GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 156.

The following Bill is published for general information and criticism:-

A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to provide for the Organisation of the European Inhabitants of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya for \mathbf{the} Defence Thereof.

WHEREAS it is expedient to make provision for enrolling and organising the able-bodied European inhabitants of this Colony and Protectorate for the defence thereof and the protection of life and property therein.

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PART I.

CONSTITUTION AND ORGANISATION OF A DEFENCE FORCE.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Defence Force Short title. (Colony and Protectorate of Kenya) Ordinance, 1921," and shall come into force on such date as the Governor by proclamation 10 published in the "Official Gazette" shall determine.

2. (1) The Governor shall for the purposes of this Ordinance appoint a Central Defence Committee of which the Colonial Secretary to the Government or such other officer as the Governor may appoint, shall be President. Such Committee shall consist of as many members as the Governor may direct.

(2) The Governor may at any time dispense with the services of any member of the Central Defence Committee.

3. (1) The District or Resident Commissioner of every District District Commissioners throughout the Colony and Protectorate shall in the month of Janton and Protectorate shall be protected by the protect of the protector and protected shall be protected by the protect of the protec uary next following the date on which this Ordinance shall come into force, and in the month of January in every succeeding year, make out a list containing the names of all male European residents in their districts respectively between the ages of 16 and 60 years (both inclusive) who are not exempted from liability to serve under this Ordinance and in such list shall state the age, residence and calling, nationality of each person, which list shall be, as nearly as may be, in the form in Part I, of Schedule I, to this Ordinance, and the said District or Resident Commissioners shall, as soon as such lists are made out, transmit the same to the Senior Commissioner of the Province in which such Districts are situate respectively. (2) Every Senior seceipt of such list cause a copy thereof to be affixed in a conspicuous manner at the office of the Senier Commissioner and conspicuous manner at his office and aforesaid, and to be inserted in at least one newspaper, of the day on which and the place at which he will hold a Court for the purpose of hearing objections to such list, which day shall not be sooner than two weeks nor later than four weeks (unless for special reason) after the day of affixing the aforesaid copy at his office as aforesaid.

(3) Upon the day and at the place so notified as aforesaid the Senier Commissioner shall hold a Court at which he shall on due proof by the oath of such persons as he shall see fit to examine or by declaration or affidavit, correct all errors in such list, either by adding the names of persons liable to service which may have been omitted therein or by striking out from the list of those so liable the names of any persons entitled to be exempt. Provided always that such Court may be adjourned from day to day until all questions as to the correctness of the list are determined, and provided further that the decision of the Senior Commissioner shall be final.

(4) After the determination of all questions arising in regard to the correctness of such lists at such Court as aforesaid, the Senior Commissioner shall forthwith transmit such corrected lists to the Staff Officer of the Defence Force, Nairobi.

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Enrolment of all male European residents between the ages of 16 and 60 in the Defence Force.

4. Subject to the proviso to this section, and to all the other provisions of this Ordinance or of any Rules issued thereunder, every male person of European origin or descent between the ages of 16 years and 60 years (both inclusive) and now resident or hereafter residing in the Colony and Protectorate shall within one month after the date this Ordinance shall come into force or within one month of becoming so resident as aforesaid as the case may be enroll himself, and in default of enrolling himself within such month as aforesaid shall be deemed to be enrolled in the Defence Force of the Colony and Protectorate which shall be under the supreme command of the Governor and shall be liable to render general military service in any part of East Africa within or without the Colony and Protectorate for the defence thereof or any part thereof or for the protection of life and property therein or in any part thereof. Provided always that Ministers of any recognised denomination and members of the Medical and Veterinary professions shall only be enrolled or deemed to be enrolled and liable to serve in their professional capacity.

5. Every member enrolled or deemed to be enrolled in the Defence Force of the Colony and Protectorate as hereinbefore provided shall take an oath in the form applicable to his case prescribed in Part II, of Schedule I, to this Ordinance.

Exemptions from enrolment in the Defence Force.

6. (1) All persons certified by a certificate of a Government Medical Officer to be medically unfit for service under the provisions of this Ordinance by reason of bodily or mental infirmity or unfitness, the members for the time being of the Legislative Council of the Colony and Protectorate, Judges, members of the Police Force, persons serving with the King's African Rifles and all merchant seamen under articles shall be exempt from enrolment and service in the Defence Force under this Ordinance except with their own consent.

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(2) Provided always that the Governor may in his absolute and uncontrolled discretion by order under his hand exempt any person serving in the Civil Service of the Colony and Protectorate from enrolment and/or service in the Defence Force under this Ordinance.

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Defence Force Districts.

7. For the purposes of this Ordinance the boundaries and extent of the Defence Force Districts are those gazetted as the Administrative Districts of the Colony and Protectorate. Provided always that two or more Administrative Districts may be grouped together to form one Defence Force District.

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(2) Each of the aforesaid Defence Force Districts shall, in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance and of any Rules issued thereunder, be organized as far as possible so as to constitute units complete for service in the field including Supply Transport, Medical and Veterinary services and shall as aforesaid hold its own stock of reserve arms and ammunition and shall have its own first and second line Transport allocated to it.

