MIXED ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL BETWEEN THE BRITISH EMPIRE AND AUSTRIA.

IN PURSUANCE of Article 256 of the Treaty of St. Germain-en-Laye, the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal between the British Empire and Austria has been constituted and is about to commence work in London. The President is Mr. B. C. J. Loder, LL.D., Judge of the Supreme Court of the Netherlands, the British Member is Mr. Heber Hart, K.C., LL.D. and the Austrian Member Dr. Jur Paul Hammerschlag.

An important part of the work of the Tribunal will be to decide upon claims in respect of debts under Section III of Part X of the Treaty where a difference arises between British and Austrian Nationals or between the British and Austrian Clearing Offices. It has also jurisdiction under Section IV ("Property, Rights and Interests"), Section V ("Contracts, Prescription, Judgments"), Section VI ("Mixed Arbitral Tribunal") and Section VII ("Industrial Property") of Part X of the above Treaty.

By the Treaty the High Contracting Parties have agreed that their courts and authorities shall render to the Tribunal direct all the assistance in their power, particularly as regards transmitting notices and collecting evidence; and they have also agreed to regard the decision of the Tribunal as final and conclusive and to render them binding upon their nationals.

Statutory effect has been given to the provisions of the Treaty in this country by an Ordinance called the Local Clearing Office (Austria) Establishment Ordinance 1921.

The British Government has provided headquarters for the Tribunal at Winchester House, 21, St. James's Square, S.W.1.; Mr. Claude Mullins, Barrister-at-Law, is the British Secretary.

MIXED ARBITRAL TRIBUNAL BETWEEN THE BRITISH EMPIRE AND HUNGARY.

IN PURSUANCE of Article 239 of the Treaty of Trianon the Mixed Arbitral Tribunal between the British Empire and Hungary has been constituted, and is about to commence work in London. The President is Mr. B. C. J. Loder, LL.D., Judge of the Supreme Court of the Netherlands; the British Member is Mr. Heber Hart, K.C., LL.D.; and the Hungarian Member Mons. Bela de Zoltan, formerly Minister of Justice in Hungary.

An important part of the work of the Tribunal will be to decide upon claims in respect of debts under Section III of Part X of the Treaty, where a difference arises between British and Hungarian nationals or between the British and Hungarian Clearing Offices. The Tribunal has also jurisdiction under Section IV ("Property, Rights and Interests"), Section V ("Contracts, Prescriptions, Judgments"), Section VI ("Mixed Arbitral Tribunal") and Section VII ("Industrial Property") of Part X of the above Treaty.

By the Treaty, the High Contracting Powers have agreed that their courts and authorities shall render to the Tribunal direct all the assistance in their power, particularly as regards transmitting notices and collecting evidence; and they have also agreed to regard the decisions of the Tribunal as final and conclusive and to render them binding upon their nationals.

The British Government has provided headquarters for the Tribunal in Winchester House, 21, St. James's Square, S.W.1.; Mr. Claude Mullins, barrister-at-law, is the British Secretary.

Sale of Leases in respect of Business Plots, Kilindini.

NOTICE is hereby given that leases in respect of the Business plcts specified in the schedule hereto will be sold by auction at the Jubilee Hall at Mombasa on Thursday the 23rd February, 1922, commencing at 10 a.m.

Plans of the sites may be seen at the Public Map Office, Land Department, Nairobi, and at the Land Office, Mombasa.

The right to withdraw any plots from the auction is reserved to Government.

CONDITIONS.

- 1. Each plot shall be auctioned separately.
- 2. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser, and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding.
- 3. The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.
- 4. Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of 20% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.
- 5. The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full on the issue of the lease or may be paid by four equal annual instalments payable on the first day of January in each year, the first of such instalments to be paid on the first day of January, 1923. The purchaser shall also pay interest at the rate of 8% per annum on the unpaid portion of the purchase money such interest to be

paid on the 1st day of March, 1922, and subsequently on the first day of January in each year. each such instalment and the interest on the unpaid portion of the purchase money is paid on the date on which it falls due they shall be deemed to be added to the annual rent reserved in the lease and shall be payable and recoverable as such.

6. The lease shall be for 99 years and shall commence from the first day of March, 1922, and the rent shall be payable from that date

7. No building shall be erected on any plot unless maps, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint.

8. The Lessee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the building clearly defined and showing a system of drainage, which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and before any building may be occupied the Lessee shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed.

9. Each Lessee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the

Lessee reasonably so to connect.

10. The Government or such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and lay and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the Lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover cr interfere with any existing routes, main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned.

11. The following roads will be constructed as soon as possible at widths to be decided by Govern-

ment:

(a)That portion of the road (shown on Auction Plan as 100 ft. road) which lies between the South-west corner of Plot No. 91 and the South-east corner of Plot No. 94 and forms the Southern boundary of Plcts 91, 92 and 94.

(b) The road which runs along the Western boundary of Plet No. 91, from the South-west corner thereof, to its junction with Kilindini Road.

In the event of the purchasers of Plots Nos. 91, 92 and 94 electing to pay the balance of the purchase price over the extended period referred to in condition No. 6, Government will not be bound to begin construction of the said roads prior to the 1st January, 1923, and in the event of only two of the said plots being sold the sale thereof shall be cancelled and a refund made of monies deposited, provided, however, that if within one month of the date of the sale the purchasers shall give a joint undertaking to

the plot.

13. Each purchaser shall erect on his plot within 3 years of the commencement of his lease a building constructed of stone, brick or concrete.

14. At no time during the term of the lease shall any building erected on the plot be used for the pur-

pose of a private dwelling house.

15. At no time during the term of the lease shall any plot or portion thereof or any building erected on the plot be used for the purpose of carrying on any of the trades specified in the schedule hereto.
