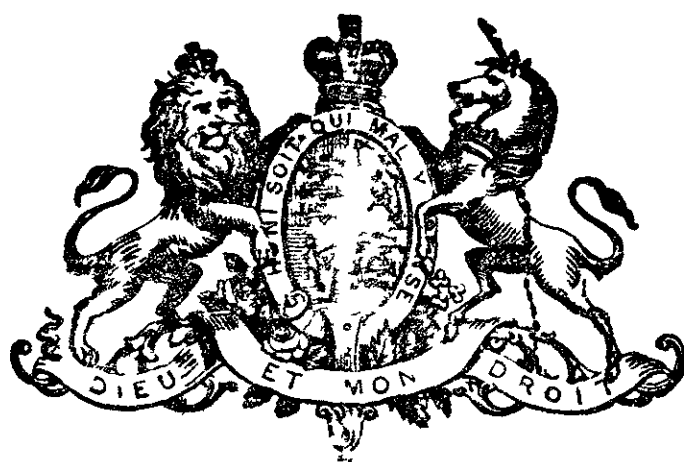

THE CUSTOMS AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1915

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1915, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby declare that Proclamation No 41, dated the 27th day of April, 1920, published on page 433 "Official Gazette" 1920, shall be amended by the deletion of the words "Gold and Silver coins of all denominations and gold and silver bullion" in Schedule (A) annexed thereto, and that the following heading be added to the said schedule —

(D) That the exportation of the following articles to all destinations other than Uganda and the Tanganyika Territory be prohibited —

Gold and silver coins of all denominations
and

Gold and silver bullion

PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Anthrax Prevention Act, 1919, it is enacted (*inter alia*) that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, make provision for preventing the importation into the United Kingdom of goods infected or likely to be infected with anthrax, and that an Order so made may declare that goods of any specified class which are of any specified origin, or are exported from any specified country or place, are goods likely to be infected with anthrax, and that any such declaration shall be conclusive for all purposes

And whereas it appears to His Majesty, and it is hereby declared, that shaving brushes manufactured in the Empire of Japan or exported therefrom are goods likely to be infected with anthrax

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on Him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows —

1 This Order may be cited as the Anthrax Prevention (Shaving Brushes) Order, 1920

2 On and after the date of this Order the importation into the United Kingdom of shaving brushes manufactured in or exported from the Empire of Japan shall be prohibited

3 This Order applies in the case of shaving brushes as aforesaid whether such shaving brushes are exported direct to the United Kingdom or otherwise

4 The provisions of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and more particularly Sections 42, 177, 186, 202 and 207 of that Act (which relate to penalties by way of forfeiture and otherwise) shall apply as respects any shaving brushes of which the importation is prohibited under this Order as though such shaving brushes were goods whereof the importation is prohibited under Section 42 of that Act

SCHEDULE I

DESCRIPTIONS OF BOUNDARIES OF SUK,
MARAKWET, ELGEYO, KAMASIA AND
NJEMPS RESERVES

(1) SUK

Commencing at the North-western corner of the Trans-Nzoia allotment on Swam River, L O No 2027, thence bounded by the North boundary of L O Nos 2027, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2022 to the most Northern corner of 2022, thence by the generally Eastern boundaries of L O Nos 2022, 2112, 2120, 2114, to the South-eastern corner of 2114, thence by the Northern boundaries of L O Nos 2129, 2131, to the North eastern corner of 2131, thence by the Western and Northern boundaries of L O Nos 2130 and 2156, to the most Northern corner of 2156, thence by a line North easternly to a point on Katupe (Chegeon) River where it intersects the Kacheliba-Manich-Marakwet track, thence by the Katupe River down stream to its junction with the Kenio River, thence by that River up stream to its junction with the Kinyach River, thence by that River up stream to a point due North of Hill 4106 thence by a line South-easternly to Hill 6170 (Kipkiruck) thence by a line to the source of Kiptoisaror River thence by that River down stream for a distance of about 2 miles, thence by a line through Hill 4041 to the Kabanon River, thence by that River down stream to its junction with the Burususva River, thence by that River up stream to its source, thence by a line South-easternly through Hill 3404 to a point on Lake Baringo thence by the generally Northern Shores of that Lake to where a Meridional line 0 40' (North) intersects its Eastern shores thence by a line in an Eastern direction through Hill 3820 to 4141 thence by a line in a generally Northern direction through Hills 4070, 4320 4291, 4263, 4241 to Ol Doinyo Lengere, thence by a line North-westernly to Mount Sillali thence by a line North-westernly to Kapeddo Post (provided that the whole of Kapeddo Post shall be included in this Reserve), thence by a line North westernly to Mugor Hill thence by a line still North westernly to Kolosia thence by the Kolosia-Ngabetok track to a water hole in Lotonok, thence by a dry River bed to its junction with the We-We River, thence by that River down stream to Namuk, thence by a line North-westernly to where it intersects the Swam River between Namuke and Karokor Hill thence by that River (Uganda Protectorate Boundary) up stream to the point of commencement

