RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as "The Mombasa Township (No 2) Rules, 1922"
- These Rules shall apply to the Market known as the Mackinnon Market, hereinafter referred to as 'the Market'
- 3 A stall shall mean a four foot frontage on one of the main counters in the Market
- 4 Every holder of a stall shall display over his stall a conspicuous sign with his name legibly inscribed thereon in English characters

THE INDIAN POST OFFICE ACT 1898

IXD

THE POST OFFICE (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCES 1919 AND 1921

RUIES

Overnor in Council by the Indian Pest Office Act 1898, is applied to the Colony and Protectorate and the Post Office (Amendment) Ordinances 1919 and 1921 and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to make the following Rules —

- 1 These Rules may be cited as the Post Office Rules (No. 2), 1922
- General may pay compensation not exceeding twenty shillings for the loss of or damage to, an ununsured parcel sent by parcel post within the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya and Uganda Protectorate when such loss or damage takes place while the parcel is in the custody of the Postmaster General and does not arise from any fault or neglect of the sender or from the nature of the contents.

In similar circumstances the Postmaster General may also pay compensation in respect of uninsured parcels exchanged between the Colony and Protect torate of Kenya and Uganda Protectorate and such other countries as may be named from time to thus in the Post Office Guide. In the case of a parcel lost or damaged while in the control of the Post Office of any of the countries so named, the Post master General will endeavour to obtain compensation for the sender under similar regulations.

- 3 The indemnity parable to the sender in respect of the loss of a registered article shall be limited to forty shillings
- 4 The Postmaster General may authorize the exchange of unused adhesive postage stamps of one denomination for stamps of other denominations on the following conditions—
 - (a) The face value of the stamps to be exchanged shall not be less than twenty shillings
 - (b) Payment of a commission of five per cent
- 5 The Postmaster General may grant to any person approved by him a licence to sell postage stamps on the following conditions—
 - (a) The licence shall be granted free of charge and shall authorize the sale of postage stamps at the premises named in the licence only
 - (b) The licence may be revoked by the Post master General at pleasure
 - (c) Licensed vendors must pay each for stamps purchased and may be allowed a discount not exceeding 3 per cent on purchases of stamps of denominations of 50 cents and under of not less than twenty shillings in value at any one time
 - (d) Applications for the purchase of supplies of stamps must be made on a form to be provided for the purpose by the Postmaster General
