THE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY ORDINANCE, 1912

A Commission

WHEREAS it has been made to appear to me that there exist at the present time reasons for supposing that certain individuals firms and companies have taken advantage of abnormal economic conditions to charge consumers of goods prices yielding an unreasonable profit to the persons engaged in the production, handling or distribution of them

AND WHEREAS it appears desirable that the reasons mentioned above should be fully investigated, to the end that if it be proved that unreasonable profits are being made to the common detriment, steps may be taken to prevent the continuance thereof

NOW THEREFORE I, Charles Calvert Bowning, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Companion of the Most Disanguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do by virtue of the powers conterred upon me by the Commission of Inquiry Ordinance, 1912, by this my commission under my hand appoint —

H C E BARNES, ESQUIRE, CBE, HON'BLE K J MUIR-MACKENZIE, RIGHT HON'BLE LORD DELAMFRE, HON'BLE L C COLLINGS-WELLS, CAPFAIN H E SCHWAPTZE,

to be Commissioners

- 1 To investigate and record an opinion as to whether or not at the present time unreasonably high prices are being charged by traders and trading companies and other persons within the Protectorate
- 2 To advise what remedial legislation if any is called for

AND I do hereby direct that H C E Barnes, Esquire, CBE, be Chairman of the Commission

AND I do hereby direct that three members of whom the Chamman shall be one shall form a quorum

ELECTRIC POWER ORDINANCE, 1919

Application for Generating and Distributing Licences particularly with reference to an Electric Tramway and Omnibus Service for Mombasa Island

AS required by the above named Ordinance NOTICE is hereby given that I, Chas Udall, amiee, of Nairobi, etc., Engineer, will on the Sixteenth day of August, 1920, make application to the Governor-in-Council for a Licence to transmit, convey and distribute Electrical Energy in the Island of Mombasa by a system of overhead electric supply lines, for the purpose of operating a public service of tramways and/or omnibuses

The routes on which it is proposed to instal and erect such electric supply lines shall be determined

under the provisions of the above named Ordinance

Application will also be made to the Governor-in-Council on the said Sixteenth day of August, 1920, to authorise the construction of a Generating Station and for a Licence to Generate Electrical Energy for the purposes of the first above named Licence and for such other purposes as may be required and authorised

The land on which the Generating Station is proposed to be erected is situated on an approved site of alternatively such other suitable site as may be authorised by the Governor-in-Council

The works under these Licences shall be in accordance with the provisions of the above-named Ordinance

A provision will be contained in the drafts of the Licences being applied for that they shall be transferred to an approved Company within a prescribed record
