HIS MAJESTY THE KING has expressed the wish that, on ARMISTICE DAY, November the 11th, there should be complete suspension of all normal business throughout the British Empire, during a two minutes' silence commencing at 11 a.m. in order that the thoughts of all may be concentrated on reverent remembrance of the glorious dead who fell during the Great War.

2. Arrangements should be made locally all over the Colony for such ceremony as the local authorities may arrange.

3. IN NAIROBI a Flagstaff will be erected at the junction of Sixth Avenue and Government Road at the foot of which wreaths will be laid before 11 a.m.

The 3rd Battalion, King's African Rifles, will form a hollow square and provide a Guard of Honour. A siren will be sounded for one minute at 10.59 as a warning, followed by a short blast at 11.2. At 11 a.m. the two minutes silence will be observed, after which the Hymn "O God Our Help in Ages Past" will be sung, accompanied by the Band. At the conclusion of the hymn the Reveille will be sounded by buglers and the ceremony completed.
