THE VAGRANCY ORDINANCE, 1920.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Vagrancy Ordinance, 1920, it is provided that the aforesaid Ordinance may by order of the Governor-in-Council be applied to any area in the East Africa Protectorate.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient that the aforesaid Odinance shall apply to and have effect in the whole of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

NOW THEREFORE I, Edward Northey, Major General of His Majesty's Forces, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor of the Colony of Kenya, do hereby order and proclaim that the aforesaid Ordinance shall apply to and have effect in the whole of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

 - (a) Delete the words "Inoculation against Pleuro-pneumonia, 50 cents per head."
 - (b) Delete the words "Pleuro-pneumonia virus 50 cents per dose."

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Diseases of Animals (Scale of Fees) Amendment Rules (No. 3), 1921," and shall be read as one with "The Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918," and with "The Supply of Veterinary Laboratory Products and Inoculation Rules, 1920."
- 2. The Scale of Fees in Schedule A to the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918, and the Schedule to the Supply of Veterinary Laboratory Products and Inoculation Rules, 1920, shall be and are hereby amended by the deletion of the words "Blue Tongue Vaccine—20 doses—Fl. 1/-" in line 11 of the said Schedule A. to the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918, and the substitution of the words "Blue Tongue Vaccine—10 doses—Fl. 1/-" therefor and the deletion of the words "Blue Tongue Vaccine 1 rupee per 20 doses" in line 18 of the said schedule to the Supply of Veterinary Laboratory Products and Inoculation Rules, 1920, and the substitution of the words "Blue Tongue Vaccine—1. Florin per 10 doses" therefor.

THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT, 1898,

AND

THE POST OFFICE AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1919.

Rules.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor-in-Council by the Indian Post Office Act, 1898, as applied to the Colony and Protectorate, and the Post Office Amendment Ordinance, 1919, and all other Powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor-in-Council has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Foreign Money Order and Postal Order Rules (No. 3), 1921."
- 2. The total value of Foreign Money Orders issued during any one week:—
 - (a) To any one Remitter,

or

(b) In favour of any one payee

shall not exceed Six Hundred Florins; provided that the Postmaster-General may at his discretion allow the issue of Orders exceeding these limits in any case where he is satisfied that the transaction is one which would normally be conducted through the Money Order Service.

THE VAGRANCY ORDINANCE, 1920.

REGULATIONS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by Section 5 of the Vagrancy Ordinance, 1920, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Vagrancy Ordinance Regulations, 1921."
- 2. (1) Male and female vagrants shall be detained in separate buildings, or separate parts of the same building, in such manner as to prevent their seeing or conversing or holding any intercourse with each other.
- (2) European and Non-European vagrants shall, when possible, be detained in separate buildings or in separate parts of the same building.
- 3. Vagrants when confined in a prison, shall be kept apart from prisoners as far as possible.
- 4. The cells or wards where a number of vagrants are confined shall be lighted at night, and be under the constant supervision of the prison officers.
- 5. No male prison officer shall enter or remain in a cell in which female vagrants are confined unless accompanied by a matron or wardress.
- 6. Vagrants may wear their own clothing but where such is unfit for use they shall be supplied by the Superintendent with such clothing as may be considered necessary, which must be of a different pattern to that worn by prisoners. Bedding according to the scale issued to prisoners will also be supplied.
- 7. European vagrants who have been placed on reduced diet shall receive daily one gallon of water and one pound of flour, and shall be visited daily by Prison Medical Officer.
- 8. Non-European and Native vagrants who have been placed on reduced diet shall receive penal diet as prescribed for Non-European and Native prisoners by a notice made under the Prisons Ordinance, 1914, and dated 24th January, 1918.

Census 1921.

PUBLIC attention is invited to an Ordinance recently passed in the Legislative Council, which has been assented to by His Excellency the Governor and published in the Official Gazette of 23rd February, 1921, to provide for the taking of a Census of the non-native population of Kenya as on the 24th April, 1921.

A printed form of Householder's Schedule will be left with every householder a day or two previous to the Census day, and it will be his duty to enter thereon the necessary particulars in respect of every person other than a native who actually passes the night of Sunday, the 24th April, 1921, in his house. This form will be called for on the following Monday or as soon thereafter as may be practicable.

Any person who refuses or neglects to fill up the schedule, or who supplies any false information, renders himself liable to prosecution and to a fine of £5.

The contents of the schedules will be treated as confidential, and any person employed on the Census who communicates without lawful authority any information acquired by him in the course of his employment will be liable to a fine of £100 and to 3 months' imprisonment.

NOTICE.

CONTAGIOUS BOVINE PLEURO-PNEU-MONIA.

