GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 235

### THE TOWN PLANNING ORDINANCE, 1919

#### REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Town Planning Ordinance, 1919, Section 10, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Regulations —

- 1 These Regulations may be cited as "The Town Planning Procedure Regulations, 1920"
- 2 For the purposes of these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, "Local Authority," 'Authority' and "Responsible Authority' shall have the same meaning as in the Town Planning Ordinance, 1919
- 3 (1) At least four weeks before making an application to the Governor in Council for authority to prepare a town planning scheme the local authority shall give notice of their intention to make such application by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area of the local authority. Such advertisement shall be inserted three times at intervals of not less than a week
- (2) The local authority shall, not later than the date on which the first of the said advertisements is published, deposit at a place convenient for the purposes of inspection, a map showing by means of a clearly defined outside boundary line, the land proposed to be included in the scheme. The said map (to be marked and known as 'Map No 1'') shall be in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 22 or these Regulations, and shall be open for inspection by any person interested, without pavment of any fee, at all reasonable hours until seven days before the application is forwarded to the Governor- n Council The local authority shall also make suitable provision for affording to any person inspecting the map any necessary explanation in regard thereto
  - (3) The said advertisement shall —
  - (a) Describe in general terms the land proposed to be included in the scheme,
  - (b) State the place at which the said map is deposited and the period and times during which the same is open for inspection,
  - (c) Intimate that the local authority are prepared to consider any written objections or representations made to them whether by owners or others interested, before the date of the said application to the Governor-n-Council,
  - (d) Intimate that if any owners or others interested desire to conter with the local authority or their officers in regard to the said application, the local authority will on being so intormed be prepared to arrange for a conterence at some time within a period to be specified in the adverticement, and
  - (c) State that if and when application is made to the Governor in-Council for authority to prepare a scheme, notice of the application will be given by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area of the local authority
- 4 With the view of securing that notice of the proposal to apply for authority to prepare a scheme shall be given at the earliest stage possible to any other local authority interested in the land proposed to be included in the scheme, the local authority, independently of the the notice required to be given as aforesaid, shall, at least four weeks before making such application, serve special notice of their decision upon every other local authority interested

- 5 (1) The local authority before making an application to the Governor-in Council for authority to prepare a scheme shall consider any objections or representations made to them in writing in reference to the same, whether by owners of, or other persons interested in (a) the land proposed to be included in the scheme or (b) any lands in the neighbourhood of the said land which may be affected by the scheme
- (2) The local authority shall also consider any objections or representations made to them by any other local authority who may be interested in or affected by the scheme
- (3) The local authority shall further endeavour, by conferences between the local authority or their officers and such owners, persons, or local authorities, and by any other means available, to secure their co-operation in promoting the scheme
- 6 (1) An application to the Governor-in-Council by a local authority for authority to prepare a cheme shall be made by transmitting to the Chief Secretary a copy of the resolution of the local authority to make such application, which copy shall be certified by the Clerk
- (2) The resolution shall define, by reference to a map prepared in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 22 of these Regulations (to be marked and known as 'Map No 2') the land in reference to which it is desired to prepare the scheme, and shall state whether the land is entirely within the area of the local authority, or wholly or partly within the area of any other local authority. Map No 2 shall show clearly—
  - (a) By means of boundary lines sharply defined in colour the area of the land included in the proposed scheme, distinguishing between the parts of the land included within the area of the local authority, and within the area of any other local authority, or not within the area of any local authority,
  - (b) By means of distinctive colours and reference notes any piece of land already built upon, and piece of land not likely to be used for building purposes, any buildings elected or in course of election, and the lines of existing roads, railways tramways, sewer, and mains for water, gas and electricity
- (3) Map No 1 perpared and deposited under Regulation 3 (2) may, if the local authority think fit, be used to the purposes of Map No 2 Provided that it it is so used
  - (a) It shall be marked 'Map No 1 and Map No 2, '
  - (v) It shall not be altered in such a manner that it would cease to show the precise area or ginally shown thereon under Regulation 3, and if the area to which the application for authority to prepare a sche ne extends does not include the whole of the area so shown on Map No 1 the part excluded from the application shall be indicated on the map
  - (c) A statement shall be made and signed on the face of the map showing piecisely what part of what features of it constitute the original Map No. 1,
  - (d) The ending to the Governor in-Council of a copy of the combined Map No 1 and Map No 2 shall satisfy the requirements of these Regulations as to sending a copy of Map No 1 and a copy of Map No 2
- 7 The application to the Governor in Council shall be accompanied by the following documents, tatements and estimates, all duly certified by the