Appointment of a District Commandant and Local Defence Committee. 8. (1) For the purposes of each Defence Force District there shall be a District Commandant and such Section Commanders as may be necessary resident and stationed in such Defence Force District and whose rights powers and duties shall include those given, granted or imposed by this Ordinance or by any Rules issued thereunder;

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(2) For the purposes of each Defence Force District there shall also be a Local Defence Committee which shall consist of the District Commandant, the District or Resident Commissioner or District or Resident Commissioners of any areas included in the 5 Defence Force District and such other persons as the Governor may appoint.

The rights, powers and duties of such Local Defence Committee shall include those given, granted and imposed by this Ordinance or by any Rules issued thereunder.

- 10 (3) The Governor may dispense with the services of any member of a Local Defence Committee appointed by him.
- 9. (1) Each Local Defence Committee shall draw up a scheme of Defence for its District, including the selection of rallying points, the establishment of Defensive Posts and the arrangement 15 of a system for the collection and use of available supplies and transport during such period as the Defence Force or any portion thereof shall be called out on active service.

(2) Each Local Defence Committee shall also collect such topographical and other intelligence as they may consider neces-20 sary or expedient.

Any such topographical information shall be inserted in the existing maps of the Defence Force District so that the same shall at all times be kept up to date.

- (3) The Local Defence Committee shall at all times and 25 from time to time send duplicate reports on all or any of the foregoing matters to the Staff Officer, Kenya Defence Force,
- On the mobilization of the whole or any part or parts Liability of members to provide transport. of the Defence Force of the District for service, every member of 30 the Defence Force (whether he shall or shall not himself be called out for service) shall be liable to provide any Transport in his possession if required.

Duties of Local Defence

Committee.

11. (1) The Headquarters of the Defence Force shall be at Nairobi.

Organization of

- (2) The Defence Force shall be under the supreme command of the Governor who may, for all or any of the purposes of this Ordinance, delegate all or any of his functions, powers and duties as such, to such person or persons as he may deem expedient.
- (3) For the purposes of the Defence Force there shall be a 40 permanent staff which shall consist of a Staff Officer and such other ranks as the Governor may from time to time appoint.
 - 12. (1) The Governor may form a mounted branch of the Defence Force in any District.

Formation of Mounted Units.

- (2) Every member selected for service in the mounted branch and who elects to serve therein shall provide his own horse or mule together with saddle and bridle.
- (3) Every mounted member of the Defence Force whose own horse or mule while on active service shall be killed or carried off by or be abandoned to the enemy or be destroyed to prevent the same falling into the hands of the enemy or without any negligence or other misconduct on the part of the owner shall die of injuries or sickness recurring or contracted while on active service or without any such negligence or misconduct as aforesaid the destruction of which shall be necessitated owing to such injuries or sickness occurring or contracted as aforesaid or 55 who shall while on active service suffer loss by enemy action of his own saddle or bridle, this and in every such case the owner shall be paid by the Government the value of the same, such value to be certified by the Commandant of the force to which such mounted member belongs: 60

Provided always that such value in the case of a horse shall not exceed £30; in the case of a mule £20; in the case of a saddle Fls. 40; in the case of a bridle Fls. 15.

13. Every member of the Defence Force called out on active service under the provisions of this Ordinance shall receive rations or ration allowance and pay on such scale as the Governor may from time to time prescribe.

Any member of the Defence Force totally or partially disabled or injured permanently in health owing to wounds, injuries or disease received, occurring or contracted while on active service shall receive compensation or a persion in accordance with the provisions of and on the scale contained in the Royal Warrant for pay for the time being.

15. Every member of the Defence Force travelling by rail to any place or places on duty shall be entitled on production of a duly signed certificate certifying that the bearer is so travelling on duty, to a free Railway pass for himself (and his horse or mule (if any)) to such place or places as aforesaid.

Provided always that such Warrants are signed by a District Commandant or the Staff Officer.

Appointment of Officers and Non-commissioned Officers.

- 16. Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and to any Rules issued thereunder the appointment of officers and noncommissioned officers shall be made in the following manner:-
 - (a) District Commandants shall be appointed by being nominated for such commissioned rank by the Central Defence Committee which nominations shall be submitted by the Central Defence Committee for the approval of the Governor.
 - (b) Section Commanders shall be appointed by being nominated for such commissioned rank by the Local Defence Committee of the Defence Force District to which the appointments are to be made, which nominations shall be submitted by the Local Defence Committee aforesaid to the Staff Officer for approval of the Central Defence Committee.

(c) Non-commissioned officers shall be appointed by being nominated for such rank by the Local Defence Committee of the Defence Force District to which the appointments are to be made which nominations shall be submitted by the Local Defence Committee aforesaid to the Staff Officer for confirma- 35

(d) All appointments to and promotions in commissioned ranks will be notified in the "Official Gazette" and appointments to, and promotions in, Non-commissioned ranks will be notified in Defence Force Orders.

Power of Central Defence Committee.

- The Central Defence Committee for the Colony and Protectorate shall have power
 - · (a) to recommend the Governor to cancel the appointment of any officer on any ground to be specified in writing.

