EMIGRATION TO THE UNION OF SOUTH AFRICA

NOTICE

THE following notice is published for general information —

Intending emigrants to the Union of South Africa are again warned that the continued conges tion of the Labour Market there has compelled the Government of the Union to revise the regulations Notwithstanding repeated wainings that owing to the conditions of unemployment prevailing there immigration which was likely to aggravate those conditions would be restricted immigrants continue to arrive in large numbers who have no employment and who are not possessed of means to maintain themselves In these cucumstances it is necessary to w in intending emigrants that the provisions of the Immigrants Regulation Act will be strictly The possession of £20 on landing which sum was at one time looked upon as a sufficient safeguard for a capable worker, is now regarded as What is an adequate sum it is totally madequate not possible to say but it must be clearly understood that unless the intending immigrant is able to pio duce to the Immigration Officei at the port of arrival evidence of adequate capital or satisfactors written evidence of definite employment his entry into the Union will be prohibited

- 2 Such evidence must show the nature of the employment and the proposed wag. The ability of the offeror to energy out his undertaking must be indicated and, to avoid difficulties, the offeror should of time the support of a Justice of the Peace or other competent Public Official to his written statement General assurances of friends as to employment, or courteous offers of a home for a time will not be accepted
- In the absence of employment, the intending immigran' must establish the fact that he has sufficient appeal to maintain himself for a considerable period after across at least twelve months. Even skilled artisans in the standard trades should note that there is no prospect of employment in sight and no forecast of a change can be made with any centrants.
