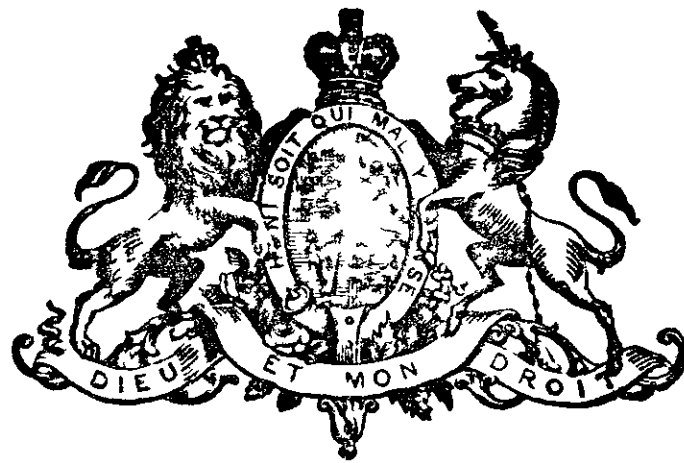

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 206

WIRELESS TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1913

LICENCE

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the Wireless Telegraphy Ordinance, 1913, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, Knight Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor and Commander in Chief of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby licence and authorise JOHN WILLIAM WILLIAMS, residing at 2nd Avenue, Pailands, Nairobi, (hereinafter called the Licensee) to conduct experiments in the transmission of pictures by Wireless and to instal apparatus necessary for effecting the same at such place as the Postmaster General shall approve subject to the conditions and restrictions following, that is to say —

1 All apparatus utilized pursuant to the provisions of this licence shall be used solely for the purpose of scientific study in Wireless Telegraphy and in no case shall the Licensee instal apparatus capable of being used for the purpose of sending wireless telegraph signals, or use the receiving apparatus for the purpose of receiving either private messages or for any commercial telegraph traffic whatsoever

2 This licence shall remain in full force and operation for two years from the date hereof unless previously determined in manner hereinafter appearing

3 This licence may be determined at any time by the Governor giving to the Licensee three months' notice in writing

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 207

AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE,

The 26th day of April, 1920

*Present*THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN
COUNCIL

WHEREAS by an Order of His Majesty in Council bearing date the Thirtieth day of May 1919 and known as the East Africa Order in Council, 1919 it was amongst other things provided that as from the coming into operation of the said Order the Seventh Article of the East Africa Order in Council, 1906, should be revoked, and the following Article should be substituted therefor, that is to say —

*Replaces 7th Article of Order
in Council of 22nd October
1906 as amended by 2nd
Article of Order in Council
of 30th May 1919*

“VII There shall be a Legislative Council in and for the Protectorate, constituted in such manner as may be directed by any Instructions under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, and as may be provided by any law for the time being in force in the Protectorate

“From and after the date of the coming into operation of this Order, the present Legislative Council shall cease to exist ”

And whereas by the said Order in Council it was further provided that that Order should be published in the “Official Gazette” of the East Africa Protectorate and should commence and come into operation on a date fixed by the Governor by Proclamation

And whereas the Governor by Proclamation dated the twenty fourth day of March 1920 has fixed the First day of April 1920 as the date on which the said Order shall commence and come into operation

*Recites Ordinance of
22nd July 1919*

And whereas on the Tenth day of July 1919 an Ordinance entitled “An Ordinance to provide for the election and nomination of members to the Legislative Council of the East Africa Protectorate” was passed by the Legislative Council of the East Africa Protectorate, and on the Twenty-second day of July 1919 was assented to by the Governor of the Protectorate and thereupon commenced and came into operation

And whereas doubts have arisen as to whether the said Ordinance is a law for the time being in force in the Protectorate within the meaning of the hereinafore recited East Africa Order in Council, 1919, and it is expedient that any such doubts should be set at rest

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows —

Short title

I This Order may be cited as “The East Africa Order in Council, 1920 ”

to be deemed to be in force
in the Protectorate within
the meaning of the East
Africa Order in Council,
1919*

II The Ordinance entitled “An Ordinance to provide for the election and nomination of members to the Legislative Council of the East Africa Protectorate,” passed by the Legislative Council of the East Africa Protectorate on the Tenth day of July, 1919, which was assented to by the Governor thereof and commenced and came into operation on the Twenty-second day of July, 1919, shall be deemed to be and at all times since its commencement to have been a law for the time being in force in the Protectorate within the meaning of the East Africa Order in Council, 1919

*Power reserved to His Majesty
to revoke, alter or amend
present Order in Council*

III His Majesty, His heirs and successors in Council may at any time revoke, alter, or amend this Order

And the Right Honourable Viscount Milner, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein

REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the British Protectorates (Defence) Order-in-Council, 1916, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations —

1 These Regulations may be cited as "The Defence Regulations (No 48), 1920" and shall be read as one with "The Defence Regulations (No 14) 1918"—Government Notice No 298—hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations

2 The Schedule annexed to the Principal Regulations and Defence Regulations (No 47) 1920 (Government Notice No 194, 1920,) respectively shall, save as regards any articles not specifically mentioned in the Schedule thereto, be and the same are hereby revoked, and the Schedule hereto substituted therefor. The maximum prices of all other articles not mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall remain as heretofore fixed until duly altered

NOTE — Passport Applications reaching Washington after June 25th, must bear a Ten Dollar stamp

