THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, 1910

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Customs Ordinance, 1910, Section 53, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distiguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that the importation of shaving brushes manufactured in or exported from the Empire of Japan shall be prohibited

GOVERNMENT NOTICE NO 180



AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE, The 2nd day of March, 1920

Present

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY
IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates (in this Order referred to as "the Protectorates")

And whereas by paragraph (1) of Article 14 of the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order in Council, 1905 (in this Order referred to as 'the Order of 1905''), the Currency Board established by that Order were authorised to issue certain currency notes (in this Order referred to as 'local currency notes'') and by paragraph (3) of the said Article 14 it was provided that the holder of a local currency

note should be entitled to obtain on demand during office hours at the office of the Currency Board payment in current coin of the amount expressed in the note

And whereas by Ordinance No 14 of 1920 of the East Africa Protectorate and by Ordinance No 1 of 1920 of the Uganda Protectorate it was provided as respect the East Africa Protectorate and the Uganda Protectorate respectively that currency notes issued in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland under the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1914 (in this Order referred to as 'Imperial currency notes'), and notes of the Bank of England should be legal tender in the Protectorate at the rate of eight rupees fifty cents to the pound sterling

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the validity of the Ordinances aforesaid

And whereas it is expedient to remove the said doubts and to make further provision with respect to the currency of the Protectorates

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows—

- 1 This Order may be cited as the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order, 1920, and shall be constitued as one with the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Orders, 1905 to 1918
- 2 (1) The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate may by Proclamation made with the approval of a Secretary of State declare that the operation of the said paragraph (3) of Article 14 of the Order of 1905 shall as from such date as is specified in the Proclamation be suspended, and while any such Proclamation remains in force the holder of a local currency note shall not be entitled to obtain from the Government of East Africa or the Currency Board payment in current coin of the amount expressed in the note
- (2) The Governor may at any time, with the approval of a Secretary of State, revoke any Proclamation issued under the foregoing provision
- 3 Subject as hereinafter provided, the said Ordinance No 14 of 1920 of the East Africa Protectorate and the said Ordinance No 1 of 1920 of the Uganda Protectorate are hereby confirmed, and the provisions thereof shall as from the date on which those Ordinances respectively came into operation have the same force and effect as if they had been contained in an Order made by His Majesty in Council

Provided that for the purpose of the payment in the Protectorates of debts contracted in terms of supees and before the twenty first day of November nineteen hundred and nineteen imperial currency notes or notes of the Bank of England shall be legal tender at the rate of nine rupees twenty five cents to the pound sterling instead of at the rate of eight rupees fitty cents to the pound sterling

4 (1) If at any time while this Order is in force any currency notes of the denomination of the standard coin or my multiple thereof, and not being local currency notes issued under the said Article 14 of the Order of 1905 (in this Order referred to as "new currency notes"), are issued by the Currency Board, the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate and the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate may, by proclamation made with the approval of a Secretary of State, declare that notwithstanding

anything in the Order of 1905 the new currency notes shall, while this Order continues in operation, be current and legal tender within the East Africa Protectorate and the Uganda Protectorate respectively for the amount expressed therein

(2) The holder of a new currency note shall not, by reason of anything in the Proclamation or otherwise, be entitled to obtain from the Government of the East Africa Protectorate or the Government of the Uganda Protectorate or the Currency Board payment in current coin of the amount expressed in the note

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Hon Viscount Milner, GCB, GCMG, one of His Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly

Whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within East Africa and Uganda

And whereas provision has been made by the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Orders, 1905 to 1918, and the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order, 1920, with respect to the currency of East Africa and Uganda, and it is expedient to make further provision with respect thereto —

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows—

Coining of British East Africa florin

- 1 (1) A British East Africa florin shall be coined under the direction of the Master of the Mint for use in the Protectorates, of the metal, weight, and fineness pecified in the First Schedule to this Order, subject to the remedy therein specified
- (2) The British East Africa florin shall be of such design and have such impressions as may be approved by the Master of the Mint and by a Secretary of State

 Standard coin
- 2 (1) The British East Africa florin shall be the standard coin of the Protectorates
- (2) Every contract, sale, payment, will, note, instrument, and security for money, and every to assection, dealing, matter and thing whatsoever relating to money or involving the payment of or the labelity to pay, any money shall, in the absence of express

agreement to the contrary, be deemed to be made, executed, entered into, done, and had in the Protectorates according to the standard com

