#### THE COMPANIES ORDINANCE, 1921.

#### RULES.

2. A certificate entitling the holder thereof to act as Auditor of a Company may be granted by the Governor to

(1) Any person resident in the Colony and Protectorate being a member of any of the following Institutes or Societies:—

(a) The Society of Accountants in Edinburgh Incorporated by Royal Charter, 1854.

(b) The Institute of Accountants and Actuaries in Glasgow, Incorporated by Royal Charter, 1855.

(c) The Society of Accountants in Aberdeen Incorporated by Royal Charter, 1867.

(d) The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales, Incorporated by Royal Charter, 1880.

(e) The Institute of Chartered Accountants in Ireland, Incorporated by Royal Charter, 1888.

(f) The Society of Incorporated Accountants and Auditors, Incorporated 1885.

(2) Any person who shall have made written application to the Governor and shall have been considered by him to be a fit person to be granted a certificate by virtue of his position, qualifications and past experience.

## DISCHARGED SOLDIERS SETTLEMENT ORDINANCE, 1921.

#### NOTICE.

WITH a view to correcting any misunderstanding prevailing in the matter, it is notified for public information that the purchase price of farms granted under the Crown Lands (Discharged Soldiers Settle-be the later date) has been completed, and passed by Government.

2. No remission will be made until title has been issued, and stamp duty must be paid on the stand. premium set forth in the grant.

Alloitees in possession of their titles who have 3. already completed the required development may apply for remission when arrangement will be made to value the improvements effected.
