## THE EAST AFRICA WILD BIRDS PRO- TECTION ORDINANCE, 1903.

### PROCLAMATION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 2 of the East Africa Wild Birds Protection Ordinance, 1903, I, Edward Northey, Major-General of His Majesty's Forces, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor of the Colony of Kenya, do hereby declare that the provisions of the said Ordinance shall apply to all species of wild fowl and lake birds within an area comprising Lake Naivasha and the shores thereof to a distance of one mile from the said Lake between the 1st day of February, 1921, and the 1st day of November, 1922, and thereafter from the 1st day of February to the 31st day of October in every year.

## AGREEMENT.

THIS Agreement entered into this.....day of.....192 , Between Edward Northey, Major-General of His Majesty's Forces, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor of the Colony of Kenya, for and on behalf of the Government of the Colony of Kenya (hereinafter called "the Government") of the one part and.....(hereinafter called "the Agent") for and on behalf of..... of the other part witnesseth as follows:—

Whereas recommendations have been made by an Advisory Board for the purpose of regulating the handling of cargo at the ports of Kilindini and Mombasa and these recommendations have received the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Now therefore it is agreed between the said parties that cargo shall be handled at the said ports subject to the following terms and conditions:—

1. The Agent shall take delivery of all cargo at the ships' sides and shall be entirely responsible for delivering the same to the consignees or their agents or to the Uganda Railway Administration at their loading bank.

2. The Agent will receive at Kilindini at the Railway goods shed or on trucks or direct from local shippers and at Mombasa at the Customs sheds or direct from local shippers all cargo intended for export by his ships from the shippers or their agents and be entirely responsible for the delivery of all such cargo to the ship.

3. The Railway Administration at Kilindini and the Customs Department at Mombasa will allocate cranes, wharf, trucks and goods shed floor space to the Agent as occasion arises and will have control over the use of the said cranes, wharf, trucks and goods sheds.

4. The Agent will supply all necessary labour for the handling of goods except that crane men will be provided at Kilindini by the Railway Administration and at Mombasa by the Customs Department and will be under the control of the Railway Wharf Superintendent at Kilindini and the Customs Department at Mombasa.

5. The Agent may charge all dues for rent or storage of goods in the sheds provided that such dues shall not exceed those now in force or which may come into force under the Customs Ordinance, 1910. The time allowance for free storage must not be less than that now in force without the sanction of the Government.

6. The Agent will deliver free from the landing stage to the Customs House or Baggage Room and *vice versa* all passengers' baggage. No wharfage or crantage shall be charged for passengers' baggage so delivered.

7. The Agent will pay to the Railway Administration the cost of electric or other light used by them. The Wharf Superintendent shall be sole judge as to the allocation of the charges between the various agents.

8. (a) The Agent will pay to the Railway Administration at Kilindini or to the Customs Department at Mombasa the sum of one florin and twenty cents for each Bill of Lading ton passed over the wharf whether exported or imported or from lighter to lighter by means of cranes with the following exceptions:—

Vehicles under 5 tons Fls. 2 each.

All lifts 5 tons and over including vehicles Fl. 1 per Bill of Lading ton.

Camels, horses, mules, Fl. 1 per head.

Cattle and donkeys, Fl. -/75 per head.

Domestic and wild animals in crates, Fl. 1 per 40 cubic feet.

Any cargo which is not handled by means of crane will be charged one-third of the above sums.

The Agent will supply labour for the working of the hand crane.

(b) The above charges are to be subject to modification and amendment from time to time by mutual arrangement between the Railway Administration at Kilindini or the Customs Department at Mombasa and the Agent.

(c) The Agent shall make payment within fourteen days after each ship has been cleared.

9. The Agent will supply their own barrows and samson trucks.

10. The Agent will supply their own slings and lifting tackle.

11. The Agent shall state what the maximum lighterage and landing charges will be, and such charges or any alteration of such charges shall not be valid until approved by the Governor-in-Council.

12. In the case of a ship arriving with incomplete documents the tonnage of cargo not shown on the ship's manifest will be estimated by the Railway Wharf Superintendent at Kilindini or by the Chief of Customs at Mombasa, and on receipt of the complete documents any adjustment found to be necessary will be made. No adjustment will be made unless a claim is lodged within six months of the arrival of the goods.

13. The Railway Administration and the Customs Department shall have free access to all books, documents or accounts kept by the Agent relating to the import or export of cargo.

14. The Agent shall make good any damage to cranes resulting from overloading, provided that the crane gear has been properly maintained, and shall make good any damage to buildings resulting from bad stacking and handling. The Agent shall not be liable to make good any damage to cranes or buildings due to fair wear and tear.

15. Cargo which is the property of the Government of the Colony may be excluded by the Government from the operation of this Agreement.

16. The Agent shall hand over to the Customs at the shed door or loading bank at the expiry of twenty-one days after the importation all goods remaining uncleared within that period, and the Customs shall be responsible for payment to the Agent of the removal charges, which they will collect from the consignees.

17. The Railway Administration will indemnify the Agent for any loss or damage due to the negligence of the employees of the Railway Administration or due to structural defects of the sheds, wharves, cranes or rolling stock.

18. This agreement may be terminated by either party upon his giving to the other party six months' notice in writing of his intention so to do.

(ii) Within the subsequent five years a  
further quarter of the total area leased to be put  
under cultivation and so maintained.

(iii) Within a further period of five years  
a further quarter to be put under cultivation and  
so maintained, and thus  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the total area leased  
must be put under permanent cultivation within  
sixteen years from the date of the lease.

The public are particularly warned that they  
should not make applications unless they are in  
each case satisfied that taking into account local  
difficulties as regards labour, etc., they will be in a  
position to fulfil the conditions under which such  
leases would be granted.

So far as possible an applicant should apply for a  
definite area of land in a definite locality, and should  
enclose a rough sketch in his application.
