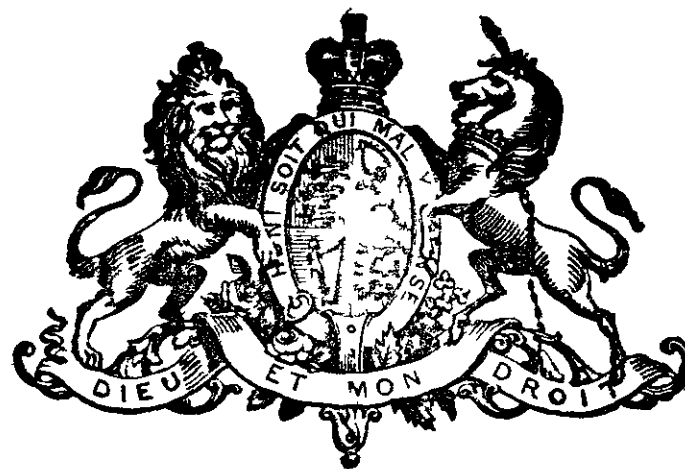

THE NATIVE REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1915

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by virtue of Government Notice No 375 of the 24th day of October, 1919, the Native Registration Ordinance, 1915, came into operation on the 1st day of November, 1919 AND WHEREAS by divers Proclamations made in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by Section 22 (2) of the said Ordinance certain districts have been from time to time declared to be excluded from the operation of the said Ordinance NOW THEREFORE I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate do hereby declare that all Proclamations excluding any districts from the operation of the aforesaid Ordinance are revoked and that the aforesaid Ordinance is in general operation throughout the Protectorate

PROCLAMATION

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 122

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon Him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as "The Mbagathi Township Rules, 1920," and shall apply to the Township of Mbagathi

2 In these Rules the words "Slaughter House" shall mean the premises set apart for the purposes of a slaughter house by the Nairobi Municipal Council and the words 'Meat Inspector' shall mean the person employed by the said Council to act as Meat Inspector or other qualified person authorised by them to act in that behalf

3 The Town Clerk of Nairobi shall have power to prescribe by public notification the hours within which animals may be slaughtered at the Slaughter House and the hours for inspection of carcasses and no animals shall be there slaughtered except within the hours so notified

4 No carcase and no portion of any carcase shall be removed from the Slaughter House, (except with the written permission of the Meat Inspector and on such conditions as he may prescribe) until a certificate has been issued by the Meat Inspector of its fitness for human consumption. Any meat inspected and found to be in the opinion of the Meat Inspector unfit for human consumption may be destroyed by him summarily and without compensation.

Provided that the hides and bones of any animal except an animal which has been condemned for Anthrax may be removed from the Slaughter House without the issuing of a certificate.

5 No person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease shall enter the Slaughter House.

6 No person shall kill any animal at the Slaughter House unless such person shall have been licensed to kill by the Town Clerk of Nairobi, who before so licensing any person shall satisfy himself of his fitness and competency as a slaughterer. Any licence so issued may be withdrawn at any time if it shall appear to the Town Clerk that the licensee shall have performed his duties otherwise than in a humane and competent manner.

7 The Town Clerk of Nairobi shall have power to sue in his own name for payment of all fees and imposition of all penalties prescribed under these Rules.

8 The fees for inspection of meat detailed in the Schedule to these Rules shall be payable in advance to the Town Clerk of Nairobi, and the Meat Inspector shall have power to refuse to certify any carcase in respect of which the prescribed fees shall not have been paid, or which has not in his opinion been slaughtered in a proper and humane manner.

THE NATIVE REGISTRATION ORDINANCE, 1915

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by the Native Registration Ordinance, 1915, His Excellency the Acting Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as 'The Native Registration (Amendment) Rules, 1920,' and shall be read as one with "The Native Registration Rules, 1919," hereinafter referred to as 'The Principal Rules,' published on page 806 and following of the "Official Gazette" for the year 1919.

2 Schedules II, and III, annexed to the Principal Rules are hereby amended as follows —

(a) Schedule II After the word "Vanga," where it first appears in the first column of the said schedule, insert the word 'Malindi'.

(b) Schedule III After the word and letters "Vanga"— V G A ,," where they appear in the first and second column of the said schedule, insert the word and letters 'Malindi'—"M L I."

3 Schedule III, of the Principal Rules shall be and is hereby amended as follows —

(a) By the addition of the group of numbers 971001 to 983000" to the group of numbers at present standing against Ukamba Province.

(b) By the deletion of the group of numbers '971001 to 983,000' at present standing against Jubaland Province.

4 In addition to the Registration Officers who may be appointed under Section 20 of the Principal Ordinance the Governor may appoint additional Registration Officers whose duties under the Ordinance shall be confined to signing Registration papers under the Ordinance aforesaid.

April 10th "Reparation Commission asks that following notice may be published at their expense in one journal in territory under your Government on 15th April begins —

DIVISION OF ENEMY TONNAGE

With reference to paragraph 20, annexe 2, part 8, of Treaty of Versailles which runs as follows —

Reparation Commission in fixing and accepting payment for specified properties or rights shall have due regard for any legal or equitable interests of Allied and Associated Powers or of Neutral Powers or of their nationals therein.

Reparation Commission hereby gives notice that it will proceed to divide ex-German ships on and after 15th June, 1920. All claims which it is desired to make in respect to any of these ships under the above quoted article should be notified through Government of claimant to Secretary, Maritime Service, of the Reparation Commission, Budgetary House, London, S W 1, not later than 15th May, 1920. Reparation Commission cannot undertake to consider any claims received after that date.

NOTICE

SALE OF LEASES IN RESPECT OF EUROPEAN
BUSINESS PLOTS, NAIROBI

NOTICE is hereby given that leases in respect of the Business Plots specified in the schedule hereto will be sold by auction at Nairobi in the Railway Institute on Thursday the 10th June, 1920, commencing at 10 a.m.

Plans of the sites may be seen at the Public Map Office, attached to the Survey Department, Nairobi, or may be had on application to the above office on payment of Rs 2/- post free

The right to withdraw any plots from the auction is reserved to Government

CONDITIONS

1 Europeans only may bid and purchase (Non British subjects will require the consent of the Governor in writing)

2 Each plot shall be auctioned separately

3 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding

4 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted

5 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 20% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused

6 The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full on the issue of the lease or may be paid by four equal annual instalments payable on the first day of January in each year, the first of such instalments to be paid on the first day of January, 1921. The purchaser shall also pay interest at the rate of 8 per centum per annum on the unpaid portion of the purchase money, such interest to be paid on the first day of July, 1920, and subsequently on the first day of January in each year. Unless each such instalment and the interest on the unpaid portion of the purchase money is paid on the date on which it falls due they shall be deemed to be added to the annual rent reserved in the lease and shall be payable and recoverable as such

7 The lease shall be for 99 years and shall commence from the 1st day of July, 1920, and the rent shall be payable from that date

8 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint

9 The Lessee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the building clearly defined and showing a system of drainage, which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and, before any building may be occupied, the Lessee shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed

10 Each Lessee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the Lessee reasonably so to connect

11 The Government or such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the Lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

12 Every purchaser shall bear the cost of deeds, stamp duty, registration and survey fees, and all other expenses if any connected with the purchase of the plot

13 Each purchaser shall erect on his plot within 3 years of the commencement of his lease a building constructed of stone, brick or concrete

14 At no time during the term of the lease shall any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of a private dwelling house

15 At no time during the term of the lease shall any plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any of the trades specified in the schedule hereto
