NOTICE is hereby given that leases in respect of the Business plots specified in the schedule hereto will be sold by auction at the Jubilee Hall at Mombasa on Thursday the 23rd February, 1922, commencing at 10 a.m.

Plans of the sites may be seen at the Public Map Office, Land Department, Nairobi, and at the Land Office, Mombasa

The right to withdraw any plots from the auction is reserved to Government

CONDITIONS

- 1 Each plot shall be auctioned separately
- 2 The highest bidder shall be the purchaser and if any dispute arise as to any bidding, the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bidding
- 3 The amount of the advance of each bidding shall be regulated by the Auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted
- 4 Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer a deposit of

20% of his purchase money. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately re-offered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused

5 The balance of the purchase money may be paid in full on the issue of the lease or may be paid by four equal annual instalments payable on the first day of January in each year the first of such instalments to be paid on the first day of January, 1923. The purchaser shall also pay interest at the rate of 8% per annum on the unpaid portion of the purchase money such interest to be paid on the 1st day of March, 1922, and subsequently on the first day of January in each year. Unless each such instalment and the interest on the unpaid portion of the purchase money is paid on the date on which it falls due they shall be deemed to be added to the annual rent reserved in the lease and shall be payable and recoverable as such

6 The lease shall be for 99 years and shall commence from the first day of March 1922 and the rent shall be payable from that date

7 No building shall be erected on any plot unless plans, drawings, elevations and specifications thereof shall have been previously submitted to and approved by the Land Officer or such other person as he may appoint

8 The Lessee shall further submit a block plan of the plot with the position of the building clearly defined and showing a system of drainage, which shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health for properly dealing with the surface water on the plot and before any building may be occupied the Lessee shall satisfy the Medical Officer of Health that such system of drainage has been properly constructed

9 Each Lessee shall suitably connect his premises with any town drainage system when in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health such drainage scheme is so far completed as to enable the Lessee reasonably so to connect

10 The Government or such person as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon any plot and land and have access to water mains and service pipes, telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains of all descriptions whether overhead or underground and the Lessee shall not erect any building in such a way as to cover or interfere with any existing water main or service pipes or the telegraph or telephone wires and electric mains aforementioned

11 The following roads shall be constructed as soon as possible at widths to be decided by Government —

(a) That portion of the road (shown on Auction Plan as 100 ft. road) which lies between the South-west corner of Plot No 91 and the South-east corner of Plot No 94 and forms the Southern boundary of Plots Nos 92 and 94
