THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCES, 1903-1918.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by The East Africa Townships Ordinances 1903-1918, His Excellency the Acting Governor, has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules shall apply to the Township of Nakuru and may be cited as "The Nakuru Township Rules, 1921."

2. No unemployed native shall remain within the Township of Nakuru for a longer period than 48 hours unless he is in possession of a permit from the District Commissioner allowing such person to remain in the said Township.

3. Any offence under or contravention of these Rules shall be cognizable to the Police.

4. Any person under these Rules lawfully residing in Nakuru Township who shall allow any person unauthorized under these Rules to reside in Nakuru Township, to sleep in any hut or other building or place in Nakuru Township shall, on conviction, be liable to the penalties provided for a breach of these Rules.

5. Any person committing a breach or failing to comply with the provisions of these Rules shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding Fls. 200, or in default of payment, to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding two months.

RULES OF COURT.

RULES made by the High Court with the approval of the Governor under Article 22 of the East Africa Order-in-Council, 1902 and Article 2 of the East Africa Order-in-Council, 1906.

1. These Rules may be cited as Rules of Court (Clearing Office) No. 3 of 1921.

2. The proper Officer before whom Certificates shall, in pursuance of article 1 (iv) of the Treaty of Peace Order-in-Council 1919, be produced for registration shall be the Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the High-Court or where the debtor resides within any area appearing in the schedule to the Rules of Court (District Registries of the High-Court) No. 6 of 1911, the District Registrar for that area.

3. A duplicate of each certificate produced for registration shall be supplied by the Clearing Office and the High-Court shall cause such duplicate to be served upon the debtor.

4. The Clearing Office shall supply to the proper Officer particulars specifying the place of residence of the debtor either by inserting such particulars in the certificate or otherwise.

5. The fee payable upon the production of a certificate for Registration shall be Fls. 10. The scale of fees usually payable in the High-Court shall apply to all subsequent acts, applications or proceedings.

INSTRUCTIONS TO CONSULS REGARDING
GRANTING OF VISAS.

INDIA.

Supplement, dated 21st March 1921, to "Instructions to Consuls regarding granting of Visas" dated 1st October 1919 (referred to in Section XI. (C) of these instructions).

NOTE.—References to the Government of India should be addressed to the Secretary, Government of India, Foreign and Political Department, at Simla (April to October) and at Delhi (November to March).

1. *Visas.*—There will be only two classes of visa for India:—

- (1) The ordinary visa; (2) the single journey visa.

Section II. of the Instructions of 1st October 1919 regarding the ordinary and single journey visas for the United Kingdom will apply to the corresponding visas for India, the ordinary visa being valid for twelve months, and the single journey visa for two months.

In the case of a single journey visa for India, the endorsement should be in the following terms: "Good only for the single journey to India within two months from the date hereof." The scale of fees will be the same as those prescribed for ordinary and single journey visas for the United Kingdom.

2. *British Subjects.* British passports issued on or after 1st January, 1921, unless otherwise endorsed, are valid for travelling anywhere within the British Empire, but do not exempt the holder from compliance with the immigration regulations in force in the various countries of the Empire.

Applications for passports made by persons desiring to travel to India should be granted without endorsement save as provided in the following exception:—

Exception. When an applicant has been notified to you as undesirable or may be known to you as having been convicted of any grave offence or as likely to cause disorder or foment sedition, you should not (pending, in cases of doubt, reference to

the Government of India for instructions) grant a passport without endorsement, but may grant a passport endorsed as valid only for the journey to any country other than India (provided that it should not be endorsed as valid for the journey to any other country in the British Empire where the applicant is regarded as undesirable).

Valid passports issued before 1st January, 1921, held by British subjects desiring to go to India may be endorsed in all suitable cases so as to make them valid for travel throughout the Empire; in cases such as those described in the foregoing *Exception*, this endorsement should not be added, nor should an endorsement for the journey to India be given (pending, in cases of doubt, reference to the Government of India for instructions).

3. *Aliens other than former Enemy Aliens and Russians.* Subject to the provisions hereafter mentioned, aliens—other than former enemy aliens and Russians—who are of good character or standing may ordinarily be allowed to proceed to India. Section IV. of the Instructions of 1st October, 1919—"Aliens in General"—will apply generally to visas for India, India being substituted for United Kingdom wherever it occurs. Recommendations from the Department of Overseas Trade, or the local British Commercial Attaché, or from the Government of India, Department of Commerce, or from the Indian Trade Commissioner in London, are to be accepted as sufficient evidence of business in India.

Any doubt regarding domicile in India should be referred to the Government of India.

No alien should be granted a visa for India unless, so far as is known, he complies with the following conditions:—

(1) that he is in a position to support himself and his dependants;

(2) that he is not a lunatic, idiot, or mentally deficient;

(3) that he has not been sentenced in a foreign country for any extradition crime;

(4) that he is not the subject of a deportation order in force under the Foreigners Act, 1864, or the Defence of India Criminal Law (Amendment) Act, 1915, or the Ingless into India Ordinance, 1914;

(5) that he has not been prohibited from landing by the Government of India or the Secretary of State for India;

(6) that he is not known to be likely to cause disorder or foment sedition by reason of his revolutionary views;

(7) that he fulfils such other requirements as may be prescribed by any general or special instructions of the Government of India.