Provided always that no such recommendation as aforesaid 45 shall be made unless and until such officer whose conduct is complained of shall have been previously notified in writing of the grounds of complaint and shall have been given a full opportunity of justifying himself in person or in writing. A copy of the proceedings shall be transmitted to the Governor and the 50 recommendation of the Central Defence Committee.

(b) to recommend the Governor to place officers of the Defence Force in a Reserve of Officers.

PART II.

ARMS AND AMMUNITION.

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Government to provide rifles and ammunition.

Duties of member in regard to Government rifle.

18. All rifles and ammunition shall be provided by the Government for members of the Defence Force and will only be issued in case of the Force or part of the Force being called out.

19. Every member of the Defence Force in possession of a Government rifle as hereinbefore provided shall be responsible for the same and for keeping the same in a good and efficient condition and shall be liable for any damage to such ritle due to his act. neglect or default.

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The Governor may by Rules published in the "Official Power of Governor to make Rules in regard Gazette" make provision for all or any of the following matters, to rifles and ammunition. that is to say:

- (a) the inspection and storage of Government rifles;
- (b) the amount storage and possession of ammunition for Government rifles;
 - (c) the duties of the Government Storekeeper in respect of all rifles and ammunition in his District;
- (d) the purchase of service rifles and ammunition from the 10 Government by members of the Defence Force;
 - (e) the imposition of penalties for any breach of duty by a member of the Defence Force in respect of any Government rifle and/or ammunition;
- (f) the Musketry course or courses to be followed by members of the Defence Force. 15

PART III.

MOBILIZATION AND TRAINING.

The Central Defence Committee for the Colony and Protectorate may, on cause being shown, in its absolute and 20 uncontrolled discretion exempt for a limited time any member of the Defence Force from performance of all or any of his compulsory training under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Exemptions of members for limited time from training by Central Defence Committee.

22. (1) From and after the date on which this Ordinance Musketry training. shall come into force every member of the Defence Force shall fire the Musketry course prescribed from time to time under the provisions of this Ordinance.

- (2) No member shall be deemed to be efficient for the purposes of this Ordinance unless he shall have fired such course and shall have obtained the requisite number of points as may from time to time be prescribed by this Ordinance in the manner
- (3) A District Commandant may for any sufficient cause authorise a member of his unit to comply with the requirements for efficiency on any Military or Police range provided that in such case the member shall obtain a certificate signed by a 35 European Military or Police Officer.
 - From and after the date this Ordinance shall come into Training camps for force every member of the Defence Force between the ages of 18 members between ages and 21 years who has not previously served with any Regular or Territorial Combatant Corps or is not in possession of a certificate from a Cadet Corps or School of Instruction shall in every year perform at a Training Camp 15 days continual training.

24. The date and place for every such Musketry course and Date and place for Training Camp shall be notified by the Staff Officer, and notice of such date and place, published in Defence Force Orders and affixed in a conspicuous place at the office of the District Commandant shall be sufficient notice of the same to every member of the Defence Force residing in such Defence Force District.

Musketry course and Training camp.

If any member of the Defence Force shall without Penalties for nonreasonable cause or excuse after such publication of a public notice as is mentioned in the preceding section wilfully fail or neglect to attend at a Rifle Range or Training Camp for the purpose of performing the training by this Ordinance required to be performd by him; or shall wilfully fail or neglect to perform the whole or any portion of the training or drills required by this Ordinance or by any Rules thereunder to be performed by him, then and in any such cases he shall, on conviction by a Magistrate entitled to hold a Subordinate Court of the First or Second Class be liable to a fine not exceeding £5 or in default of payment to a term of imprisonment of either description not exceeding one month or to both; but no such conviction and sentence shall be deemed or taken to exempt the party convicted from all or any of his duties and liabilities under this Ordinance or any Rules issued thereunder.

attendance at a Training course.

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Mobilisation of Defence Force or any part thereof respectively.

Whenever in the opinion of the Governor it shall be necessary for the defence of the Colony and Protectorate or any part thereof or for the protection of life and property therein or in any part thereof, the Governor may by Proclamation call out the Defence Force or such part or parts of the Defence Force as he may deem necessary for service at such place or places within the Colony and Protectorate or beyond the borders thereof as he may from time to time think fit to direct: Provided always that in cases of sudden and imminent danger in any Defence Force District the District Commandant thereof may for the defence of the District or any part thereof or for the protection of life and property therein or in any part thereof by Proclamation in the name of the Governor call out the Defence Force of such District, but so nevertheless that such District Commandant shall forthwith report such calling out and any step taken thereafter by him to the Staff 15 Officer for transmission to the Governor.

Governor may assemble Defence Force or any part thereof respectively for inspection. 27. The Governor may from time to time assemble the Defence Force or such part or parts of the Defence Force for inspection or for inspections and Rifle practice under their own officers at such time or times and at such place or places within 20 their respective Defence Force Districts as he may direct.

Members of Defence Force on mobilisation to be under the Army Act.