Clerk to the local authority, or other competent person, in proof of compliance with the requirements of these Regulations —

- (a) A copy of the form of notice served on local authorities,
- (b) A copy of each newspaper containing the advert sement prescribed in Regulation 3,
- (c) The maps referred to in Regulations 3 and 6, or copies thereot,
- (d) A copy of all objections made in writing in reference to the proposed scheme, so far as the objections have not been withdrawn or removed, and a statement of what has been done by the local authority, by conference or otherwise, to meet or catisfy objection,
- (e) A description of the area to be included in the scheme, including information as to the general character of the land proposed to be included in the scheme, the extent to which the scheme applies to land in course of development, the extent to which it applies to land likely to be used for building purposes, and, as regards the last mentioned land, the grounds for considering that the land is likely to be so used.
- (f) The reason on which the local authority rely in support of their application,
- (g) It the scheme includes land already built upon, or land not likely to be used for building purposes, the reasons which, in the opinion of the local authority, render it necessary or desirable to include such lands in the scheme,
- (h) Information as to the need for improved means of communication by road, rail or water in or through the area of the land to which the application extends, whether by the improvement of existing means or the construction of new means of communication as aforesaid, or for the allocation of lands for open spaces or for other special purposes,
- (1) Information as to the arrangements in operation in the area of the local authority in regard to sewerage, drainage, and sewage disposal, water supply and lighting and the like information in regard to any area included in the scheme but which is not in the area of the local authority,
- (1) Information as to objects of historical or archaeological interest or of natural heauty situate within the area included in the scheme,
- (h) Informat on as to any Government land or property hable to be affected by the scheme,
- (l) A probable estimate of the cost of preparing the scheme
- 8 When the local authority have transmitted to the Governor-in-Council an application for the approval of the Governor in Council to the preparation of a scheme, the local authority shall forthwith give notice of the date of such application, and of the date of the resolution making the application by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area of the local authority
- 9 The authority authorised by the Governor-in-Council to prepare a town planning scheme shall insert an advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area included in the scheme. The said advertisement shall—
  - (a) Contain a copy of the order by the Governor-in-Council authorising the preparation of the scheme and appointing the authority for the preparation thereof,
  - (b) Intimate that the author ty is proceeding to prepare the scheme,
  - (c) Define the date after which, under Section 12 (2) of the Town Planning Ordinance, 1919, no compensation is obtainable

- 10 (1) The authority shall, during the preparation of a scheme endeavour to secure the cooperation of the owners or other persons interested in the land included in the scheme by conference from time to time as the same shall appear necessary, and the authority or their officers may meet with the owners or others interested either singly or collectively as shall seem most expedient. Provided always that the cheme shall not be prejudiced by the failure of the authority or their officers to confer with any owner through the said owner not being known thereto, or available for conferences
- (2) Any conference as aforesaid may be convened by private notice or by public advert sement
- After the authority have fully considered and developed then proposals in regard to an area of land in respect of which they have been authorised by the Governor-in Council to prepare a town planning scheme, they shall cause to be printed a diaft scheme embodying their proposals and shall cause a map, or if the case so requires, maps, plans or drawings (to be marked and numbered consecut vely from and including "Map" or "Drawing No 3") to be prepared on the scale or scales most suitable and convenient for the purposes thereof, showing clearly by means of boundary lines sharply defined in colour the area of the land neluded in the scheme, dis tinguishing between the parts of the land included within the area of any local authority, and also showing thereon all such particulars and details in relation to the scheme as can conveniently be indicated thereon by the aid of reference letters or numbers, descriptive notes, distinguishing colours or otherwise and especially there shall be indicated and distinguished on the said map, maps, plans or diawings --

Existing roads, streets, lanes and other ways Public and private rights of way in so far as they may be khown

Ex sting railways, tramways, canals, or other means of communication

Existing public parks, gaidens or open spaces Land already built upon

Land not likely to be used for building purposes

The proposals of the author ty in connection with the matters referred to in Section 8 (1) of the Town Planning Ordinance, 1919, or any Ordinance amend ing the said section, in so tar as the same can be delineated and shown on maps, plans and drawings

- 12 (1) At least four weeks before submitting the scheme to the Governor-in-Council for approval, the authority shall serve a notice
  - (a) Upon the owners or reputed owners of the land included in the scheme, and
  - (b) Upon any local authority or Government Department within whose districts any part of the said land is comprised, or who may be interested in, or affected by, the scheme,

intimating that the authority propose to submit the scheme with any modifications that may be found desirable, to the Governor in-Council for approval

- (2) S milar notice of such proposal shall also be given by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area included in the cheme, and the advertisement shall be published at least four weeks before submitting the scheme to the Governor-in-Council
- (3) The authority shall, not later than the date on which the first of the said notices is given, deposit at such place as they may consider convenent for the purposes of inspection, and shall keep deposited thereat for at least twenty-one days from the date of the latest of the said notices, the draft

scheme and the relative maps, plans or drawings, and the same shall be open for inspection by any persons interested or affected, without payment of any fee at all reasonable hours. The authority shall also make suitable provision for affording to any person inspecting the draft scheme any necessary explanation or information in regard thereto.

