THE MINING ORDINANCE, 1912.

REGULATIONS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Mining Ordinance, 1912, Section 73, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Regulations:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Coal and Oil Mining Regulations, 1921."
- 2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Mining Regulations, 1912, and the Mining Amendment Regulations, 1920, the Commissioner of Mines may with the approval of the Governor grant sole prospecting licences to prospect for coal and/or oil on any Crown lands which may be in the form in the Schedule annexed hereto.
- 3. The Governor may settle the fee which shall be paid by a grantee of any such sole prospecting licerce.
- 4. In the event of any coal or oil being won in the area over which any such sole prospecting licence has been granted the Governor may fix the price at which such coal or oil may be sold.
- 5. Every licensee shall carry out prospecting operations to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Mines. If any licensee shall fail to comply with the provisions of this Regulation he shall forfeit his licence.
- 6. Every licence shall be subject to the provisions of the Mining Regulations, 1912, with the exception of Regulations Nos. 83, 84, 85, 86 (1) and (2), 88 and 91 thereof.
- 7. Every licensee shall during the currency of the licence have a preferential right to a lease or leases for mining purposes subject to the provisions of the Ordinance in the area covered by his licence.
- 8. A licensee shall not assign his licence or any interest thereunder except with the consent of the Governor.

CIRCULAR.

The following Circular Despatch is published for general information.

> DOWNING STREET, 27th August, 1921.

SIR,

I have the honour to inform you that I have recently been in communication with the Army Council on the subject of the status of officers on retirement form the Colonial Volunteer Forces, and that His Majesty the King has been pleased to approve of the privilege of wearing uniform, granted to ex-officers of the Dominion Forces and Colonial Volunteers under local conditions, which is now effective only within local limits, being extended to cover the wearing of uniform on special occasions at home and elsewhere throughout His Majesty's dominions.

His Majesty has also been pleased to approve that the privilege of retaining rank by such officers should be extended to be effective throughout His Majesty's dominions.

- 3. These privileges will be limited to an officer who held a commission between the 5th of August, 1914, and the date of the termination of the War—midnight of 31st August as notified to you in my telegram of 16th August.
- 4. Military officers in this country who have relinquished their commissions and who have been permitted to retain their rank also officers who have been demobilised or disembedied, are permitted to wear uniform on special occasions when attending ceremonies and entertainments of a military nature, and on occasions when the wearing of uniform would appear appropriate, and this limitation should be observed in respect of officers of the Colonial Volunteer Forces who have relinquished their commis-

sions and have been permitted to retain their rank under due authority by notification in the local Gazette.

5. The uniform should be restricted to service dress, and should be that of the unit or of the general list to which the officer belonged when he relinquished his commission or was demobilised. The badges of rank should be those of the rank he held when demobilised or that retained by him when he quitted the Service.