- 28. (1) With respect to the discipline of members of the Defence Force when they are on active service or called out for the same the provisions of the Army Act 44 and 45 Victoria Chapter 58 and all Acts amending or substituted for the same so 25 far as applicable shall apply subject to the following modifications:—
 - (a) The words "The Defence Force" may be read therein for the words "Regular Forces" the words "Member of the Defence Force" for the word "Soldier" and the word 30 "Governor" for the words "His Majesty" and "Secretary of State."
 - (b) No sentence of a Court Martial upon the trial of a member of the Defence Force shall be carried into execution unless confirmed by the Governor.
- (2) For the purposes of discipline the provisions of the Army Act 44 and 45 Victoria, Chapter 58 and all Acts amending or substituted for the same so far as applicable shall apply to the permanent staff appointed under Section 11 subject to the modifications set out in sub-section (1) (a) and (b) of this section.

PART IV.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS.

Penalties for breach of duty to serve.

29. Any officer or member of the Defence Force who after publication of such Proclamation as is referred to in Section 26 hereof or after such calling out as is mentioned in Section 27 hereof 45 shall without reasonable cause or excuse fail or neglect to appear for or shall absent himself from service on any occasion or shall withdraw himself before permission to that effect be given by some competent authority or shall refuse or wilfully neglect to obey any lawful command of his superior officer shall, without prejudice to any other offence by such conduct he may have committed, on conviction by a Magistrate entitled to hold a Subordinate Court of the First or Second Class, be liable to a fine not exceeding £100, and in default of payment to a term of imprisonment of either description not exceeding six months or 55 to both.

Provided always no such conviction, fine or imprisonment shall in any wise exempt the person convicted from service or liability to serve in the future under the provisions of this Ordinance but on payment of the fine or on completion of the term of imprisonment, such Magistrate may order the person convicted to return to the Defence Force of the Defence Force District in which he resides to serve in accordance with the terms of the Proclamation aforesaid.

Power of Governor to make Rules.

30. The Governor may from time to time make provision by 65 Rules published in the "Official Gazette" for or any of the following matters, that is to say:—

- (a) the general government discipline and management of the Defence Force.
- (b) the constitution, assembling and proceeding of Courts of Inquiry to hear, receive and examine evidence relating to, and to report upon, any matter connected with the said Force or any charge brought against any member thereof;

(c) the enrolment of members in the Defence Force and

the taking of the prescribed oath thereat;

- (d) the formation of a Special Branch of the Defence Force composed of the employees of the Uganda Railway and Uganda Marine;
- (e) the organisation of the Infantry and Mounted Units and of the Defence Force Districts;

(f) the formation of a Cadet Corps;

(g) the Musketry Course of the Cadet Corps;

- (h) the training of members of the Defence Force and of Cadets;
- (i) the Insurance of horses and mules of the mounted members of the Defence Force;
- (j) the compiling of registers of transport and the duties of members of the Defence Force in connection therewith;
- (k) the imposition of penalties for breach of any Rules issued under this Ordinance.

A Bill

Intituled

An Ordinance to Establish and Control a Territorial Force in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

CHAPTER I.

PRELIMINARY.

Short title and commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Colony and Protectorate of Kenya Territorial Force Ordinance, 1921," and shall come into operation upon such date as the Governor may by notification in the "Official Gazette" appoint, and shall only be applied to such military Districts as the Governor may establish by notification in the "Official Gazette."

2. In this Ordinance unless there be something repugnant in the subject or context.—

in the subject or context:—

"Active Service"—Any unit of the Territorial Force or portion thereof shall be deemed to be on Active Service when it has 10 been called out for active service by notice under this Ordinance.

'' Λ ct or Ordinance''—Shall include all regulations made the reunder.

"Army Act"—Shall mean the Army Act of the Parliament of Great Britain and Ireland as amended from time to time.

"Cadets"—All boys serving in Cadet units subject to the provisions of this Ordinance.

"Commanding Officer"—The Officer in Command of any district, corps, unit, or detachment.

''Corps''—Any portion of the Territorial Force which may 20 be declared by the Governor to be a corps for the purposes of this Ordinance.

"In time of War"—Shall mean any time during which an actual state of war exists, or may, in the opinion of the Governor, be anticipated.

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"Member"—Any Officer, Warrant Officer, Non-commissioned Officer, or man belonging to a unit of the Territorial Force enrolled for service under this Ordinance.

"Military District"—Shall mean a Military District appointed under this Ordinance.

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"Military Service"—Members of the Territorial Force shall be considered to be on Military service:—

- (1) When called out by the Governor under this Ordinance to aid the Civil Authority in the protection of life and property:
- (2) When assembled in any camp of training or exercise or 35 when going to or returning from any such camp or while engaged in any military exercise of drill or musketry or when carrying out any escort duty or guard of honour, or while in uniform at any time or place.

Definitions.

"Peace Training"—Shall mean the military training prescribed under this Ordinance for the Territorial Force.

"Permanent Staff"-All Officers, Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, Armourers, Clerks and Storekeepers or any 5 other persons appointed under Section 38 of this Ordinance, who shall, while holding their appointments be deemed to be always on military service.

"Regulations"—Regulations made under the provisions of this Ordinance.

CHAPTER II.

CONSTITUTION OF FORCE.

3. Subject to the provisions of the Defence Force Ordinance, 1921, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, been accepted. every adult European male resident in the Colony and tectorate, who is a member of the Kenya Defence Force, who has tendered his services and whose services have been accepted, 15 and who has been enrolled as a member of the Kenya Territorial Force shall be liable to be called out for Active or Military Service within the limits of the Colony and Protectorate, and to undergo such peace training as may be appointed by regulation.

