## A Bill

#### Intituled

#### Ordinance An to the Native Amend Authority Ordinance, 1912.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Native Authority short table (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922," and shall be read as one with the Native Authority Ordinance, 1912 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance") and the Native Authority Amend-5 ment Ordinance, 1920

2 Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance as amended by the Amendment to Native Authority Amendment Ordinance, 1920, is hereby Principal amended as follows --

- (1) by deleting clause (m) thereof and substituting the following clauses therefor — 10
  - (m) the providing of paid porters for Government servants on tour and for the transport of urgent Government
- (n) the providing of paid labour for work on the construction or maintenance of railways, wharves, roads or other 15 works of a public nature if required by the Governor with the prior approval of the Secretary of State,

Provided always that no person shall be required to work under the provisions of clause (m) or (n) —

- (a) for a longer period than 60 days in any one year,
  - (b) if he be fully employed in any other occupation or has been so employed during the preceding 12 months for a period of 3 months,
  - (c) if he be otherwise exempted under the provisions of any direction issued by the Governor,
  - (o) requiring natives subject to his jurisdiction to attend at any time and at any place appointed by him within the local limits of his jurisdiction,
- (p) prohibiting natives subject to his jurisdiction from holding or attending any meeting or assembly within the 30 local limits of his jurisdiction which in his opinion might tend to be subversive of peace and good order,
- (2) the word "and" at the end of clause (1) is hereby deleted, 35
  - (3) clause (m) shall become clause (q)

#### KENYA WAR MEMORIAL

WHEN the War Memorial Fund was started subscriptions were invited tor tour purposes, viz. A Monument, the enlargement of the European Hospital, Nanobi, an Indian Hospital and a Native Memorial. In 1921 it was decided after publishing the intention in the Press, to add the money subscribed to the Monument, which amounted to some \$1,600 had been subscribed. His Excellency added to this about \$2,400 ncm funds at his disposal and the Committee placed the unallocated funds also to the object. In this way the money available for the European Hospital was brought up to over £6,500.

Plans and specifications for the election of the appearatory the European Hospital Nauobi were nady in May 1°22, and the work was about to commence when H s Excellency the Governor realized that the provision of extra teds must materially increase the cost of Hospital upkeep at a time when every effort was necessary to reduce Government expenditure

A meeting of the War Meniorial Committee was held at Government House on Saturday last, the 19th instant. His Excellency explained the position showing that the European Hosiptal extension was now out of the question. Various alternative forms of memorial were suggested. If was finally proposed by Mr. L. Tarlton, seconded by Dr. Arthur and carried nom con

That of the £6 500 now available from the War Memorial Funds approximately £1 000 be devoted to the election of a War Memorial Monument to commemorate those who fell under the British Flag in the East African Compaign mespective of race or colour and that of the balance a sum of approximately £860 be devoted to the liquidation of the building debt of the Lady Northey Home, the remainder being allocated to the endowment of beds in the Lady Northey Home, a tablet being elected in the Lady Northey Home, a tablet heing elected in the Lady Northey Home to the effect that the funds had been devoted to that purpose."

This was possed on condition "that a statement of the present position be forwarded to the Press for publication and that the above resolution be published and forwarded to each contributor to the fund inviting criticism and suggestions from subscribers to reach the Hon Secretary before the 50th September, 1922

Cuticisms and suggestions should be addressed to Mi G R Sandford, the Secretariat, Nairobi to reach him before the date mentioned. The Committee will then reassemble to consider the suggestions put forward

The money subscribed for the Indian Hospital, £214 was insufficient for the purpose and has been forwarded to the Indian Association at their suggestion for the assistance of destitute Indians

Funds for the Native War Memorial amount to £3,000 in all and are to be devoted to the erection or a Native Hostel in Nairobi, which the Alliance of Miss onaires undertake to main ain
