombasa and the Districts specified in the annexed schedule of application to which the aforesaid Ordinance has already been applied shall be excluded from the operation of the aforesaid Ordinance

THE NATIVE HUT AND POLL TAX ORDINANCE, 1910

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Native Hut and Poll Tax Ordinance, 1910, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as The Collection of Taxes and Hut Counters Amendment Rules, 1920, and shall be read together with the Rules issued under the above Ordinance and dated the 25th January, 1913 (Government Notice No 19 of 1913)

2 Rule No 4 of the said Rules of the 25th January 1913, shall be amended by the addition of the following words —

It shall further be the duty of such Headman upon receiving the said notification from the District Officer, to order every native subject to his jurisdiction to appear before the Hut Counter and give him such information as he may require for the preparation of the Tax-Roll, and any native failing to obey such order shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding 30 rupees or to imprisonment of either description not exceeding one month

THE SOMALI EXEMPTION ORDINANCE,
1919
RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the Somali Exemption Ordinance, 1919, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as ‘ The Somali Exemption Rules, 1919

2 Any Somali applying for a certificate of exemption under the Somali Exemption Ordinance, 1919, shall before such certificate is granted satisfy the Chief Native Commissioner that he can speak either Arabic or English, and is able to read and write in either Arabic or English

3 No certificate of exemption shall be granted unless and until the applicant is able to satisfy the Chief Native Commissioner

(1) That he is of direct descent from a section of the Somali race the recognized original habitat of which is Asia and that his parents are of Asiatic descent

(ii) That not less than the last three generations of his family have lived in Asia

(iii) That the applicant has his permanent home in Asia

(iv) That he is a British subject or is under the protection of His Majesty Provided that in the case of an applicant who has been born and has resided in Berbera and whose father or grand-father was born in Asia and whose father and mother are Somalis of Asiatic descent such applicant shall for the purpose of these rules be deemed to be of Asiatic descent

4 The Chief Native Commissioner shall keep a register of all persons to whom a certificate of exemption has been issued in the form set out in the Schedule hereto annexed

5 A certificate of exemption shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto annexed
