# THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906

#### Rules

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the tollowing Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as 'The Supply of Veterinary Laboratory Products and Inoculation Rules, 1920,'' and shall be read as one with 'The Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918'
- 2 Orders for the supply of Laboratory products and payment therefor shall be effected in manner following
  - (1) If the order be communicated by letter a

money order or cheque covering the cost of the supplies shall accompany the letter

- (2) If the order be communicated by telegram the sender shall state therein how payment has been made and also the amount of such payment
- (3) Payment under the last preceding Rule may be effected in either of the following ways
  - (a) A deposit in either cash or cheque covering the cost may be made at the offices of Piovincial Commissioners District Commissioners, Assistant District Commissioners or the nearest Railway Station Master
  - (b) By money order or cheque forwarded by the first available post after despatch of the order by telegram

Provided always that the Chief Veterinary Officer may exercise his discretion as to supplying Laboratory products before payment has been made as provided by these Rules if in his opinion the health of the stock of other owners is menaced and there are good reasons why payment has not been made as hereinbefore provided

- (4) When inoculation with Laboratory products is carried out by a member of the Veterinary staff the fees must be paid in either cash notes or cheque to the officer concerned before commencing the operation
- (5) The fees payable for Laboratory products shall be as prescribed in the schedule annexed

# GOVERNMENT NOTICE NO 218 THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT, 1898

#### Rules

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Indian Post Office Act, 1898, as applied to the East Africa Protectorate and amended by the Post Office Amendment Ordinance, 1919, the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules may be cited as "The Post

Parcels Demuriage Rules, 1920

2 Post Parcels addressed to persons residing or having a place of business within three miles of any Post Office, or Post Office Agency, if not claimed and taken from such Post Office or Post Office Agency within seven days of arrival, shall be liable to a demurrage charge of ten cents for every day they remain unclaimed beyond that period. The same demurrage charge shall also apply in cases where the addressee's residence or place of business is beyond three miles of any Post Office or Post Office Agency, provided that such demurrage charge shall not accrue until a period of 21 days has elapsed from the date of arrival of the parcel

3 The Postmaster General may by any special or general instruction valve such demurrage charge in cases where he is satisfied that the delay in

claiming such parcels is unavoidable

#### ELECTRIC POWER ORDINANCE, 1919

#### Public Notice

PUBLIC Notice of an application to be made for Licences to Authorise the Generation and Supply of Electrical Energy to the Fort Hall, Thika and surrounding districts

Notice is hereby given to all whom it may concern that on the 10th day of September, 1920, in accordance with the provisions of the Electric Power Ordinance, 1919, Messis Swift, Rutherfoord & Co, Ltd of Nariobi and Punda Milia, Planters will make application to His Excellency the Governor in-Council for a Licence to Distribute or Supply Electrical Energy for public or private purposes in the areas hereafter described and for a Licence to construct Generating Stations on the Maragua and Thika Rivers and to generate Electrical Energy for the purposes of the first above mentioned Licence

The said purposes include the supplies required for industrial operations and such other supplies as may be required

The areas included under the Distribution Licence are as follows —

Area Marked No 1 on the map to be deposited, is that area lying within a circle or three miles radius, having its centre at the office of the District Commissioner, Fort Hall

Area Marked No 2 on the said map, bounded on the North by the Maragua River, on the East and South by the Thika River and on the West partly by the new Fort Hall Road, partly by the service road leading to Punda Milia, and partly by a line running from the Manager's house at Punda Milia to the Generating Station on the Maragua River, approximately one mile below the Fort Hall Road, but excluding Farms Nos 318/2 and 319/2

Area Marked No 4 on the said map to the West of the Fort Hall Road and bounded on the North by the Makindi River and on the South by the Chania River

Area Marked No 5 on the said map, bounded on the North by the Thike River, on the East by the Government Reserve, by the Athi River and by a line drawn at a radius of 15 miles from the centre of Nanobi and on the West by the Kikuyu Native Reserve

All as delineated and bordered in red on the maps to be deposited with the application

Distribution lines will be run through these areas when required subject to the provisions of the Electric Supply Line Ordinance, 1914

The Electrical Energy will be developed by means of turbines operated by the waters of the Maragua and Thika Rivers. The machinery will be operated continuously, or as may be necessary. It will be in accordance with the requirements of the Electric Power Ordinance, 1919, and of descriptions similar to those now installed at the works on the Thika Sisil Company's property.

Copies of the diaft of the Licences being applied for and of the Licences when granted will be deposited at the office of Messis John Pollok and Partners, Civil Engineer, Namedi and at the office of the Applicant in the area of supply

Powers will be asked to authorise the compulsory acquilition of land if and where necessary for the

construction of the generating stations works, as more paricularly defineated on the plans to be deposited with the application

Any authority, company, person or body of persons decreus of making any representation on, or objection to the applications or to the grant of the Licences or with respect to the proposed works should do so by letter in duplicate addressed to His Excellency the Governor in-Council on or before the expiration of 60 days from the date of application

  - 2 Each plot shall be auctioned separately
- 3 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding
- 4 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted
- 5 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 20% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 6 The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full on the issue of the lease or may be paid by four equal annual instalments payable on the first day of January in each year, the first of such instalments to be paid on the first day of January, 1921. The purchaser shall also pay interest at the rate of 8 per centum per annum on the unpaid portion of the purchase money, such interest to be paid on the 1st day of August, 1920, and subsequently on the first day of January in each year.
