MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE, 1909.

Bye-Laws.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor have made the following bye-laws:—

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "Nairobi Township (Fire Brigade) Bye-laws, 1921," and shall be read together with Nairobi Township Rules of 1917 (tereafter called "The Principal Bye-laws").

2. There shall be established a Fire Brigade in

2. There shall be established a Fire Brigade in Nairobi, for the prevention and extinction of fires in the township, under the control of the Municipal Council who shall have power to delegate their authority under these Rules to any Committee of their own members duly appointed by them.

3. The Brigade shall consist of an establishment of 3 Officers, viz: Firemaster, Deputy Firemaster and Fereman, who shall bear authority in the order stated, and such number of Firemen as the Municipal Council may from time to time determine. The Municipal Council shall fix the order of seniority of the Firemen and shall also have power to make all appointments of Officers and Firemen. During the absence or temporary promotion of any officer the next member of the Brigade in seniority shall act in his stead and while so acting shall be invested with his authority.

4. (1) Every member of the Fire Brigade shall be required on admission to sign an undertaking before the Town Clerk in the form set forth in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Any member of the Fire Brigade who shall without reasonable and sufficient cause, fail to make appearance and serve with the Fire Brigade when summoned to do so, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding seventy-five florins.

The Municipal Council shall have power in their absolute discretion, at any time and without previous notice, to suspend or terminate the membership of any member of this Brigade, who shall thereupon return all articles of equipment belonging to the Municipal Council under his charge; and any member shall have power to terminate his membership on giving 15 clear days, notice in writing to the Town Clerk and on returning all such articles, and also (but only if less than 8 months of the current year shall have run at the date of such termination) repaying his retaining fee for the current year as after mentioned.

6. The Municipal Council shall provide each member of the Fire Brigade with such articles of equipment as they shall consider necessary, all of which shall be kept in good condition and produced on every occasion of a summons to a fire, as also for inspection on every occasion when ordered by the Firemaster, and shall remain the property of the

Municipal Council: 7. No member shall wear or use any of the said articles except upon duty unless with the consent of the Firemaster; and no member shall lend or otherwise part with possession of such articles except un-

der order of the Firemaster.

S. The Fire Brigade, or European Police Officer in the absence of the Firemaster, may enter and break into any premises in the township being or appearing to be on fire, or any premises or lands adjoining or near thereto, without any consent, and may do all such acts or things as they may deem necessary for extinguishing fire in any such premises or for protecting the same or rescuing any person or property therein from fire.

9. The senior member of the Fire Brigade present at any fire shall have the sole charge and control of all operations for the extinction of such fire.

10. Neither the Municipal Council nor any of the members of the Fire Brigade shall be liable to the public for any act or thing done or omitted to be done in exercise of the powers hereinbefore conferred.

- The Municipal Council shall appoint a member of the Fire Brigade to reside at the Fire Station and shall provide such member with a suitable staff of boys and also with a list of the names and addresses of the members of the Brigade. Such member shall on every occasion when an alarm of fire is communicated to the Fire Station except when such alarm is communicated during official business hours, cause all carts and appliances kept at the Fire Station to be immediately manned and sent forth to the point from which such alarm proceeded and a summons to be issued with all possible despatch to the residence of every member of the Brigade, specifying the said point: and shall also keep the Fire Station at all times accessible in order that alarms of fire communicated during official business hours may be dealt with by the staff at the Municipal Offices.
- 12. Every member of the Fire Brigade on receiving a summons as aforesaid shall proceed with all possible speed to the point specified therein, wearing or carrying with him all articles of equipment with which he shall have been provided: and s'all thereafter be subject to and obey all orders of the senior member of the Fire Brigade present until dismissed

by him.

13. The Firemaster shall appoint such meetings of the Brigade for drill as he may consider necessary, being not less than 12 in each year: and any member

who being duly notified shall absent himself from more taan 2 drills in any year without the consent of the Firemaster or without reasonable excuse shall be liable to a fine not exceeding seventy-five florins.

14. The Municipal Council shall pay to each member of the Fire Brigade including the Firemaster a retaining fee of fifteen florins on appointment and thereafter on the first day of January in each year: and shall also pay to each member, including the Firemaster such fee as they may from time to time prescribe for each fire attended.

The Council may recover the expenses incurred by them in respect of water at any fire from the owners or occupiers of any buildings or buildings which were on fire, or, in the opinion of the Firemaster were endangered by the fire; and such owners or occupiers shall be jointly and severally liable for such expenses. The amount payable in respect of each building shall be determined by the Firemaster and his certificate in regard thereto shall be final and binding upon all parties interested.

16. Rule 554 of the Principal Byelaws is hereby

repealed.
