PROCLAMATION No 52

THE EAST AFRICA AND UGANDA
(CURRENCY) ORDER, 1920

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order, 1920, which is declared to be construed as one with the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Orders, 1905 to 1918, (herein referred to as 'the Order of 1920') and which by its terms is in force in the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates, it is provided by Article 4 (1) of the Order of 1920, that if at any time while the Order of 1920 is in force any currency notes of the denomination of the standard coin, or any multiple thereof, and not being local currency notes issued under Article 14 of the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order-in-Council, 1905, (in the Order of 1920 referred to as 'new currency notes') are issued by the Currency Board, the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate and the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate may, by Proclamation made with the approval of a Secretary of State, declare that notwithstanding anything in the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order-in-Council, 1905, the new currency notes shall, while the Order of 1920 continues in operation, be current and legal tender within the East Africa

Protectorate and the Uganda Protectorate respectively for the amount expressed therein. The holder of a new currency note shall not be entitled to obtain from the Government of the East Africa Protectorate or the Uganda Protectorate, or the Currency Board, payment in current coin of the amount expressed in the note. Now therefore in exercise of the power conferred upon the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate by the Order of 1920, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, with the approval of His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, do hereby declare that the new currency notes issued by the East African Currency Board of the denomination of one rupee shall be current and legal tender for the payment of any amount within the East Africa Protectorate while the Order of 1920 continues in operation.