IT is hereby notified that, as it has been decided that the system of compulsory slaughter of cattle infected or suspected of being infected with Contagious Bovine Pleuro-Pneumonia and of paying compensation for same shall, except in special cases, be discontinued, and, as it is considered advisable to encourage stock owners to immunize their cattle against the disease, the Government has agreed to issue pleuro-pneumonia vaccine free of charge.

As the supply of vaccine is limited to some extent priority will be given to applications for vaccine from those whose cattle are considered by the Veterinary Division to be in most danger of contracting the disease.

All applications for vaccine should be addressed to the Chief Veterinary Officer, P.O. Box No. 323, Nairobi, and full instructions as to its use will be issued with the vaccine.

As far as circumstances allow Veterinary Officers and Stock Inspectors will assist stock owners in demonstrating how the inoculation should be carried out.

Cattle which have been inoculated by owners and not under the supervision of a member of the Veterinary Division will not be entitled to any distinguishing mark denoting immunity.

The attention of stock owners is drawn to the fact that contagious bovine pleuro-pneumonia is a notifiable disease under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, Section 3.

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE, 1915.

THE Leases of the farms specified in the Schedule hereto, will, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, be offered for sale at the Railway Institute, Nairobi, commencing at 10 a.m. on Monday the 6th June, 1921. Plans of the farms may be seen at the Public Map Office, Land Department, Nairobi, and at the office of the Resident Commissioner of the district in which any particular farm mentioned in the Schedule is situated, or may be had on application to the Land Department on payment of Fls. 2, post free in respect of each plan required.

The right to withdraw any farm from the auction is reserved to Government.

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. Each farm shall be auctioned separately.
- 2. European British subjects (or their accredited agents) will be permitted to bid and purchase. Non-British subjects will require the consent in writing of His Excellency the Governor.
- 3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the farm shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding.
- 4. The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.

- 5. Each purceaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 6. The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full to the Land Officer on or before the 1st July, 1921, or may be paid in nine equal annual instalments payable on the 1st January in each year, the first instalment being payable on the 1st January, 1922, and the purchaser shall inform the Land Officer on or before the 1st July, 1921, which method of payment he desires to adopt.
- 7. If the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money by instalments no assignment of the land leased or any part thereof shall be valid until the whole of the balance of the purchase money shall have been paid.
- 8. The rent due to the 31st day of December, 1921, the Survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty payable in respect of the lease and, if the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money in full, the balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi, on or before the 1st July, 1921, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of sale have been complied with, be entitled to a lease of the farm, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be.
- 9. If the payments mentioned in Condition No. 8 are not made on or before the 1st July, 1921, the Land Officer may order that the deposit paid by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the farm.
- 10. The lease shall be for 999 years and shall commence from the 1st day of July, 1921, and the rent shall be payable from that date.

GENERAL NOTICE No. 19.

TENDERS.

TENDERS are invited under the following conditions for the purchase of the Lease of an area of 4 acres or thereabouts, situate on Mombasa Island for the purpose of the erection of an Hotel.

- 1. The Lease shall be for a term of 99 years and shall commence from the 1st day of April, 1921, and the rent shall be payable from that date.
- The rent shall be £120 per annum payable at the Land Office, Mombasa.
- 3. 25% of the purchase price shall be paid forthwith by the successful tenderer, and the balance of the purchase price, together with the rent due to December 31st, 1921. Survey fees, and the fees payable for the preparation, registration of the Lease, and stamp duty, payable in respect of the Lease shall be paid on the presentation of the Lease to the purchaser duly executed.
- 4. The premises to be used for the erection of an Hotel only and for no other purpose whatsoever.
- 5. The purchaser to covenant to expend the sum of not less than £50,000 upon the buildings, such buildings to be built of stone, brick or concrete.
- 6. The purchaser shall complete such buildings as a going concern within three years of the date of the Lease.
- 7. No building shall be erected on the plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint.
- 8. The purchaser shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot, and before any building may be occupied, the purchaser shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed.
- 9. The purchaser shall suitably connect his premises with any Town Drainage System, when, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the purchaser reasonably so to connect.
- 10. The purchaser shall be responsible for half the cost of the road pro rata to the road frontage.
- 11. No sub-division of the plot will at any time be allowed.
- 12. The purchaser shall, within one year of the commencement of the Lease, completely enclose the plot with a fence of suitable design and in conformity with the Township Regulations.
- 13. All outbuildings, offices, etc., shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint and shall be kept so screened during the term of the Lease.

14. No building may approach within a less distance than 10 feet of the boundary of the plot, and at least one-half of the plot must remain

unbuilt upon.

- 15.