4. *Alien Missionaries.* These are subject to special arrangements, described in the separate printed Memoranda A, B and C circulated herewith. The effect of these memoranda is that aliens desiring to proceed to India for missionary work may receive visas (unless from other points of view there is any reason to doubt their desirability), without reference to the Foreign Office, at sight of any document certifying their identity which is signed or countersigned on behalf of the Missionary Conference of Great Britain and Ireland, the Foreign Missions Conference of North America, or Cardinal Archbishop Bourne. Except as provided below, the applications of all other alien missionaries desiring to proceed to India should be referred to the Foreign Office for transmission to the Government of India, and a reply should be awaited before a visa is granted; an exception is made in the case of missionaries of allied nationality on furlough from India who are in possession of "no objection" certificates from a Local Government in India; a visa for India may be granted at sight of such a certificate.

5. *Former Enemy Aliens.* No visa for India should be granted to any former enemy alien without a reference to the Government of India. Germans will not be allowed to enter India during a period of five years after the conclusion of the war, unless the Government of India are satisfied that very special reasons to justify admission into India exist, e.g., if the individual in question served in the British or allied forces during the war, was by birth a British subject or is a native of territory which has ceased to be German territory as a result of the Peace Treaty.

Former enemy aliens other than German subjects will generally be prohibited from entering India for the same period, but exceptions will be granted with some degree of freedom. Turkish subjects should be subjected to close scrutiny, especially in regard to their political associations or connections.

6. *Aliens whose British Naturalisation has been revoked.*—Visas for India should ordinarily be refused on the passport of a person naturalised as a British subject under the Indian Naturalisation Act, 1852 (XXX of 1852) as amended by the Indian Naturalisation (Amendment) Act, 1919 (XVI of 1919) whose certificate of naturalisation has been revoked. The names of such persons will be notified to you.

7. *Russians.* All applications by Russians to come to India should be referred to the Government of India before a visa is granted, except in the case of officials of a recognised Government of any territory, which formerly formed part of the Russian Empire, travelling on official business, who may be granted visas without reference, provided they are vouched for by the duly accredited local representatives of their Government.

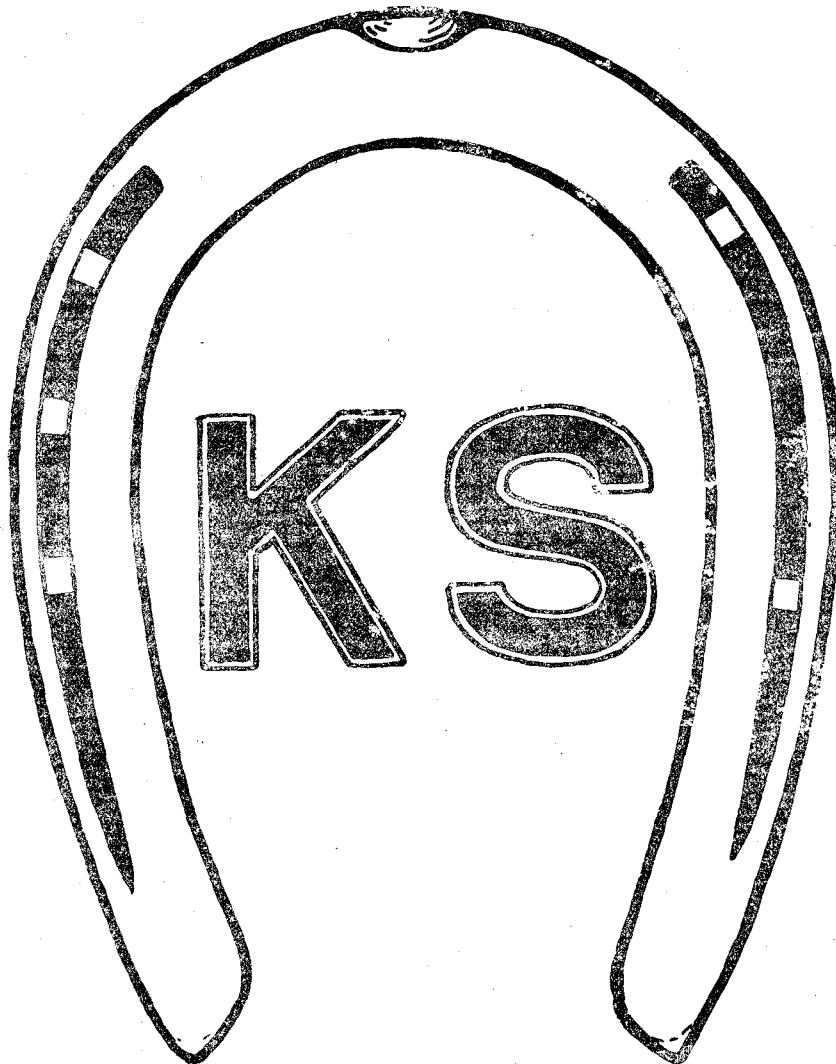