Subsidiary coins

- 3 (1) Subsidiary coins may from time to time be coined for the Protectorates under the direction of the Master of the Mint of the denominations, weights, and fineness specified in the Second Schedule to this Order
- (2) The subsidiary coins so coined (in this Order referred to as prescribed subsidiary coins") shall as respect each coin bear an indication of the value of the coin in cents or hundredths of a florin, and shall otherwise be of such design and have such impressions as may be approved by the Master of the Mint and by a Secretary of State

Power to authorize coining of new subsidiary coins

- 4 (1) It the Governors of the Protectorates at any time request that any subsidiary coins of less value than the florin, whether of silver, copper, bronze, nickel, or other metal or mixed metal, be coined, and the Treasury and a Secretary of State approve the request, those subsidiary coins may be coined under the direction of the Master of the Mint
- (2) The subsidiary coins so coined (in this Order referred to as 'new subsidiary coins') shall either be of the same design and have the same impressions as the prescribed subsidiary coins or shall be of such other design and have such other impressions as may be approved by the Master of the Mint and by a Secretary of State
- (3) Any new subsidiary coin may be of the same denomination as any prescribed subsidiary coin or of a different denomination
 - (4) Every new subsidiary coin shall—
 - (a) if of silver, be of the millesimal fineness of five hundred, and of a standard weight bearing the same proportion to the weight of the British East Africa florin as the denomination of the new coin bears to that florin, and

(b) if of copper, bronze, nickel, or other metal, or mixed metal, be of the standard weight specified in the Proclamation by virtue of which the coin becomes legal tender under this Order

(5) If any new subsidiary coins are coined in pursuance of this Article, and Proclamations are made by the Governors of the Protectorates setting forth in a Schedule the like particulars with respect to each of those coins as are set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order, the provisions of this Order making the prescribed subsidiary coins (together with other coins) legal tender in the Protectorates shall as from the dates fixed by the Proclamations respectively apply to the new subsidiary coins as if the Schedule to the Proclamations were added to the Second Schedule to this Order, or substituted for so much of that Schedule as is stated in the Proclamations to be rescinded

Remedy allowances for subsidiary coins

5 In the making of any prescribed subsidiary coin or new subsidiary coin, a remedy, or variation from the standard weight and in the case of silver coins from the standard fineness, required by this Order shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding that specified as respects weight and fineness respectively in the Second Schedule to this Order

Legal tender in Protectorates

6 (1) A tender of payment of money in the Protectorates, if made in any of the coins specified in the First or Second Schedules to this Order, shall, if the coins have not been illegally dealt with, and, in the case of silver coins, have not become

diminished in weight by wear or otherwise so as to be of less weight than the respective weights in that behalf specified in the Schedules to this Order as the least current weight, be a legal tender —

- (a) In the case of floring for the payment of any amount,
- (b) In the case of other silver coins, for the payment of an amount not exceeding five florins, but for no greater amount,
- (c) In the case of coins of copper, bronze, nickel or other metal or mixed metal, for the payment of an amount not exceeding one half of a florin, but for no greater amount
- (2) Each coin shall be a legal tender only tor the amount of its denomination

Provision with respect to sums due to be paid in pounds or rupees

- 7 (1) Where any sum due to be paid after the commencement of this Order is payable in pounds or pounds sterling, whether the obligation to make the payment was incurred before or after the commencement of this Order, the payment may be made in florins at the rate of ten florins to the pound or pound sterling
- (2) Where any contract entered into or instrument made before the commencement of this Order provides for the making of any payment in terms of rupers the contract or instrument shall have effect as a references to floring were substituted for references to rupees

Coin, when to be deemed to have been illegally dealt with

- 8 (1) For the purposes of this Order a coin shall be dremed to have been illegally dealt with if the coin has been impaired, diminished, or lightened, otherwise than by fair wear and tear, or has been defaced by having any name, word, device, or number stamped or engraved thereon, whether the coin has or has not been thereby diminished or lightened
- (2) Any coin which, by virtue of any Pioclamation under this Order, has ceased to be legal tender or which has been illegally dealt with, or is below the least current weight, may be called in, cut, broken, or defaced under the authority of the Governors, in accordance with such regulations as the Governors may make

