THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT 1898

AND

THE POST OFFICE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1919

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Indian Post Office Act 1898 as applied to the Protectorate, and the Post Office Amendment Ordinance, 1919, and all other powers him thereunto enabling His Excellency the Acting Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as 'The Foreign Postal and Money Order Rules No 2) 1920"
- 2 All Rules heretotore made pursuant to the provisions of the said Act and Ordinance, or howsoever otherwise, relating to the issue by the Post Office of Foreign money orders expressed in rupee currency are hereby suspenfed,
- All sterling money or postal orders issued in the United Kingdom or elsewhere 3 for payment in the Protectorate, or purchased in the Protectorate for payment in the United Kingdom or elsewhere shall be cashed or purchased, as the case may be, in the Protectorate at the rate of two shillings per rupee
- The rules dated the 18th day of December, 1919, under the Indian Post Ofice Act, 1898, are hereb, reveked
 - These Rules shall come into operation on the 21st day of February, 1920