Liability of those who have tendered and have

4. Every member enrolled under the provision of this Period of service. 20 Ordinance for service in the Territorial Force shall serve for a minimum period of three years.

5. The Governor may form a Reserve of Officers to the Reserve of Officers Territorial Force in such manner as may be prescribed, and all who offer their services and whose services are accepted as Officers 25 of the Reserve, shall be liable in time of War to render services as Officers with such portion of any local Force as the Governor may decide.

6. All boys between the ages of twelve and seventeen years, who, with the consent of their parents or guardians have enrolled 30 as members of the Cadet Corps or Company shall be liable to undergo an annual prescribed course of peace training and shall for this purpose be assembled in such places and at such times as may be ordered, to be instructed in physical exercises, military formations, rifle shooting, signalling and such other exercises as 35 are prescribed.

Cadets liability for peace

7. (1) The annual course and period of instruction which Period of instruction. every boy liable to Cadet training shall undergo as a minimum shall be as prescribed.

A Cadet who has undergone the prescribed course of 40 instruction for any one year, and passed the prescribed tests shall be reckoned as an efficient cadet for that year, and if he is reckoned efficient for not less than three years and his conduct under instruction in Cadet training has proved satisfactory, he shall be entitled, on attaining the age of seventeen years to receive 45 a certificate of efficiency. Holders of such certificates may with the approval of the Governor, be transferred to the Territorial Force as trained men.

CHAPTER III.

ADMINISTRATION.

8. The Governor may appoint and establish Military Districts Military Districts. throughout the Protectorate with the number and designation of units of the Territorial Force to be allotted to and trained in any Military District.

9. The Governor may by notice in the "Official Gazette" Calling out of Force for 55 call out the whole or any part of the Territorial Force for Active Service or for Military Service to aid the Civil Authority in the protection of life and property and the prevention and suppression of internal disorder throughout the Protectorate and when so called out they shall be held to that service until such time as the Governor may by notice in the "Official Gazette" declare that they are relieved from that service.

internal disorder.

Not entitled to discharge when on service.

10. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Ordinance contained no member of the Territorial Force while called out or employed on active service against an enemy or in military service in the protection of life or property or the prevention or suppression of internal disorder shall be entitled to obtain discharge therefrom during the continuance of such service.

Power to disband or dismiss.

11. The Governor may at any time discontinue the service of any unit of the Territorial Force or cause the same to be disbanded, or dismiss any of the members of any such unit, but no member of a unit thus disbanded shall become exempt from 10 liability to render personal service in time of war.

Officers in Executive Command.

12. The Executive Military Command and inspection of the Territorial portion of the Defence Force or units thereof shall be vested in such Officers, or Officers of the Defence Force as may be appointed by the Governor.

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Appointment and promotion of Officers.

- 13. (1) Before any person can be confirmed in his appointment as an officer, he shall satisfy the Governor that he is fully qualified to hold an appointment, and pass such tests as may be prescribed.
- (2) No Officer of the Territorial Force shall be promoted to 20 a higher rank in that Force until he has proved, in the manner prescribed by regulation, that he is fully qualified to undertake during peace training and in time of war all the duties that may be required of an officer in that higher rank.

Cancellation of Commission.

14. The commission of an officer shall not be cancelled 25 without the holder thereof being notified in writing of any complaint or charge made and of any action proposed to be taken against him nor without his being called upon to shew cause in relation thereto, provided that no such notification shall be necessary in the case of an officer absent from duty without leave 30 for a period of three months or more.

Retirement of Officers.

15. (1) The Governor may place officers of the Territorial Force on the retired list, and officers on that list may, with the approval of the Governor retain their rank and wear the prescribed uniform.

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(2) The ages of compulsory retirement of officers of the Territorial Force shall be as prescribed by regulation.

Resignation of Commission.

16. An officer of the Territorial Force, except when on Active or Military Service, or in anticipation of being called out on the same, may, by writing under his hand, tender his resignation of his commission, but shall not, unless otherwise ordered by the Governor, be relieved of the duties of his appointment until the acceptance of his resignation is notified in the Gazette; provided that officers who resign shall not be exempted from service in the Defence Force to which they may be liable under 45 the principle Ordinance.

Uniform, Arms and Accoutrements.

- 17. (1) A field service dress, with distinctive marks or badges shall be prescribed for every unit of the Territorial Force and supplied to members thereof, to be maintained at their own expenses for such periods and under such conditions as may be 50 prescribed.
- (2) Arms, ammunition and equipment shall be issued under prescribed conditions to members of the Territorial Force, and each member to whom a rifle has been issued shall be bound to keep it in his personal possession and be responsible for its maintainance in good order and condition, and to produce the same for inspection whenever called upon to do so.
- (3) When called out for active or military service, attending annual musters, peace training, or courses of musketry members shall bring with them their equipment and any emergency reserve 60 ammunition which may have been placed in their custody.

Pay and allowances.

