THE NATIVE LIQUOR ORDINANCE, 1921.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by Section 3 of the Native Liquor Ordinance, 1921, it is provided that the Governor-in-Council may by Proclamation apply the aforesaid Ordinance to any area in the Colony and Protectorate where there is no local authority, at the request of the Administrative Officer-in-charge of such area.

And whereas the Resident Commissioner, Kisumu has requested that the aforesaid Ordinance shall be applied to the areas the boundaries of which are as set out in the schedule annexed hereto.

Now therefore, I, Edward Northey, Major-General of His Majesty's Forces, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor of the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya, having taken the advice of my Executive Council, do order and proclaim that the aforesaid Ordinance shall apply to and have effect in the aforesaid areas on and after the 28th day of February, 1922.

PROVINCE OF NYANZA.

No. 643; thence Westerly by that boundary to its intersection with the Eastern boundary of L.O. No. 3977; thence Scutherly by the Eastern boundaries of that portion and of L.O. No. 3978; thence by the Southern boundaries of L.O. Nos. 3978 and 3979 and by the Western boundary of the latter portion to its inter-section with the Nyando River; thence by that River down-stream to the South-west corner of L.O. No. 648/1; thence by the Western boundary of that portion to its intersection with the Uganda Railway

100 foot Southern zone; thence by that zone Northwesterly to its intersection with the Kapchure, Kundos or Kibigori River; thence by that River down-stream to a point on its Western bank 400 feet in a direct line from the centre of Kibigori Railway Bridge; thence by a straight line Westerly to the South-east corner of the Kibigori Station Reserve; thence by the Southern and Western boundaries of that Station Reserve to its intersection with the Uganda Railway 100 foot Southern zone; thence by that Southern zone to its intersection with the Kibos River; thence by that River down-stream to the South-east corner of L.O. No. 1608; thence by the North-western boundaries of L.O. Nos. 1608 and 1609 to the most Northerly corner of the latter portion on the Kapchure River; thence by that River up-stream to its junction with the Kamarya (or Kirondia) River; thence by that River up-stream to the most Westerly corner of L.O. No. 1368/3; thence by the South-western boundary of that portion to the Trigonometrical Beason Gungit (Gingit) at its most Southerly corner; thence Easterly by a straight line to the Trigonometrical Beacon Kavisserat; thence Northeasterly by a straight line to the Trigonometrical Beacon Kablaigut at the South-west corner of L.O. No. 1473; thence by the Western boundary of that portion to the Trigonometrical Beacon Matema at its North-west corner; thence by the Southern boundary of L.O. No. 1476 to its intersection with the Western boundary of the Waterfall Reserve L.O. No. 1701; thence South-easterly by a straight line to the Trigonometrical Beacon Sirit; thence North-easterly by a straight line between that Beacon and the Trigonometrical Beacon Chemartim to its point of intersection with the Southern boundary of L.O. No. 1479; thence Easterly by part of that boundary to the South-east corner of L.O. No. 1479; thence by the Eastern boundary of L.O. No. 1459 to the North-west corner of L.O. ByE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1909, the Municipal Council of Nairobi with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have made the following Bye-laws:—

- 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "Nairobi (Rickshaw Amendment) Bye-laws, 1922" and shall be read as one with Nairobi Township Rules, 1917, (here nafter called "the Principal Bye-laws)".


