An Ordinance to Amend the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1909

[May 5th, 1920]

Date of Assent and Commencement

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as 'The Customs Tariff Short title Amendment Ordinance, 1920,' and shall be read as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1909, hereinafter referred to as 'the Principal Ordinance'

2 Table I of the Principal Ordinance shall be and is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor —

TABLE I

TABLE OF IMPORT DUTIES

On distilled liquois purified so as to be potable, and perfumed spirits (other than drugs and medicines imported for bona fide medical purposes) per gallon at 50 degrees of the Gay Lussac alcoholometer at a temperature of 15 degrees centigrade

Rs 15/the duty to be augmented proportionately for each degree above 50 degrees and diminished proportionately for each degree below 50 degrees

On all other goods of every description not being specially exempted in the 3rd table to the Principal Ordinance an ad valorem duty at the rate of ten per cent

Rules

IN EXERCISE of the powers conterred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as The Diseases of An mals Amendment Rules (No 1), 1920, and shall be read as one with the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Rules" and all amendments thereof

2 Rule 6 (3) of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following Rule substituted there

"(3) Cattle may be imported from the Uganda Protectorate on the following conditions and not otherwise, that is to say, if they are accompanied by a certificate from a Veterinary Officer of the Uganda Protectorate to the effect that the animals are drawn from an area free from Contagious Bovine Pleuro pneumonia, and from an area in which East Coast Fever s enzootic, and if they are branded by the Veterinary Department of the Uganda Protectorate with a distinctive bland prior to leaving that Protectorate Cattle from the Uganda Protetctorate may be imported by Lake only through Kısumu and not otherwise and the owner shall report to the District Commissioner there and apply for a permit to move the cattle to the Kipkarien Quarantine Station Kibigori, or Fort Teinan, where they will be treated similarly to cattle from the Native Reserves of the Nyanza Province in accordance with Bule All sheep and goats imported from the Uganda Protectorate shall be accompanied by a certificate from a Veterinary Office certifying that the animals are healthy and are drawn from a district free from disease and have not passed through an infected area on the way to this Protectorate