- (4) The said notices shall define the land included in the scheme, and shall state the place at which the draft scheme and relative maps, plans or drawings are deposited and the period and times during which the same will be open for inspection
- (5) The notices shall further state that the authority will be prepared to consider any objections or representations which may be made to them in writing during the suid period, and the notice to be given by advertisement shall also state that the authority will be prepared to consider any objections or representations made to them in writing during such period by any persons affected, including any persons representing any architectural or archaeological societies or otherwise interested in the amenity of the proposed scheme
- (6) The notices served under paragraph (1) of this Regulation shall also refer to the meeting to be advertised and held as required by Regulation 13 (3) of these Pegulations
- 13 (1) Before applying to the Governor in Council for approval of the scheme, the authority shall consider any objections or representations made to them in writing in terms of the immediately preceding Regulation.
- (2) The Arthority shall further endeavour, by conferences between the Authority or their officers and such owners persons, local authorities or officials of Government Departments, and by any other means available, to secure their co-operation in promoting the scheme. They shall also arrange for a meeting being held at which all such parties as aforesaid shall be entitled to attend or be represented, for the purpose of considering the scheme
- (3) Seven days notice of the time and place fixed for uch meeting shall be given by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area included in the scheme. A report or minute of such meeting shall be duly kent to be afterwards submitted to the Governor-in-Council
- 14 When the Authouts have finally resolved to apply for the approval of a town planning scheme by the Governor in Council they shall pass a resolution to that effect, requesting the Governor-n-Council to approve of the scheme made by them
- 15 The application to the Governor-in-Council for approval of a scheme shall be accompanied by the following documents, maps plans or drawings all dily certified by the Clerk to the Authority or or other competent person in proof of compliance with the requirements of these Regulations
  - (a) Two certafied copies of the scheme
  - (b) Two certified copies of each of the maps, plans or drawings prepared in connection with and illustrating the scheme submitted for approval and containing the particulars required under Regulation 11 of these Regulations
  - (c) A copy of the form of notice served under Regulation 12
  - (d) A copy of each new paper containing the advertisements prescribed in Regulation 9, 12, and 13, and any other advertisements inserted by the Authority
  - (e) A copy of the resolution requesting the approval of the scheme by the Governor-in-Council

(f) A copy of the maps, plans or drawings referred to in Regulation 12 (3) of these Regulations —

Provided that if the maps, plans or drawings required by paragraph (b) of this Regulation would be identical in all respects with the maps, plans or drawings reterred to in Regulation 12 (3) or the Governor in Council consents under Regulation 23 of these Regulations, the last mentioned maps, plans or drawings may, if the Authority think fit, be used for the purposes of paragraph (b) of this Regulation, but they shall be marked to indicate that they have been so used,

(g) A small scale map showing the area included in the scheme and the main lines of communication together with any proposed lines thereof into

the adjacent and surrounding country,

- (h) A map or maps, showing the land included in the scheme so divided is to indicate as nearly as may be the portions of such land belonging to different owners. The map or maps shall show as regards each portion of the land the name of the owner, or shall bear numbers having reference to a statement on or to be annexed to or marked as relative to the map or maps, showing the names of the owners.
- (1) A copy of all objections made in writing in reference to the scheme, under Regulation 12 of these Regulations, so tar as the objections have not been withdrawn or removed in the scheme as finally made by the Authority

(1) A statement of the Authority's reasons for the reasons to meet the objections referred to in paragraph (1) herest

(h) A copy of the report or minute recording the proceedings at the meeting held in terms of