18. The Territorial Force shall be paid at a prescribed daily rate for the days on which they are called out for active or military service under the provisions of this Ordinance, and they may also be granted such monetary or other allowances as are 65-laid down in regulations.

19. (1) Each member of the Territorial Force shall reckon Duration of peace his service from the date of enrolment, and shall during each training. complete year, reckoning from that date, undergo such course of annual peace training, instruction, musketry and other such 5 exercises as may be prescribed by regulation-

- In his first year of service, if a recruit, not less than 42 parades together with attendance at the Annual Training
- (b) In his second and third year 10 parades together with 10 attendance at the Annual Training Camp.
 - (2) The time occupied in proceeding to or returning from a camp or place of assembly or instruction shall not be reckoned as part of any period of training, instruction or service prescribed under this section.
- Any member of the Territorial Force who in any year without leave or permission, as prescribed, evades or fails to duly perform with proper zeal the full course of training allotted to him for that year shall be guilty of an offence.

CHAPTER IV.

20 SPECIAL POWERS IN TIME OF WAR.

When the Territorial Force or any portion thereof is called out for active service the Governor may authorise appoint officers of the Territorial Force or of the Public Service of the Colony and Protectorate to obtain and take possession of 25 buildings and other premises, supplies of foodstuffs, forage, horses, transport animals and vehicles and all other articles necessary for the maintenance in the field of the Territorial Force or any portion thereof, and of other forces acting in cooperation therewith. A requisition may, under this section, be 30 made on any person in manner prescribed, but so that every person so requisitioned upon shall be entitled in due course to receive compensation for everything obtained or taken from him.

Commandeering.

- 21. (1) The Officer in Chief Command of the Territorial Railway facilities. 35 Force in the field (acting therein under the Governor's orders) may, in time of war, requisition the authorities controlling any line of railway in the Protectorate to supply suitable engines and rolling stock for the conveyance of members of the Territorial Force or other forces, together with their horses, guns, baggage, 40 stores, supplies, and vehicular transport and to convey the same by rail to and from any points on the railway line within or outside the territory, as may be necessary.
- (2) The Governor, may, under like circumstances, authorise any officer to assume control over any railway system within the 45 territory or any portion thereof.
- Any member of the Territorial Force or any person Disclosures of employed in the Public Service, who discloses any such information or any other secret or confidential information relating to the defence of the Colony and Protectorate, which comes within his 50 cognizance shall, unless acting under due authority and in the execution of his duty (the burden of proof whereof shall be upon him) be guilty of an offence.

23. Any person not being a member of the Territorial Offences in connection Force or of other forces who, without special permission granted with improper use of uniform. 55 by the proper authority in those forces, wears the uniform of any of those forces, or any dress having the appearance of or bearing any of the regimental or distinctive marks of that uniform, shall be guilty of an offence.

CHAPTER V.

DISCIPLINE.

24. Members of the Territorial Force, when on active or Members on active or military service shall be subject to the provisions of the Army military service subject Act; provided, however, that the Governor may from time to to the Army Act. time, make such modifications and adaptions of the provisions thereof, and of the rules of procedure framed under Section 70 65 thereof, as he shall deem necessary or advisable, such adaptions or modifications to be of force and effect upon publication in the 'Official Gazette;' and that nothing in this Ordinance contained shall be construed to exclude a member of the Territorial Force from the operation of the provisions of this Ordinance, and the regulations framed thereunder.

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Members not punishable under this Ordinance as well as under the Army

25. Notwithstanding the provisions contained in Section 24 hereof no member of the Defence Force shall be liable to be punished for any offence under the provisions of this Ordinance as well as under the provisions of the Army Act, or any modifications or adaptions thereof effected in terms of Section 24 of this Ordinance; provided, however, that dismissal from the force may be lawfully added to any punishment awarded to a member of the Territorial Force by virtue of the provisions of the Army Act, or any modifications or adaptions thereof effected in terms of Section 24 of this Ordinance.

Penalty for contravention not otherwise provided

Any member of the Territorial Force who shall be guilty of contravening any of the provisions of this Ordinance for which no penalty is specially provided, or any of the regulations, shall, upon conviction by his Commanding Officer or any Court having jurisdiction be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rupees one 15 hundred and fifty, or in default of payment to a term by imprisonment of either description not exceeding one month or to both.

Power of Governor to confirm or reduce sentence.

27. The records of evidence taken before a Commanding Officer, and the finding and sentence inflicted by the Commanding Officer, in the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred upon him by 20 the last preceding section shall be submitted forthwith to the Governor who may quash the conviction, or confirm or reduce the sentence, and the sentence so confirmed or reduced shall be notified by the Commanding Officer to the member of the Territorial Force convicted, by means of registered letter, and every 25 fine so notified which is not paid within seven days of the date of the posting of such notification may, together with any costs incurred by reason of such non-payment, be recovered in any Magistrate's Court having jurisdiction, on mere production to such Court of a properly authenticated copy of such notification 30 under the hand of such Commanding Officer.

