THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906

Rules

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as "The Diseases of Animals (Importation of Dogs) Amendment Rules, 1920," and shall be read as one with the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918, and all amendments thereof

2 All dogs imported from Tanganyika Territory, the Union of South Africa, Swaziland, Bechuanaland or Basutoland chall be accompanied by a certificate of health from a Veterinary Surgeon

- 3 All dogs imported without the certificate required by the last preceding Rule, or from any country (except Australasia and those areas of the United Kingdom not subject to restrictions on account of rabies) other than the above-mentioned shall be subjected on arrival to 4 months' quarantine at the risk and expense of the importer. Provided that the Chief Veterinary Officer may reduce the period of quarantine if he is satisfied by a certificate from a Veterinary Surgeon, that the animals have been quarantined immediately prior to embarkation and, by a certificate from the Captain of the Ship on which the dogs arrived, that they have been strictly isolated from all dogs during the voyage
- 4 The Diseases of Animals (Importation of Dogs) Amendment Rules (No 1) 1920, and the Diseases of Animals (Importation of Dogs) Amendment Rules (No 2) 1920, published on pages 104 and 207 respectively of the "Official Gazette" for the year 1920, are hereby revoked

THE WIRELESS TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1913

LICENCE

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, 1913, I, Charles Calvert Bowning, Knight Com mander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby license and authorise George ERNEST HUGHES, Wireless Telegraph Engineer Operator in the service of the East Africa Post and Telegraph Department (hereinafter called Licensee') to conduct experiments in Wireless Telegraphy and for such purpose to import wireless telegraph apparatus and instal the same at such place as the Postmaster General shall approve subject to the conditions and restrictions following, that is to say —

- All apparatus utilized pursuant to the provisions of this licence shall be used solely for the purpose of scientific study in Wireless Telegraphy and in no case shall the Licensee instal apparatus capable of being used for the purpose of sending wheless signals, or use the receiving apparatus for the purpose of receiving either private messages or for any commercial telegraph traffic whatsoever
- 2 This licence shall remain in full force and operation for two years from the date hereot unless previously determined in manner hereinafter appearing
- 3 This licence may be determined at any time by the Governor giving to the Licensee three months notice in writing
