BYE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi with the approval of His Excellency the Governor have made the following Bye-laws:—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "the Nairobi (Rickshaws) Amendment Bye-laws, 1921," and shall be read as one with the Nairobi Township Rules of 1917, (hereinafter called "The Principal Bye-laws").

2. Clause (c) of Bye-law 412 of the Principal Bye-laws as amended is hereby repealed, and the following clause is substituted therefor:—

(c) Licences shall be issued upon the instructions of the Municipal Council."

3. Bye-law 412 of the Principal Bye-laws as amended is hereby further amended by the addition of the following clause:—

"(l) The owner of any Public Rickshaws shall not suffer the place provided by him for the housing of his rickshaws, to be used as sleeping quarters for any natives."

4. Schedule I to Section IV of the Principal Bye-laws as amended is hereby further amended as follows:—

(a) Under Heading "*Fares*" Clause (a) is hereby cancelled and the following clause is substituted therefor:—

(a) *By Time*

"25 cents for each quarter of an hour or part thereof for one or two persons carried with a minimum fare of Fl. 1/."

(b) Under Heading "*Extra Fares*," clause (2) is hereby cancelled.

5. A rickshaw boy who shall enter a public rickshaw and sit or lie therein or who shall place any article of his attire therein at any time shall be guilty of an offence—Offences against this Rule shall be cognisable by the Police.