Commanding Officer may summon witnesses,

28. It shall be lawful for any Commanding Officer in the exercise of the jurisdiction conferred on him by Section 26 of this Ordinance to summon in writing any member of the Territorial Force under his command alleged to have contravened the 35 provisions of this Ordinance, or the regulations, and any witnesses alleged to be material to the charge to appear before him and to administer oaths to such witnesses, and generally to investigate the charge in such manner as the Governor may by regulation determine: and any person so summoned as a witness who shall 40 fail to attend at the time and place mentioned in such summons, or, having attended, shall refuse to give evidence, shall be liable on conviction before a Magistrate to a fine not exceeding Rupees three hundred or, in default of payment thereof, to imprisonment of either description not exceeding one month.

Reservation of right to prosecute otherwise than under Ordinance.

29. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall prevent any offender from being prosecuted otherwise than under the provisions of this Ordinance, in all cases in which he would by law, without this Ordinance, be liable to such prosecution but no member of the Territorial Force convicted or acquitted of any 50 crime or offence under the provisions of this Ordinance or under the Army Act, or any modifications or adaptions thereof effected in terms of Section 24 of this Ordinance shall be liable to be again tried for the same crime or offence, provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent any member of the Territorial 55 Force who has been convicted or acquitted from being dismissed from the said Force or reduced in rank therein.

Offences by members against members of other of His Majesty's forces

30. Whenever the Territorial Force, or any portion thereof, and other of His Majesty's forces are associated together under one command, any act committed by members of the Territorial 60 Force, which would if committed in respect of, or in relation to, the members or institutions of the Territorial Force, be an offence against this Ordinance, or the Army Act, or any modifications or adaptions thereof effected in terms of this Ordinance, shall if committed in respect of, or in relation to, the members or institutions 65 of His Majesty's forces, be deemed to be a similar offence, and shall be triable and punishable as prescribed by this Ordinance or the Army Act, or any modifications or adaptions thereof effected in terms of Section 24 of this Ordinance.

31. (1) Any member of the Territorial Force called out for Penalty for refusing Active Service, who refuses or neglects to assemble or march as or neglecting to assemble when called ordered, shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one out for Active Service. hundred pounds and in default of payment to a term of 5 imprisonment of either description not exceeding six months or to both.

- (2) Any member when called out for military service who refuses or neglects to obey such orders shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty pounds and in default of payment to 10 a term of imprisonment of either description not exceeding three months or to both.
 - 32. Any person who—

Aiding or inducing members of Territorial Force to dereliction of duty.

- (1) Agrees with, or induces, or attempts to induce any member of the Territorial Force to neglect or to act in conflict 15 with his military duty in that Force, or
 - (2) Is a party to, or aids or abets, or incites to the commission of, any act whereby any lawful order given to any member of the Territorial Force or any law or regulation with which it is the duty of any member of that Force to comply may be evaded or infringed, or
 - (3) Supplies, or is a party to supplying, any member of the Territorial Force with intoxicating liquor when that member is on military duty and prohibited under regulations or instructions from receiving or taking intoxicating liquor,
- 25 shall be guilty of an offence.

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33. Any member who fraudulently personates or represents Personation. himself to be a member of the Territorial Force travelling on service of that Force, with the intent to obtain conveyance by rail at special rates or to evade payment of any poll, shall be guilty of 30 an offence.

34. Any person who commits any offence against the regula- Offences against tions providing for and regulating the requisitioning in time of Commandeering war of accommodation or goods in pursuance of Section 20 shall Regulations. be guilty of an offence and liable on conviction to imprisonment 35 of either description for a period not exceeding five years.

35. Any member of the Territorial Force who, without Wrongful disposal of proper authority and permission, gives, sells, pledges, lends or property. otherwise disposes of any moneys, animals, arms, ammunition. accoutrements, clothing, supplies or any other article entrusted 40 to or held by him for the service of the Territorial Force shall be guilty of an offence, and, in addition to any penalty for such an offence which may be imposed under this Ordinance, he may be ordered by the Court or other authority competent to impose that penalty to make good the loss or deficiency caused by the 45 gift, sale, pledge, loan or other disposition; and every such gift, sale, pledge, loan or disposition shall be null and void.

36. Any person who wilfully contravenes any provision of Penalty for contravening this Ordinance, or the regulations framed thereunder, shall, when the Ordinance in any no other penalty is provided be liable to a fine not exceeding way. 50 Rupees one hundred and fifty or in default of payment to a term of imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding one month or to both.

37. For the protection of persons acting in the execution of Limitation of action. this Ordinance, every civil action against, and every criminal 55 prosecution of, any person in respect of anything done in the pursuance or in contravention of this Ordinance shall be commenced within six months after the cause of the proceedings has arisen and notice in writing of any civil action and the cause thereof shall be given to the defendant one month at least before the commencement thereof.

CHAPTER VI.

Miscellaneous.

38. The Governor may from time to time constitute for the Power to constitute Territorial Force a permanent staff, consisting of such Officers, Permanent Staff. Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and men as he may deem necessary.