(2) MARAKWET

Commencing at the most Northern corner of L O No 2156 (Trans-Nzoia allotment), thence bounded by a line North easternly to a point on Katupe (Chegeon) River where it intersects the Kacheliba-Manich-Marakwet track, thence by the Katupe River down stream to its junction with the Kenio River thence by that River up stream to its junction with the Ndo River, thence by that River up stream to its junction with the Peinon River thence by that River up stream to its source, thence by a line Westernly to the junction of Chebyemit and Moyben Rivers thence by the Moyben River up stream to the Eastern corner of L O No 2207 thence by the generally North-eastern boundaries of L O Nos 2207 2208, 2206, 2205 2202, 2173 and 2170 to the most Northern corner of L O No 2170 thence by a line North-westernly to the Eastern corner of 2164, thence by the generally Eastern boundaries of L O Nos 2164 2163 2160, 2158 and 2156 to the point of commencement

(3) ELGEYO

Commencing at the North-eastern corner of L O No 1807, thence bounded by the Northern boundary of that L O No to the South-eastern corner of L O No 1809, thence by the Eastern and Northern boundary of L O No 1869 to the most Eastern corner of L O No 671, thence by the generally Eastern boundaries of L O Nos 671 and 110 to the South-western corner of L O No 908 (Lingham and Grogan's Forest Concession), thence by the Southern, Eastern and Northern boundaries of L O Nos 908 and 907 to the North-western corner of L O No 907, thence by the Eastern boundaries of L O Nos 902, 1561, 1559, 883 to the North eastern corner of 883 (Government Reserve), thence by the Southern boundaries of L O Nos 876, 874, 875 to the South eastern corner of 875, thence by the Eastern boundaries of L O Nos 875, 873, and 1489 to the North eastern corner of L O No 1489, thence by the Northern boundary of that L O No to Moyben River, thence by that River up stream to its junction with the Chebyemit River, thence by a line Easternly to the source of the Peinon River, thence by that River down stream to its junction with the Ndo River thence by that River up stream to where it intersects a latitudinal line 0 20' (North), thence by a line Southernly to a beacon (Kipkwahelat) and onward to the Northern boundary of L O No 503 (Lingham and Grogan's Forest Concession), thence by the Northern boundary of that concession to its North-western corner, thence by the Eastern boundary of L O No 1897 to the point of commencement

(4) KAMASIA

Commencing at the North-eastern corner of Government Forest Reserve (on Tiggen River), thence bounded by the Northern boundary of that Reserve to its North western corner, thence by the Eastern and Northern boundary of L O No 503 (Lingham and Grogan's Forest Concession) to the South eastern corner of Elgayo Reserve, thence by the Eastern boundary of Elgayo and Marakwet Reserves to Kinyach River (South western corner of Suk Reserve), thence by the generally Southern boundary of Suk Reserve, to the Western shore of Lake Baringo, thence by the Lake shores Southernly to Kampi ya Samaki, thence by a line Westernly to Hill 4913 thence by a line Southernly to Hill 3663 and onwards through Hills 3709, 4387 to a point where the Ravine Baringo Road intersects the Molo River, thence by a line Easternly to Hill 4457, thence by a line South easternly to the North-eastern corner of L O No 2689 thence by the Northern boundary of that L O No to its North-western corner, thence by the Western boundaries of L O Nos 2689, 2688, 2682 2681, 2680 to the South-western corner of 2680 thence by a line Westernly to the North eastern corner of L O No 662 thence by the generally Northern and Western boundaries of L O Nos 662, 661, 483 to the North eastern corner of L O No 488, thence by the generally Northern boundaries of L O Nos 488 494 497 to Tiggen River thence by that River up stream to the point of commencement

(5) NJEMPS

Commencing at Kampi ya Samaki on the Western shores of Lake Baringo, thence bounded Northernly, Westernly and Southernly by the Kamasia Reserve to Hill 4457, thence by a line North easternly to Monillo Hill, thence still North easternly to a point on the Mukatan River due South of Baringo, thence by a line Northernly to Hill 4141, thence by the Southern boundary of Suk Reserve to the Eastern shores of Lake Baringo, thence by that Lake on its Eastern, Southern and Western shores to the point of commencement

