An Ordinance Further to Amend the Former Enemy Aliens Restriction Ordinance, 1919.

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Former Enemy Aliens Restriction (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922," and shall be read as one with the Former Enemy Aliens Restriction Ordinance, 1919 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance,") and all amendments thereof. Short title.

2. Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed, and the following section is substituted therefor:— Repeal of Section 9 of the Principal Ordinance.

"9. This Ordinance shall remain in force till the thirty-first day of August, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Twenty-three and the Governor-in-Council shall have power from time to time by order, further to extend its operation, provided that no one extension shall exceed a period of twelve months." Duration of Ordinance.

An Ordinance to make provision for Passports for persons entering the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya.

BE it enacted by the Acting Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Passports Ordinance, 1922." Short title.

2. No person shall enter the Colony or Protectorate unless he is in possession of a valid passport issued to him, not more than two years previously, by or on behalf of the Government of which he is a subject or citizen, or some other document satisfactorily establishing his nationality and identity. Prohibition against entering or remaining in the Colony and Protectorate without valid Passport.

Provided that the Governor may permit any person not being a person prohibited by any other law from entering the Colony or Protectorate to enter the Colony and Protectorate without such passport or other document.

This Proclamation is in substitution for the following Proclamation which I hereby declare to be cancelled.

Proclamation No. 96, dated the 11th day of August, 1922, declaring a portion of the Nyanza Province, to be an infected area (Contagious Bovine Pleuro-pneumonia).

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS
ORDINANCE, 1903.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following rules:—

1. These rules may be cited as “The Eastleigh Assessment and Rating Rules, 1922,” and shall be read as one with the Eastleigh Township Rules of 1921 (hereinafter called “the Principal Rules”).

2. Throughout these rules the following words and expressions shall have the meanings assigned to them except where the context otherwise requires:—

(a) “Rateable Value” shall mean the nett annual value of any premises.

(b) “Nett annual value” shall mean the rent at which any premises are let from year to year or the rent at which any premises might reasonably be expected to be let from year to year deducting therefrom the probable average cost of repairs and insurance (if any) necessary to maintain the same in a state to command such rent and free of any land taxes.

(c) “Resident Commissioner” shall mean the Resident Commissioner of Nairobi.

(d) “Building” shall mean any building as defined in clauses 1, 2, 3 and 4 of rule 12 of the principal rules.

(e) “Premises” shall include messuages, buildings, lands, easements, and hereditaments of any tenure.

3. The Resident Commissioner shall make estimates for the expenditure of funds in respect of the general public services of the Township for the ensuing year, and shall submit the same to the Governor before the month of December in every year. Such general public services may include the construction and supervision of roads, drains, public conveniences and township depots and the provision and supervision of scavenging, street lighting, water supply and similar works.

4. The Governor may, if he approves of the same, with or without amendment, impose such rate as he may consider necessary for the estimated cost as aforesaid. Provided that such rate shall not exceed 10 per cent of the gross annual value of the property assessed and shall be payable by the owner of the property upon which it has been imposed.

5. The Resident Commissioner may make any reductions he may deem reasonable in respect of the rates imposed upon any building which it may be proved to his satisfaction has remained empty or only partly occupied during a period of three months or more of the year in which the said rate is levied.

6. Buildings and plots covenanted to be held and used for religious or charitable purposes or purposes of sport or dedication for the use of Government shall be exempt from the payment of township rates so long as such buildings or plots are so used exclusively.

7. No rate shall be levied on account of any building which has remained unoccupied for the whole of the period in respect of which the rate is due.

8. The Resident Commissioner shall have power to sue in his own name for payment of all unpaid rates prescribed under these or any rules issued or that may hereafter be issued under the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, in respect of the Township of Eastleigh.

9. All rates shall be paid between the first and thirty-first day of January in each year for which the assessment is made and shall be paid to the Resident Commissioner at his office.

10. The rate or rates imposed upon premises according to the gross annual value thereof shall be assessed in the manner hereafter provided.

11. For the purpose of assessment a valuation from year to year shall be made of all premises. Such valuation shall be entered in a book to be kept at the office of the Resident Commissioner wherein shall be written in distinct columns the name of the owner, a designation of the property sufficient to identify the same, the plot number, and the amount of the value thereof.