Regulatica 13,

- (1) Paticular of the Anthonty, proposals regard up the norther released to in Section 8 of the Torr Planning Ordinance 1919, or as the said section with be vised by any amending Ordinance,
- (m) Intermation as to the extent to which the Authority have made arrangements and agreements for the acquisition of land, and information as to the extent to which it may be contemplated or necessary under the cherie that land shall be acquired by (1) the Responsible Authority, (2) any Local Authority or Local Authorities, and (3) Government and as to the probability of the lands being acquired by agreement,
- (n) If the scheme contains provisions suspending any enactment contained in a public general or other Ordinance, or any statute by elaws or regulations in operation in the area included in the scheme a full explanation of any such provisions and the reasons which are considered to justify their insertion in the scheme
- 16 (1) In connection with an application to the Governor in-Council for approval of the scheme prepared by the Authority, information shall be furnished as to how the scheme may be carried into effect, together with information in regard to to the estimated cost of carring out the scheme, so far as the cost is to be borne by (1) Government, (2) the Responsible Authority, and (3) any Local Authority Separate particulars shall be given under the following heads—

Expenditure

Purchase of land for open spaces
Purchase of land for other purposes, specifying
them
Purchase of buildings
Demolishing of alteration of buildings
Compensation in respect of property injuriously
affected by the scheme
Making of alteration of roads of ways
Cost of preparing the scheme
Other purposes specifying them

Receipts

In respect of property increased in value From other sources, specifying them

- (2) There shall also be supplied a list and copy of all local Ordinances, Bye-laws, or Regulations so far as affecting the scheme, in force in the area included in the scheme
- When the Authority have submitted to the Governor-in-Council for approval, the scheme prepared by the Authority they shall forthwith give notice of such submission by advertisement in some new spaper circulating in the area included in the scheme. The notice shall also state any objections and representations by any local authority or persons affected in terms of Regulation 12 should be made in writing and addressed to the Chief Secretary at his office with none month from the date of the sud notice. A copy of each new spaper containing such advertisement shall be forwarded to the Governor in Council by the Authority
- 18 If the Governor in-Council proposes to make any modifications in, or to attach any conditions to, the scheme submitted for his approval and transmits to the authority a draft order for approving the 5 heme with such modifications and conditions—
  - (a) The Authority shall, with n fourteen days arter the receipt of the draft order give notice by advertisement in come newspaper circulating in the area included in the scheme, that the Governor in Council has caused a draft order to be prepared for approving the scheme, subject to mod fications or conditions, that a copy of the diaft order may be inspected and any information in regard thereto may be obtained, without payment of any fee at a place which shall be specified in the notice, at all reasonable hours (specifying the same) on any week day during the period of tour weeks from the date of the notice and any objections of representations in regard to such medifications and conditions should be made in viiting and addressed to the Chief Secretary at his office within a period of four weeks from the date of the advert sement
  - (b) The Authority shall furnish the Governor of Council vithin a period of four weeks from the receipt of the draft order with any objections of representations which they may desire to make in regard to the proposed modifications and conditions
  - (c) The Authority shall furnish the Governor in Council within a period to be defined by him when submitting to them any objections or representations made to him under paragraph (a) of this Regulation, with any objections or representations thereon
  - (d) The Authority shall furnsh the Governorin Council within a period of four weeks from the the receipt of the diaft order with a copy of the advertisement prescribed under paragraph (a) of this Regulation
- 19 (1) The Authority, on receipt of a copy of the order of the Governor-in-Council approving a scheme, shall without delay publish notice of the approval of the scheme by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in the area included in the The notice shall state that the scheme has been approved, with or without modifications or conditions as the case may be, and that the order of the Governor in-Council giving the approval and a copy of any map, plan or drawing referred to In the order or scheme may be inspected and any recessary explanation or information in regard thereto may be obtained without payment of any fee at a place which shall be specified in the notice at all reasonable hours (spec fying the same) on any week-day during the period of three months after

- the date of the order. They shall also, not earlier than the second day after the publication in a newspaper as aforesaid, serve upon the parties prescribed in Regulation 12 (1) (a) and (b) a copy of the order approving the scheme and a notice that a copy of any map, plan or drawing referred to in the order or scheme may be inspected, and any necessary explanation or information in regard thereto may be obtained as above mentioned
- (2) The Authority shall make suitable provision for affording any person inspecting the order or scheme or any map, plan or drawing referred to therein, within the said period, any necessary explanation or information in regard thereto
- (3) The Authority shall, within fourteen days after the receipt of the said order transmit to the Governor-in-Council
  - (a) A copy of the order served
  - (b) A copy of the form of notice served, and
  - (c) A copy of each newspaper containing the advertisement
- 20 A notice required to be served in pursuance of these Regulations shall be served
  - (a) By delivery of the same personally to the person required to be served, or if such person is absent abroad or cannot be tound, to his Agent or Attorney or
  - (b) By leaving the same at the usual or last known place of abode of such person as aforesaid, or
  - (c) By post addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of such person, or
  - (d) In the case of a not ce required to be served on a local authority or corporate body or company by delivering the same to their clerk or secretary, or leaving the same at his office with some person employed there, or by post addressed to such clerk or secretary at his office,

