THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906

RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Disease, of Animals Ordinance, 1906, His Excellency the Governor, has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as The Diseases of Anima's (Amendment) Rules (No. 1) of 1922," and shall I read as one with the Diseases of Animals Rules, 1918, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Rules and all amendments thereof
- 2 Rule 26 of the Principal Rules under Government Notice No 253 and dated the 30th July, 1920, is hereby cancelled and the following substituted therefor—
 - 26 (1) Any per on bringing cattle, camels, horses, mules donkers, sheep or goats from the Northern Frontier District or Jubaland into the Kenyr or Narvasha Provinces, Districts of Nieri, Meru or Laikipia, shall conduct such animals to the Isiolo Quarantene Area by the following route and by no other, tollowing the course of the Uaso Nine River to its junction with the Isiolo River, thener along the Western bank of the Isiolo River up stream to the Inoculating Station within the Isiolo Quarantine Area

Before arriving as the Uasa Nync Liver the caner or agent in charge of the animals shall give no ice to the Administrative Officer or Clerk in charge at Archer's Post, of his arrival and shall sate the probable date of arrival of the animals at the Isiolo Insculating Station and the number of such animals

The owner or agent in charge of any cattle shall cause the said cautle to be inspected and actively immunised against rinderpest and otherwise dealt with as may be considered necessary, by the Vetermary Authorities at the Isrolo Quarantine Station. The cost of such active immunisation against rinderpest shall be Sh. 6/- per head, and shall be paid by he owner or agent in charge of the cattle. The cattle shall be dipped as required before leaving the Inoculating Station as a charge of twelve cents per head.

- (2) No such owner or agent shall move any such animals from the Isolo Quarantine Area until he shall have obtained a permit to do so from the Stock Inspector in charge of the area. Such permit will only be granted on the tollowing conditions—
 - (a) That the owner either possesses himself or can produce written evidence that he has bried in a non-native area grazing of sufficient capacity to accommodate his stock, or can produce a permit that he is entitled to graze a specified number of cattle on a comminage or Township grazing area, or
 - (b) That he has obtained a permit from the Officer-in charge of a Native Reserve to trade his stock in that Reserve, or
 - (c) That he can show -a isfactory evidence that he is a Native of a Native Reserve
- (3) Nothing in the preceding section shall prevent an owner from obtaining a permit from the Officer in charge of the Isiolo Quarantine Area to take his cattle to a specified Auction Sale provided what if the cattle are unsold he shall within 48 hours of the termination of such Auction return them to the Isiolo Quarantine Area unless he shall have obtained a permit under (a), (b) or (c) of the previous section
- (4) No per-on shall keep cattle, camela, horses, mules, sheep or grats at any place along the line of increment as specified on his permit for a longer period than 48 hours without the permission in writing from the Magistrate of the district in which he saituated at the moment
- (5) For the purpose of these Rules the Isolo Quantine Area shall include the area bounded as follows —

On the West by the Uaso Nyno River on the South by a line drawn Eastwards from the junction of the Uaso Nyno and Uaso Narok Rivers to be highest point of Olloromade Hill, thence to the highest point of Mukogodo Hill thence South Eastwards in a straight line where the Ngare Ndare River intersects the North Kenva Farms boundary, thence along the foor of the Ol Motonyi Escaipment to the Isiolo River, on the East by the Isiolo River and on the North by the Uaso Nyno River
