## COLONY AND PROTECTORATE OF KENYA.

#### AN ORDINANCE.

No. 24 of 1921.

Assented to in His Majesty's name this 7th day of June, 1921.

#### EDWARD NORTHEY, Governor.

#### An Ordinance to supply a further sum of money for the service of a period from April 1st, 1921, to 31st December, 1921.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Supplementary Short title. Appropriation Ordinance, 1921.

The public revenue for the above period and other funds Public revenue of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya are hereby charged towards the service of the period of nine months ending the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and twenty one with a further sum of nine hundred and thirty one thousand two hundred and ten pounds in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1921.

3. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied Application of money to the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto.

4. The Treasurer of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya Treasurer's authority is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon for payment. warrant or order of the Governor, to pay out of the Revenue and other funds of the Colony and Protectorate, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of nine hundred and thirty one thousand two hundred and ten pounds which will come in course of payment during the period of nine months ending on the thirty-first day of December one thousand nine hundred and twenty one.

THE EAST AFRICA AND UGANDA (CURRENCY) (NO. 2) ORDER-IN-COUNCIL. 1920.

#### PROCLAMATION.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) (No. 2) Order-in-Council, 1920, and all other powers thereunto enabling me, I, Edward Northey, Major-General of His Majesty's Forces, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, do hereby proclaim and declare that from midnight on Wednesday the 22nd June, 1921, the coins set out in the schedule hereto annexed shall cease to be legal tender in the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

From 10 a.m., on Thursday the 23rd June until 3 p.m., on Friday the 22nd July the coins set out in the schedule may be redeemed at any office of any of the following Banks—the Standard Bank of South Africa, the National Bank of India, the National Bank of South Africa or the Bank of South Afri India, and where no such office exists, at the office of the District Commissioner or Resident Commissioner at the rate of one florin note for each silver rupee.

District Officers may at their discretion redeem during a further period of five months commencing on July 23rd, 1921, the coins set out in the schedule held bona fide by native holders only, for an amount not exceeding five hundred rupees per person; any holdings in excess of this must be reported to the Currency Board, London, for authority to redeem.

IT has been notified by the Government of India that the exportation of rice from Bombay has been prehibited. Merchants desirous of obtaining stocks must order them from Burma and there is no objection to their making application direct to the Rice Commissioner, Rangoon.

2. The exportation of all other food grains from Bombay is controlled by the Collector of Customs, Bombay, who permits export of strictly limited amounts, allotting the quantity available among established Shippers at the port. Applications should be addressed to him, stating individual requirements in each case.

3. In neither case is it necessary that applications should be supported by this Government.

TENDERS are invited under the following conditions for the purchase of the Lease of an area of 2 acres or thereabouts stuate in the Township of Fort Hall, for the purpose of the erection of an Hotel.

- 4. The premises to be used for the erection of an Hotel only and for no other purpose whatsoever.
- 5. The purchaser to covenant to erect suitable buildings, to the satisfaction of the District Commissioner, Fort Hall.
- 6. The purchaser shall complete such buildings as a going concern within one year of the date of the Lease.
- 7. No building shall be erected on the plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint.
- 8. The purchaser shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the buildings clearly defined and showing a system of drainage which shall satisfy the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he shall appoint, for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot, and before any building may be occupied, the purchaser shall satisfy the Commissioner of Lands that such system of drainage has been properly constructed.
- 9. The purchaser shall suitably connect his premises with any Town Drainage System, when, in the opinion of the Commissioner of Lands such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the purchaser reasonably so to connect.
- 10. No sub-division of the plot will at any time be allowed.
- 11. The purchaser shall, within one year of the commencement of the Lease, completely enclose the plot with a fence of suitable design and in conformity with the Township Regulations
- 12. All outbuildings, offices, etc. shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint and shall be kept so screened during the term of the Lease.

- 13. No building may approach within a less distance than 10 feet of the boundary of the plot, and at least one-half of the plot must remain unbuilt upon.
- 14. The Director of Public Works, or such person as may be appointed for the purpose, shall have the right to enter upon the plot and lay and have excess to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground, and the purchaser shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforesaid.
- 15. No tender of less than £100 will be accepted for the land.
- 16. Tenderers should state not only the amount they tender for the land but up to what amount they are prepared to expend on the premises and within what period such expenditure will be made.

# HIS MAJESTY'S COURT OF APPEAL FOR EASTERN AFRICA.


