All direct cotton colours, all union colours, all acid colours, all chrome and moidant colours, all alizatine colours, all basic colours, all sulphide colours, all vaticolours (including synthetic indigo), all oil, spirit, and wax colours, all lake colours, and any other synthetic colours, dies, stains, colour acids, colour lakes, leuco acids, leuco bases, whether in paste, powder solution or any other form
