INFECTED AREAS (EAST COAST FEVER)

IN EXERCISE of the powers thereunto enabling me I hereby declare that paragraph 4 of the Schedule attached to Proclamation No 105 of 1917 be cancelled and the following substituted therefor —

(4) That portion of the Keria Province bounded on the North and West by a line commencing at the Lorian Swamp, thence following the Uaso Nyiro River upstream to its junction with the Isiolo River, thence following the Isiolo River upstream to the North Eastern corner of Farm No 2794, thence following the Northern boundaries of Farms Nos 2794 and 2792 to the North Western corner of Farm No 2792, thence in a straight line in a Westerly direction to the Ngare Ndare, thence following the Ngare Ndare upstream to its source on the slopes of Mt Kenia, thence across Mt Kenia in a straight line to the source of the Nairobi River, thence following the Nairobi River down-stream to the North-East corner of Farm No 1236, thence following the Northern boundaries of Farms Nos 1236 and 1235 to the Northern corner of Farm No 1235, thence by the Western boundary of that Farm to the Rongai River, thence following that River down-stream to its junction with the Amboni River, thence following the Amboni River upstream to its source in the Aberdare Mountains

MEMORANDUM

In accordance with the decision of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, financial relief is to be granted to European officials of the East Africa Protectorate and the Zanzibar Protectorate, who are in receipt of pension from the funds of those Protectorates, or who receive or have received a gratuity in lieu of pension on retirement, on the following conditions —

(i) If the pension drawn from all sources does not exceed £200 per annum, a special bonus of 25% of such pension will be granted, if the pension drawn from all sources exceeds £200 per annum but does not exceed £600 per annum a special bonus of 20% of such pension, if the pension drawn from all sources exceeds £600 per annum a special bonus of 15% of such pension, provided that where the pension is paid in part from funds other than those of the East Africa Protectorate or the Zanzibar Protectorate the special bonus shall be paid for the present only in respect of those portions of pension paid from the funds of the East Africa Protectorate and the Zanzibar Protectorate

(ii) Adjustment will be made in respect of pensions which are just over £200 per annum or £600 per annum so as to provide that a pensioner in receipt of a pension just over £200 per annum or £600 per annum shall not receive with special bonus a less amount than a pensioner whose pension is £200 per annum or £600 per annum.

(iii) The special bonus is payable as from the 1st of January, 1919. The question of varying the amount of the bonus or withdrawing it will be determined by the Secretary of State as circumstances may require, but in no event will the bonus be decreased or withdrawn for a period of three years from the 1st of January, 1919

(iv) The special bonus is payable on all civil pensions of officials retired from the service of the East Africa Protectorate and the Zanzibar Protectorate, and awarded pensions from the funds of those Protectorates under the Pension Regulations in force in those Protectorates whether the pension was granted prior to the introduction of a war bonus in those Protectorates or subsequently. It is not payable on any military pensions

(v) When an official of the East Africa Protectorate or the Zanzibar Protectorate has retired from the service with a gratuity in lieu of pension, a special bonus of 25% will be paid on the gratuity awarded in accordance with the Pension Regulations of those Protectorates provided that no bonus will be paid on any gratuity awarded before the 1st of January, 1919
