## COLONY AND PROTECTORATE OF KENYA.

#### AN ORDINANCE.

No. 21 of 1922.

Assented to in His Majesty's name this 9th day of November, 1922.

An Ordinance for the Reciprocal Enforcement of Judgments in the Colony, and other parts of Majesty's Dominions and Territories under His Majesty's Protection.

BE it enacted by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof:

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Reciprocal Short title. Enforcement of Judgments Ordinance, 1922.
- 2. (1) In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires the expression "Colony" shall mean the Colony and Protectorate of Kenya:

Interpretation

The expression "Judgment" means any judgment or order given or made by a Court in any civil proceedings, whether before or after the passing of this Ordinance, whereby any sum of money is made payable, and includes an award in proceedings on an arbitration if the award has, in pursuance of the law in force in the place where it was made, become enforceable in the same manner as a judgment given by a Court in that place:

The expression "original Court" in relation to any judgment means the Court by which the judgment was given:

The expression "registering Court" in relation to any judgment means the court by which the judgment was registered:

The expression "judgment creditor" means the person by whom the judgment was obtained, and includes the successors and assigns of that person:

The expression "judgment debtor" means the person against whom the judgment was given, and includes any person against whom the judgment is enforceable in the place where it was

- (2) Subject to Rules of Court, any of the powers conferred by this Ordinance may be exercised by a Judge of the Supreme
- 3. (1) Where a judgment has been obtained in a superior Enforcement in Court in the United Kingdom, the judgment creditor may apply to the Supreme Court, at any time within twelve months after the date of the judgment, or such longer period as may be allowed by the Court, to have the judgment registered in the Court, and on any such application the Court may, if in all the circumstances of the case they think it is just and convenient that the judgment should be enforced in the Colony, order the judgment to be registered accordingly.
- (2) The registration of any judgment ordered to be registered under this Ordinance shall be set aside if:-
  - (a) the original court acted without jurisdiction; or
  - (b) the judgment debtor, being a person who was neither carrying on business nor ordinarily resident within the jurisdiction of the original Court, did not voluntarily appear or otherwise submit or agree to submit to the jurisdiction of that Court; or

judgments obtained in superior courts

- (c) the judgment debtor being the defendant in the proceedings, was not duly served with the process of the original Court and did not appear notwithstanding that he was ordinarily resident or was carrying on business within the jurisdiction of that Court or agreed to submit to the jurisdiction of that Court; or
  - (d) the judgment was obtained by fraud; or
- (e) the judgment debtor satisfies the registering Court either that an appeal is pending, or that he is entitled and intends to appeal, against the judgment; or
- (f) the judgment was in respect of a cause of action which for reasons of public policy or for some other similar reason could not have been entertained by the registering Court.
- (3) Where a judgment is registered under this section:
- (a) the judgment shall, as from the date of registration, be of the same force and effect, and proceedings may be taken thereon, as if it had been a judgment originally obtained or entered up on the date of registration in the registering court;
- (b) the registering Court shall have the same control and jurisdiction over the judgment as it has over similar judgments given by itself, but in so far only as relates to execution under this section:
- (c) the reasonable costs of and incidental to the registration of the judgment (including the costs of obtaining a certified copy thereof from the original Court and of the application for registration) shall be recoverable in like manner as if they were sums payable under the judgment.
- (4) Rules of Court shall provide:—
- (a) for service on the judgment debtor of notice of the registration of a judgment under this section; and
- (b) for enabling the registering Court on an application by the judgment debtor to set aside the registration of a judgment under this section on such terms as the Court thinks fit: and
- (c) for suspending the execution of a judgment registered under this section until the expiration of the period during which the judgment debtor may apply to have the registration set aside.
- (5) In any action brought in any Court in the Colony on any judgment which might be ordered to be registered under this section, the plaintiff shall not be entitled to recover any costs of the action unless an application to register the judgment under this section has previously been refused, or unless the Court otherwise orders.

Power to make rules. 4. The Chief Justice shall have power to make Rules of Court for regulating the practice and procedure (including scales of fees and evidence), in respect of proceedings of any kind under this Ordinance.

Extension of Ordinance to Dominions.

- 5. (1) Where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Majesty's Dominions of judgments obtained in the Supreme Court of the Colony, the Governor-in-Council may by Proclamation in the Gazette declare that this Ordinance shall extend to judgments obtained in a superior Court in that part of His Majesty's Dominions in like manner as it extends to judgments obtained in a superior Court in the United Kingdom, and on any such Proclamation being made this Ordinance shall extend accordingly.
- (2) "For the purposes of this Section the expression "part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom" shall be deemed to include any territory which is under His Majesty's protection or in respect of which a mandate is being exercised by the Government of any part of His Majesty's Dominions.

## An Ordinance further to Amend the East Africa Post Office Savings Bank Ordinance, 1909.

This Ordinance may be cited as "The Post Office Savings Short title and Bank (Amendment) Ordinance, 1922," and shall be read as one commencement. with the East Africa Post Office Savings Bank Ordinance, 1909, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Ordinance") and shall come into force on the 1st day of January, 1923.

2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance shall be and is hereby Amendment to amended by the deletion of the word "rupee" wherever such section 4 of word occurs in the said section and the substitution therefor of the ordinance. word "shilling."

3. Section 10 of the Principal Ordinance shall be and is Amendment to hereby amended by the deletion of the words "ten rupees, or some Principal" multiple thereof," and the substitution therefor of the words ordinance "twenty shillings."

## THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Mombasa Boat Regulations, 1922," and shall be

2. The first schedule to the Principal Regulations is hereby repealed and the schedule hereto is substituted therefor.