Transfer of powers and duties from existing Currency
Board

9 If a Board of Commissioners of Currency is established, whether by local enactment or otherwise, for purposes in connection with the currency of the Protectorates, there shall by virtue of this Orde be transferred to and vested in that Board (hereafter referred to as the "New Board") all powers, rights duties, and obligations which at the date of the commencement of this Order are vested in or belonging to the Currency Board established for the purposes of the East Africa and Uganda (Currency Board shall, in accordance with such directions as may be given by the Governor of East Africa, transfer to the said Board all money and other assets in their hands

Provisions as to Proclamations

10 (1) Every Proclamation made by the Governors or either of them under or in pursuance of this Order shall be made with the approval of the Tree upy and a Secretary of State

(2) Proclamations shall be made by the Governors respectively so that they shall as far as may be practicable take effect on the same day in each Protectorate

Interpretation

- 11 (1) In this Order the following expressions shall have the meanings hereby assigned to them, unless the context otherwise requires, that is to say
 - "East Africa" means the East Africa Protectorate as defined in the East Africa Oidei in Council, 1902

"Uganda" means the Uganda Protectorate as defined in the Uganda Order in Council, 1902
"The Protectorate" means East Africa or Uganda as the case may require and "The

Uganda as the case may require, and "The Protectorates" means East Africa and Uganda

'The Governor' means the Governor of the Protectorate, and includes the person for the time being administering the Government of the Protectorate

"The Master of the Mint' means the Master of His Majesty's Royal Mint in England

- "Current Coin" means coin which is for the time being legal tender in the Protectorate
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament

Short title, commencement, and repeal

- 12 (1) This Order may be cited as The East Africa and Uganda (Currency) (No 2) Order, 1920
- (2) This Order shall come into operation in each Protectorate on such day as may be fixed by Proclamation by the Governors respectively
- (3) The East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Orders, 1905 to 1918, and the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order, 1920, are, subject as hereinatter provided, hereby revoked as from the date of the commencement of this Order

Provided that notwithstanding the revocation of the said Orders—

- (a) All coins (other than sovereigns) and all currency and other notes which at the said date are legal tender under the provisions of the said Orders shall remain legal tender for the amount expressed therein at the rate of one rupee for one florin and one pound for ten florins unless and until declared not to be legal tender by Proclamations made by the Governors, and
- (b) The Currency Board established by the Order of 1905 shall, subject to the provisions of this Order, continue to exercise its powers and perform its duties as if this Order had not been made

River, thence by a line Northerly to the most Southerly peak of Chyulu Range, thence by the summits of that range to Chyulu Trigonometrical Beacon thence by a line North-westerly to Trigonometrical Beacon on Emali Hill (Kemali), thence by a line North-easterly to the Southerly 1 mile zone of Uganda Railway, thence by that Railway zone Northerly to its intersection with the Southerly boundary of L O No. 1219, thence by the generally Southerly & Westerly boundary of that LO No to Kitengela River thence by that River down-stream to its junction with the Athi (Embakasi) River, thence by that River up-stream to the Easterly corner of LO No 1124, thence by the generally Southerly and Westerly boundary of LO Nos 1124, 193, 192, 196, 197, to the Athi River, thence by that River up-stream to its source, thence by a line North-westerly to the South-easterly corner of L O No 369, thence by the Southerly boundary of that LO No to its most Southerly corner, thence by a line North-westerly to the point of commencement

There shall be excluded from the above area —

- 1 All land extending for a distance of a quarter of a mile on either side of the Magadi Railway line, also Lake Magadi and all land within a quarter of a mile of that Lake
- 2 The Magadi Township at miles 26-28 on the Magadi Railway
- 3 The Townships of Naiok, Maia and Ngong and Athi River
- 4 The Nairobi Ngong load from the point where it enters the Masai Reserve to Ngong Station, at 200 feet width
- 5 The Kijabe-Mara road from the point where it enters the Masai Reserve to Mara Station, 200 feet width
 - 6 The Guaso-Nyaro Sotik road, 200 feet width
- 7 The Kish-Maia road from the point where it enters the Masar Reserve to Mara Station, at 200 feet width
 - 8 The Sotik Mara road, at 200 feet width
