THE MASTER AND SERVANTS AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1919.

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Native Labourers Diet Rules, 1921."

2. These Rules shall apply to all fuel camps supplying the Uganda Railway between Samburu and Nairobi any clause in any contract, notwithstanding.

3. One item from each of the following 4 Sections must be supplied daily to native labourers in fuel camps.

4. In addition to the above rations 2 oz. of salt must be supplied per week and half an ounce of lemon juice daily or half a lemon on four days in each week, the juice of the lemon to be mingled with the food.