12. The Resident Commissioner shall make the valuation and, in order to enable him to arrive at a fair valuation of any premises liable to be rated, it shall be lawful to require the owner or occupier of the premises to furnish returns of the rent or annual value thereof and, for the like purpose it shall be lawful at any reasonable time to enter and inspect such premises, and whoever refuses or fails to furnish any such return for the space of one week from the day on which he shall have been required to do so, or knowingly makes a false or incorrect return or hinders, obstructs, or prevents any government officer duly authorised on that behalf from entering or inspecting any such premises, shall be deemed to have committed an offence and shall be liable to the penalty prescribed in rule 356 of the principal rules.

13. The Resident Commissioner shall permit any person claiming to be the owner or occupier of any premises included in the valuation to inspect the valuation roll and to make extracts therefrom without payment of any fee.

14. In all cases in which any premises are for the first time valued or in which the valuation of any premises previously valued is increased, special notice thereof shall be given to the owner of such building.

15. Any person liable to pay rates shall be at liberty to object to the valuation of his own or any other property within the township.

All complaints against such valuation shall be made to the Resident Commissioner in writing on or before the day fixed in the notice and all complaints so made shall be enquired into by him and such amendments shall thereupon be made as may be just and proper.

16. After the complaints have been enquired into and after the revision of the valuation has been completed, amendments shall be authenticated by the signature of the Resident Commissioner who shall at the same time certify that no valid objection has been made to the valuation except in the cases where amendments have been made and thereupon the valuation so made shall be deemed

to be the valuation for the whole year for which it is made and such year shall commence on the first day of January.

17. Provided always that upon the representation of the parties or other information, the record may be amended by inserting the name of any person whose name ought to be inserted or any property liable to the valuation, or by striking out the name of any person or property not liable to the valuation or by reducing the amount of the valuation and in all cases in which any property is inserted as liable to the valuation, the amendment shall be considered to have been made at the time when the person interested first received notice thereof.

18. Appeals against any valuation made under the provisions of these rules shall be heard and determined by any first class magistrate.

No such appeal shall be heard unless complaint has been previously made as hereinbefore provided and the amount of the rate shall have been first paid.

19. Every such appeal shall be commenced within one month after the accrual of the cause of complaint which shall, in respect of any valuation be deemed to accrue on the day of the certificate under rule 16 or, in case of any subsequent amendment under rule 17, upon receipt by the person aggrieved of notice of such amendment. The assessment of any valuation shall be final when no such appeal is made.

20. A further appeal shall lie from the decision of such magistrate to the Supreme Court, provided that the appeal be commenced within one month from the date of the decision complained against. Such appeal shall be final.

21. It shall not be necessary to prepare a new record every year but the valuation of the previous year may be adopted with such alterations as may, in particular cases, be deemed necessary, as the valuation for the following year. Provided always that public notice of such valuation shall be given.

22. Rules 354 and 355 of the principal rules are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE, 1921.

NOTICE.

WITH a view to correcting any misunderstanding prevailing in the matter, it is notified for public information that the purchase price of farms granted under the Crown Lands (Discharged Soldiers Settlement) Ordinance, 1921, will be remitted when the development required to be performed within the first development period (*i.e.*, by 30th June, 1924, or within 3 years from date of allotment whichever be the later date) has been completed, and passed by Government.

2. No remission will be made until title has been issued, and stamp duty must be paid on the stand premium set forth in the grant.

3. Allottees in possession of their titles who have already completed the required development may apply for remission when arrangement will be made to value the improvements effected.

4. On remission of the stand premium, titles will be endorsed accordingly.

5. In the event of transfer being effected prior to remission payment in accordance with the provisions of Section 8, Sub-sections 8 and 9 of the above Ordinance must be made.

6. In the event of a grantee assigning, transferring, charging, leasing or sub-leasing his farm prior to remission, such assignee, transferee, chargee, lessee or sub-lessee as the case may be shall not benefit by this concession, the outstanding purchase price being payable on due date.

This in no way precludes a grantee from obtaining remission while a charge (mortgage) is registered against his title.

7. The Secretary of State for the Colonies directs that no refund of payments already made in respect of purchase price shall be granted.