Sixteenth day of August, 1920, make application to the Governor-in-Council for a Licence to transmit, convey and distribute Electrical Energy in the Island of Mombasa by a system of overhead electric supply lines, for the purpose of operating a public service of tramways and/or omnibuses

The routes on which it is proposed to instal and erect such electric supply lines shall be determined under the provisions of the above named Ordinance

Application will also be made to the Governor-in-Council on the said Sixteenth day of August, 1920, to authorise the construction of a Generating Station and for a Licence to Generate Electrical Energy for the purposes of the first above named Licence and for such other purposes as may be required and authorised

The machinery it is proposed to instal in the Generating Station will be either of the internal combustion, steam turbine or high speed reciprocating engine type driving electric generators of descriptions similar to those installed in numerous Generating Stations for public supply in Great Britain, and will be operated continuously or as may be necessary

The land on which the Generating Station is proposed to be erected is situated on an approved site or alternatively such other suitable site as may be authorised by the Governor-in-Council

The works under these Licences shall be in accordance with the provisions of the above-named Ordinance

A provision will be contained in the drafts of the Licences being applied for that they shall be transferred to an approved Company within a prescribed period

Copies of the drafts of the Licences being applied for and of the Licences when granted will be deposited at the Office in Nairobi of Messrs Allen & Hamilton and at the Office in the area of supply of A. Morrison, Esq, Solicitor, respectively

Any Authority, Company, person or body of persons desirous of making any representations on or objection to these applications or to the grant of the Licences should do so by letter addressed to the Governor-in-Council on or before the expiration of sixty days from the date of the applications being made

SALE OF LEASES IN RESPECT OF EUROPEAN
BUSINESS PLOTS, NAIROBI

NOTICE is hereby given that leases in respect of the Business Plots specified in the schedule hereto will be sold by auction at Nairobi in the Railway Institute on Thursday the 8th July, 1920, commencing at 10 a.m.

Plans of the sites may be seen at the Public Map Office, attached to the Survey Department, Nairobi, or may be had on application to the above office on payment of Rs 2/- post free

The right to withdraw any plots from the auction is reserved to Government

CONDITIONS

1 Europeans only may bid and purchase (Non-British subjects will require the consent of the Governor in writing)

2 Each plot shall be auctioned separately

3 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding

4 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted

5 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 20% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused

6 The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full on the issue of the lease or may be paid by four equal annual instalments payable on the first day of January in each year, the first of such instalments to be paid on the first day of January, 1921. The purchaser shall also pay interest at the rate of 8 per centum per annum on the unpaid portion of the purchase money, such interest to be paid on the 1st day of August, 1920, and subsequently on the first day of January in each year. Unless each such instalment and the interest on the unpaid portion of the purchase money is paid on the date on which it falls due they shall be deemed to be added to the annual rent reserved in the lease and shall be payable and recoverable as such

7 The lease shall be for 99 years and shall commence from the 1st day of August, 1920, and the rent shall be payable from that date

8 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint

9 The Lessee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the building clearly defined and showing a system of drainage, which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and, before any building may be occupied, the Lessee shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed

10 Each Lessee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the Lessee reasonably so to connect

11 The Government or such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the Lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

12 Every purchaser shall bear the cost of deeds, stamp duty, registration and survey fees, and all other expenses if any connected with the purchase of the plot

13 Each purchaser shall erect on his plot within 3 years of the commencement of his lease a building constructed of stone, brick or concrete

14 At no time during the term of the lease shall any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of a private dwelling house

15 At no time during the term of the lease shall any plot or any portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any of the trades specified in the schedule hereto

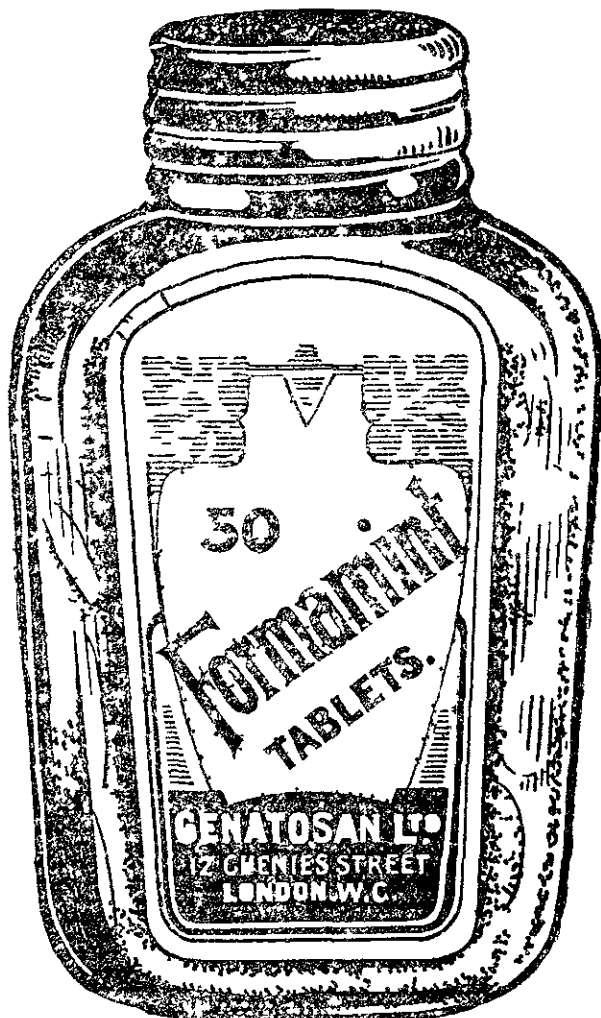
