Present.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Treaty of Peace Act, 1919, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Treaty of Peace Order, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order").

And whereas the principal order was amended by the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920:

And whereas it is expedient that the Principal Order as so amended should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The provisions of the Principal Order, 1919, as amended by the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, set out in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall be amended in the manner shown in the second column of that schedule.
- 2. Paragraph (vi) of Article one of the Principal Order shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if the words "or any other person" were therein inserted after the word "creditor."
- 3. Paragraph (xvii) of Article one of the Principal Order shall have effect and shall be deemed always to have had effect as if at the end thereof the following sub-paragraph were added—
 - "(f) The Custodian shall have power to charge such fees in respect of his duties under this paragraph, whether by way of percentage or otherwise, as the Treasury may fix, and the fees shall be collected and accounted for by such persons in such manner and shall be paid to such account as the Treasury direct, and the incidence of the fees as between capital and income shall be determined by the Custodian."
- 4. This Order may be cited as the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1920, and the Principal Order, the Treaty of Peace (Amendment) Order, 1920, and this Order may be cited together as the Treaty of Peace Orders, 1919 to 1920.

Nature of Amendment.

- 1 (iv) After the words "found due," there shall be inserted the words "together with such interest as aforesaid."
- 1 (xiva) For the words "Board of Trade" there shall be substituted the words "Clearing Office."
- I (xvii) At the end of sub-paragraph (c) there shall be added the words "and to "require any person having in his "possession any documents of title to "any such stock, shares or other "securities to deliver the same to him, "and an acknowledgment signed by "him of such delivery to him, shall be "a sufficient discharge to the person "delivering the same."

Article.

Nature of Amendment.

After sub-paragraph (cc) the following sub-paragraphs shall be inserted—

'(ccc) Where the property, right or 'interest subject to the charge, con'sists of any sum of money due to a 'German national (not being an enemy 'debt within the meaning of Article '296 of the Treaty), it shall be payable 'to the Custodian, and shall be paid 'to him on demand, and the Custodian 'shall have power to enforce the pay'ment thereof, and for that purpose 'shall have all such rights and powers 'as if he were the creditor.

(cccc) A certificate by the Custodian that any property, right or interest is "subject to the charge shall be suffi-"cient evidence of the facts stated "in the certificate, and where any such application, requirement or demand "of the Custodian as aforesaid is accompanied by such a certificate the "company, municipal authority "other body by whom the securities "were issued or are managed, the "person in possession of the property "transferable by delivery, or the person "by whom a sum of money is due shall comply with the application, "requirement or demand, and shall not "be liable to any action or other legal "proceeding in respect of such com-"pliance, but if it is subsequently "proved that the property, right or interest was not subject to the charge. "the owner thereof shall be entitled "to recover the same from the "Custodian or if it has been sold the "proceeds of sale but not to any other "remedy."

1 (xviii) For the words "ten months" there shall be substituted the words "sixteen months."

- 3. It is requested that Settlers residing in the district to the North of Mount Kenia who desire to make use of he Ndare Post Office will arrange with their correspondents for their letters, etc., to be so addressed. In the case of mail matter from oversea, it will suffice if, in addition to the name, etc., of the addressee, it bears the indication "Ndare, Kenya Colony."
- 4. Mails will be despatched from Nairobi twice weekly, i.e., on Wednesdays and Saturdays; and there will be a service of similar frequency in the opposite direction.

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE, 1915.

THE Leases of the farms specified in the Schedule hereto, will, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, be offered for sale at the Railway Institute, Nairobi, commencing at 10 a.m. on Monday the 6th June, 1921. Plans of the farms may be seen at the Public Map Office, Land Department, Nairobi, and at the office of the Resident Commissioner of the district in which any particular farm mentioned in the Schedule is situated, or may be had on application to the Land Department on payment of Fls. 2, post free in respect of each plan required.

The right to withdraw any farm from the auction is reserved to Government.

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- 1. Each farm shall be auctioned separately.
- 2. European British subjects (or their accredited agents) will be permitted to bid and purchase. Non-British subjects will require the consent in writing of His Excellency the Governor.
- 3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the farm shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding.
- 4. The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 5. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer, immediately on the fall of the hammer, a deposit of 10% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

- 6. The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full to the Land Officer on or before the 1st July, 1921, or may be paid in nine equal annual instalments payable on the 1st January in each year, the first instalment being payable on the 1st January, 1922, and the purchaser shall inform the Land Officer on or before the 1st July, 1921, which method of payment he desires to adopt.
- 7. If the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money by instalments no assignment of the land leased or any part thereof shall be valid until the whole of the balance of the purchase money shall have been paid.
- 8. The rent due to the 31st day of December, 1921, the Survey fees and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty payable in respect of the lease and, if the purchaser shall have elected to pay the balance of the purchase money in full, the balance of the purchase money shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office, Nairobi, on or before the 1st July, 1921, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall, subject to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, and if the conditions of sale have been complied with, be entitled to a lease of the farm, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be.
- 9. If the payments mentioned in Condition No. 8 are not made on or before the 1st July, 1921, the Land Officer may order that the deposit paid by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the farm.
- 10. The lease shall be for 999 years and shall commence from the 1st day of July, 1921, and the rent shall be payable from that date.