Provided that if the owner of any land is not known to and after diligent enquity cannot be found by the Authority, then the notice may be served by leaving it, addressed to the owner, with some occuper of the land or, if there be not an occupier, then by causing it to be put up on some conspicuous part of the land

Provided also that any accidental omission to serve a notice required under these Regulations shall not render any proceedings thereunder invalid

- Where by these Regulations any scheme communication, matter or thing has to be submitted to the Governor-in Council it shall be submitted through the Chief Secretary, who will at the earl est opportunity submit it to the Governor in-Council
- 22 (1) Unless the Governor in Council shall have spec fically approved of some other arrangement the maps required in pursuance of these Regulations shall be maps to the scale of not less than 25 344 inches to one mile, if procurable from the Survey Department. Provided always that any map showing boundaries only, or such other information as can clearly be shown on a map to a smaller scale a smaller scale map to an appropriate scale may be used.
- (2) Where maps to the scale of not less than 25 344 inches to one mile are not procurable from the Survey Department the Authority may submit their proposals on a map or maps drawn to a scale that will show clearly the said proposals and as near as possible to the said scale. Provided always that drawings to an enlarged scale may also be used
- (3) The maps, plans, or diswings submitted with the scheme to the Governor-in Council for approval shall be mounted on linen and shall have a scale properly drawn thereon

- (4) Where it may be expedient to do so maps mounted on linen may be folded in Book-form or maps may be in sections consisting of sheets of maps unmounted but bound together and prefaced by an index map to a scale of six inches to the mile or other suitable scale, showing in corrected form the area included in the scheme
- (5) Any person interested in or affected by any proposed scheme shall be entitled to make a copy of or extract from any map, plan or drawing required in pursuance of these Regulations free of charge Provided always that if they can conveniently do so, the Authority may furnish copies of or extracts from the said maps, plans or drawings upon payment of a fee to cover the costs thereof
- Where the Governor-in-Council is satisfied that there is reasonable cause for dispensing, either conditionally or unconditionally, with compliance with any requirement of these Regulations, or for varying any such requirements the Governor-in-Council may, by order or otherwise as he may think fit give the necessary dispensation or may make and give effect to the necessary variation

  - (3) The Provincial Commissioner, Kismayu, in the case of approved residents of Jubaland
  - (4) The Chief Native Commissioner, Na 10bi, in all other cases
- 3 After a permit to trade has been issued a Veterinary permit must be obtained from the nearest Veter nary or Administrative Officer to move the cattle to be traded to the Isiolo Quarantine Station and the following conditions must be observed —

- (a) The cattle to be traded must be branded AM, signifying that they have been immunised against Rinderpest by a member of the Veterinary Department
- (b) The cattle must be presented at the Veterinary Quarantine Station on the Is olo River, North Kenya, where they will be inspected by the Officer-in-charge and branded with a distinctive brand, which shall be registered in a book kept for the purpose, at a cost of cents fifty per head for branding and registration payable by the owner
- (c) No cattle moved for trading purposes into the area occupied by the Sambur natives will be permitted to leave that area
- 4 Persons desirous of moving cattle for trading purposes into the Masar Reserve must apply for a trading perm t to the Officer-in charge, Narok, must obtain a Veterinary permit from the nearest Veterinary or Administrative Officer to move the cattle to be traded to one of the Veterinary Quarantine Stations mentioned below (paragraph (b) and must observe the following conditions
  - (a) The cattle to be traded must be branded AM, and P signifying that they have been immunised against Rinderpest and Pleuro pneumonia by a member of the Veter nary Department
  - (b) The cattle, before entering the Masai Reserve, must be presented at one of the following Veterinary Stat ons where they will be inspected by the Officer in charge and branded with a distinctive brand, which shall be registered in a book kept for the purpose at a cost of cents fifty per head for branding and registration payable by the owner—(1) Nairobi, (2) Kijabe Quarantine Station, (3) Kibigori Quarantine Station
  - (c) Cattle will only be permitted to enter the Masai Reserve via Ngong Station, Kijabe Quaiantine Station or Mara Station
  - (d) No cattle moved into the Masai Reserve for trading purposes will be permitted to leave the Reserve
- 5 Rule No 27 (2) of the Principal Rules is hereby cancelled