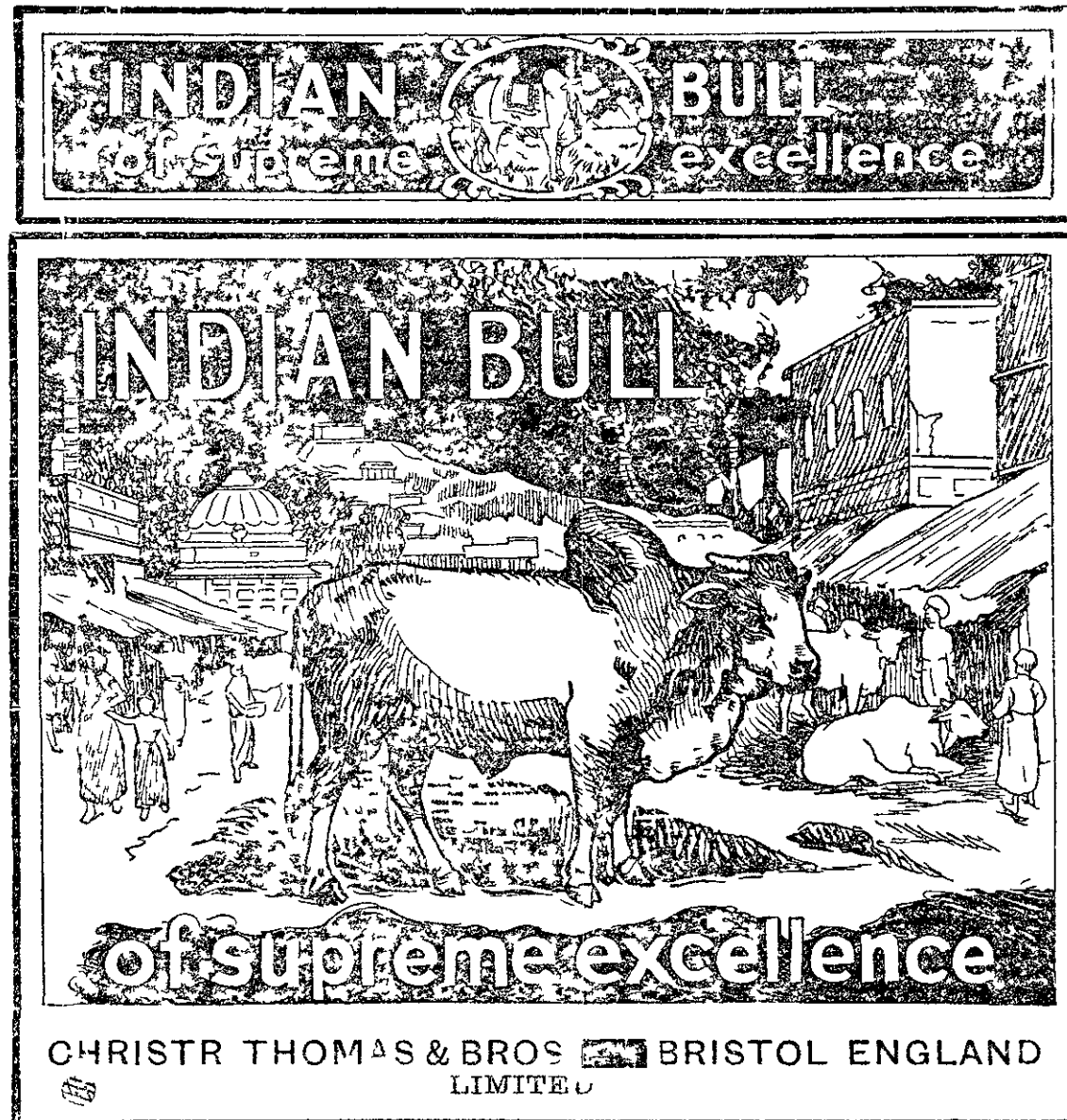

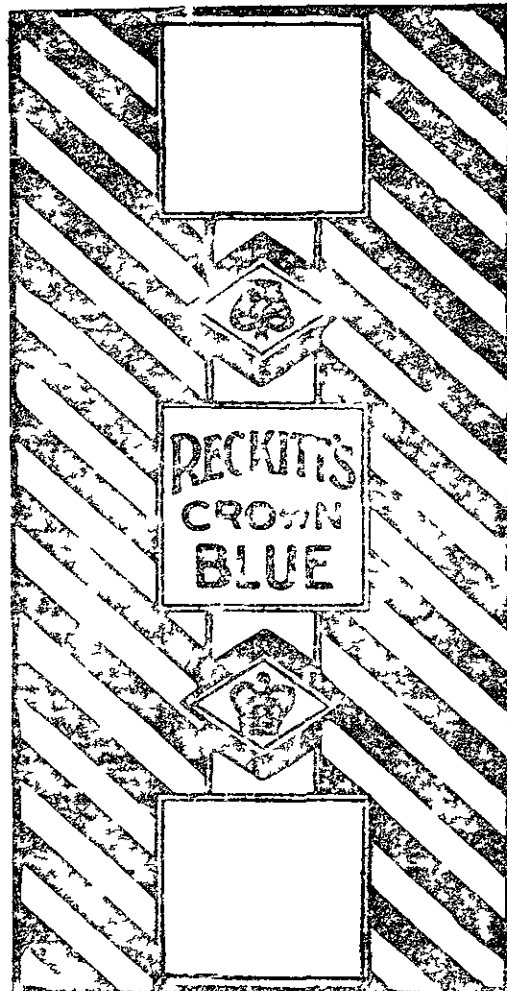

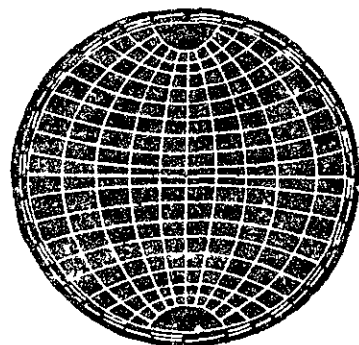