- 39. The Governor may from time to time make regulations Regulations, for all or any of the matters or things following connected with the Territorial Force-
- (1) The numerical establishments of Corps, and other units of the Territorial Force and Cadets, and the various divisions, branches, grades, ranks and appointments therein; TO.
 - (2) The appointment, promotion, transfer, leave, resignation and dismissal of officers;
- (3) The enrolment, posting, transfer, leave, promotion, discharge and dismissal of Non-commissioned officers and men, and the disbandment of any Corps or Units; 15
 - (4) The appointment and posting of the permanent staff, together with rules for their control, discipline, pay, allowances, leave, transfer, discharge and dismissal;
 - (5) The discipline of the Force;
- 20 (6) The Assemblage of Courts of Enquiry, and with rules regarding the attendance of witnesses;
 - (7) Exemption of members of the Territorial Force from carrying out the full course of training for any one training year;
 - (8) The issue and care of arms, accoutrements, ammunition, supplies, animals and transport, clothing and equipment for the Territorial Force and for Cadets;
 - (9) The general government and management of the Force;
 - (10) Drill and musketry instruction;
 - (11) Peace training, including camps of exercise.
 - (12) Pensions, gratuities and compensation for losses sustained on duty;
 - (13) All matters which are by this Ordinance required or permitted to be, or which are necessary or convenient to be prescribed, for assuring the discipline and good government of the Force, or for carrying out and giving effect to this Ordinance.

The Controller of the Local Clearing Office, pursuant to Section I (ii) of the Treaty of Peace (Austria) Order, 1920, hereby licenses direct communication between British creditors and Austrian debtors with regard to the adjustment of accounts or settlement of pre-war debts, or debts arising out of pre-war transactions or contracts, due by Austrian nationals to British nationals. The draft of the agreement embodying the terms of the proposed settlement must be submitted in duplicate to the Controller for his approval, and such approval in writing obtained before any such agreement can be entered into.

Apart from the penalties incurred by the breach of this licence, no agreement for the settlement of such debts or claims will be valid or binding on the parties in the absence of such written approval.

The Controller also hereby licenses communication in writing between British debtors and Austrian creditors with regard to pre-war debts or debts arising out of pre-war transactions or contracts, with the sole object of ascertaining particulars of indebtedness between the parties, provided that no proposal or suggestion is made for the payment or settlement of such debts except through the Local Clearing Office, and that the party so communicating shall retain true copies of such communications and the original replies thereto and hand the same to the Controller on demand at any time.

this licence is an offence punishable by fine and/or

imprisonment.

By E-Laws.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi with the approval of His Excellency the Governor have made the following Bye-laws:-

- 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The Nairobi Township (Dangerous Buildings) Bye-laws, 1921," and shall be read together with the Nairobi Township Rules of 1917 (hereinafter called "the Principal Bye-laws'').
- Bye-law 104 of the Principal Bye-laws is hereby repealed and the following Bye-law is substituted therefor:
 - (1) Where any house, building or work of any kind appears to the Town Clerk to be in a ruinous or dangerous condition he may either
 - (a) Remove or take such steps by way of shoring up securing or otherwise making safe such house, building or work as in his free discretion he may consider necessary; and for that purpose may enter upon the premises and upon

any adjoining premises which it may be necessary to enter for the said purpose: and in such a case the owner of such house, building or work shall be liable for and shall repay to the Town Clerk on demand all expenses incurred in connection with the removal or making safe of such house, building or work including any damages which he may have paid whether by order of Court or otherwise in respect of injury caused to any adjoining property by his entry thereon and work incident to the removal or making safe of such house, building or work: or

(b) Serve upon the owner of such house, building or work a notice in writing requiring him to shore up secure or otherwise make safe to the satisfaction of the Town Clerk, or to remove the same within a time to be specified in the notice: and such owner shall thereupon begin the work specified in the notice within 3 days from receipt thereof and shall continue the same without intermission until it is finished, and shall finish the same within the time specified in the notice.

Provided that if after the lapse of 3 days the owner shall have failed to begin the work, or after the lapse of the time specified in such notice the owner shall have failed to finish the said work the Town Clerk may thereupon proceed under Clause (a) hereof and the provisions of the said clause shall apply.

- (2) The Town Clerk may order the owner of any building which in his opinion is in a dangerous condition or is endangered by the condition of any other building to cause the same to be vacated and may order the occupants of any such building to vacate the same and such order shall forthwith be complied with: and in the event of any delay in complying with such order on the Town Clerk notifying the Superintendent of Police any members of the Police force not under the rank of an Assistant Inspector may enter the premises and cause the occupants of such building to be summarily ejected therefrom.
- (3) In connection with any operations proceeding under Section (1) of this Bye-law, the Town Clerk may close any street or any part of a street or publice place and may erect such hoardings, barricades or other structures as he may in his free discretion consider necessary for the purpose: and the owner of the house, building or work in respect of the condition of which such closure shall be effected shall be liable for and shall repay to the Town Clerk on demand all costs incurred by him in connection with the erection and subsequent removal thereof.
- (4) No person shall except with the authority of the Town Clerk or that of the Police remove or tamper with any such hoardings, barricades or other structures erected under Section (3) of this Bye-law or attempt to pass or climb them— Offences against this section shall be cognisable by the Police.
- No person shall excavate in such a manner as to endanger any building: and any person excavating within six feet of any building shall take such steps by shoring up, securing or otherwise making safe such building as shall be sufficient to ensure that it shall in no way be prejudicially affected by such excavation. Any person not complying with the terms of this Bye-law shall be guilty of an offence.
