## ORDINANCE.

No. 1 of 1922.

Assented to in His Majesty's name this 24th day of March, 1922.

## An Ordinance to provide for the Interpretation of References in Ordinances and Applied Acts to various Coins.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:-

- This Ordinance may be cited as "The Currency Short title. Interpretation Ordinance, 1922.
- 2. Where in any Ordinance or Act applied to the East Africa When "florins" to be read Protectorate in force on the 21st day of July, 1920, the word for "rupees." "rupee" is used such Ordinance or applied Act shall be deemed to have had effect from the said date until the 31st day of December, 1921, inclusive, as if the word "florin" had been used in place of the word "rupee."

3. Where in any Ordinance or Act applied to the East Africa When "two shillings" to ectorate in force on the 1st day of January, 1922, the word be read for "florins" or Protectorate in force on the 1st day of January, 1922, the word "rupee" or the word "florin" is used such Ordinance or applied Act shall be deemed to have had effect from the said date and shall have effect as if the words "two shillings" had been used in place of the word "rupee" or the word "florin."

4. Where in any Ordinance in force on the 31st day of Conversion to shilling December, 1921, any reference is made to "cents" such Ordinance cents. shall be deemed to have had effect from the 1st day of January, 1922, and shall have effect as if for references to any number of cents there were substituted references to twice the number of cents of a shilling.

5. Where in any Ordinance or Applied Act, the word "anna," References to "annas", or "pice" occurs, or reference is made to any fraction of a rupee, such Ordinance or Applied Act shall be construed as if in place of such anna or pice or fraction of a rupee there were substituted a number of cents of a shilling equal to twice the number of cents of a rupee which were by Proclamation dated 15th March, 1907, under the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order-in-Council, 1905, made the equivalent of the number of annas or pice or fraction of a rupee mentioned or referred to in such Ordinance or applied Act.

Any reference in an Ordinance to pounds or pounds References to "pounds," sterling shall have effect as if reference had been made to twenty times the number of shillings.

An Ordinance to make provision for raising a Loan of Three Million Pounds Sterling for the Construction of certain Public Works and other purposes.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient to raise a loan of three million pounds sterling for the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Specific Loan Ordinance, 1922."

Authority to Governor to borrow by sale of debentures or inscribed stock. 2. The Governor is hereby authorised to issue stock or debentures or both under the provisions of "The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance, 1921," to the amount of Three Million Pounds.

Application of loan.

3. The money to be borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance shall be appropriated and applied to the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor with the sanction of the Secretary of State to utilise any money not spent upon any item in the said Schedule to cover any excess of expenditure in respect of any other item.

Commencement of contribution to sinking fund.

4. Contribution to sinking fund, as contemplated by the provisions of Sections 14 and 28 of "The General Loan and Inscribed Stock Ordinance, 1921," shall commence after the expiration of three years from the date of the first issue of Debentures or Inscribed Stock to be issued under this Ordinance.

## THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS ORDINANCE, 1909.

#### ByE-LAWS.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon them by the Municipal Corporations Ordinance, 1900, the Municipal Council of Nairobi with the approval of His Excellency the Governor have made the following Bye-laws:—

- 1. These Bye-laws may be cited as "Nairobi (Verandah Trading) Bye-laws, 1922" and shall be read as one with Nairobi Township Rules of 1917 (hereafter called "the Principal Bye-laws").
- 2. In Rule 341 of the Principal Bye-laws, there shall be inserted at the end of the first paragraph of the said Rule the following words:

"Provided that the Town Clerk may license stalls or kiosks of approved type on the verandahs of approved premises fronting on any of the streets mentioned in Rule 336, for the sale of the following goods namely:—

- "Betel nuts and palm leaves
- "Cigarettes and tobacco
- "Matches
- "Aerated Water
- "Sherbet

for the following fee:-

"For one month's licence: Shillings 2/50."

- It shall be an offence to sell any articles other than those above specified in a stall or kiosk licensed by the month under this bye-law."
- 8. Rule 840 of the Principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by inserting the word "annual" after the word "every".
